MEETING PLANNERS are likely female, age 45+ with a college degree and an appreciation for the cultural and historical qualities that Albuquerque offers as a destination. This audience plans meetings with 150 to 700 rooms on peak and either works for one organization/association, multiple clients, or a third-party firm. They plan meetings for groups that are a good fit for Albuquerque based on brand strengths, destination attributes and overall destination value.

SPORTING ORGANIZATIONS: ACVB's Sports Marketing Department has established numerous partnerships with different sports organizations in a wide range of areas from regional to international.

MARKETING OBJECTIVE

ACVB's multi-prong marketing and advertising campaign has focused on nationally targeted online advertising, email and print advertising, incentive programs, as well as local "Bring Your Meeting Home" advertising in order to increase meeting, convention and sports bookings in the city.



WHAT'S NEW AT THE ALBUQUERQUE CONVENTION CENTER


In October 2014 the City of Albuquerque unveiled a \$23 million transformation at the **Albuquerque Convention Center (ACC)**. The facelift updated everything from the exterior façade to the interior decor. From uniquely Albuquerque elements like an expanded selection of artwork from the city's public art collection, to modern upgrades like the installation of laptop bars, the center looks and feels like a brand new facility.

Below is an interview with convention center general manager, José García, about the scope of the renovation.



ACVB: Can you give us an overview of what improvements have been made to the center?

José García: The improvements to the center happened in two different phases, both aiming to achieve a look that better represents the unique characteristics of our area. A few of my favorite renovations include the work done on the upper-level ballrooms in the west building, the beautiful 5600 square-foot addition (and outdoor deck!), the gas fireplace in the atrium area and new LED lighting.

If it's been a while since your last trip to Downtown Albuquerque, it's time to take another look and get caught up in the momentum of what is going on in this dynamic neighborhood.

Albuquerque's downtown is the heart of the city. Although the original town site in Old Town marked the city's beginnings, Downtown grew up around the railroads, which provided a transportation and commerce hub.

Due to a realignment of **Route 66** in the 1930s, the famous road runs in an east west direction through Nob Hill, Downtown, and Old Town. Then and now, the connection of these three key neighborhoods is an essential vein for residents and visitors alike.

The railroad still brings people into downtown at the **Alvarado Transportation Center** on the **Rail Runner** and **AMTRAK** trains, and the **Albuquerque International Sunport** is less than 10 minutes away, providing ease of access to this bustling hub in the city center.

Albuquerque Shooting Range

This scenic shooting range offers facilities for rifle, pistol and muzzle loading, targets at varying distances, 3 skeet ranges, 2 trap ranges, silhouette range for competition as well as two air conditioned public club houses, classrooms for rent, and refreshment areas.




The Balloon Fiesta Park Soccer Tournament Complex/ Multi-Use Sport Facility – 21 fields!

While these fields are popular for major youth soccer tournaments, anyone who needs vast green spaces will find this complex useful. Possibilities for tournament play are endless including: soccer, football, ultimate Frisbee, rugby, lacrosse, kite flying, model airplanes, and more...




Duke City BMX

This BMX racing track is one of the only covered BMX facilities in the world and hosts the American Bicycle Association Spring Nationals.




State Farm Soccer Complex – 22 fields!

Two lighted, championship fields highlight the complex. The facility has played host to the NAIA Men's Soccer National Championships, the USYSA Far West Regionals in 2001, 2005, 2006, 2010, the AYSO National Games, the Sandia Cup and many other soccer tournaments. The complex also hosted the 2003 USA Track & Field Junior Olympics Cross Country National Championships.




GOLF Albuquerque Year-Round

The natural attributes of Albuquerque's landscape translate into a creative edge in golf design from three distinctly high-desert golfing experiences. Albuquerque is a golfing destination with memorable topography, mild temperatures and open skies. This golf destination offers parkland, desert /travel-tools/abq-expertss, and mountain courses in the rich historical context of shared Native, Hispanic and Western cultures. With multiple options this golf community is great for group tournaments or for extending the corporate conversation.




Indoor Track & Field Facility at the Convention Center

Home of UNM's Indoor Track & Field program, the facility features a 200-meter Mondo oval with 60-degree banked turns and six 36-inch lanes. The straight is a panel system Mondo surface with eight 42-inch lanes, which is also used for high jump. The pole vault, long jump and triple jump are on raised runways with Mondo surfacing. The throwing ring is a wooden surface. The Convention Center hosted the 1966 AAU Indoor Nationals and the 2010, 2011 USA Indoor Track & Field Championships and will host the 2012 USA Indoor Track & Field Championships.




Isotopes Park

Home of the AAA affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers and home to the All-American Baseball Game, a national event showcasing the best high school baseball players in the country. The Park hosted the 2007 AAA All Star Game which was televised nationally on the ESPN networks. The park seats 11,124 including suite seating. The venue is also home to UNM Lobo baseball.



Sandia Motor Speedway

This multi-use racing facility includes two paved ovals (¼ mile, ½ mile), a 1.7-mile road course with a 1.1-mile configuration capacity, a Motocross track, a paved ¼ midget track and a paved remote control track. Over 40 road course events are hosted here with makes and models of all types. The facility also privately books for testing, practice, race instruction, and special events.


Isotopes Park

RIO RANCHO — The expansion New Mexico Stars had several hold-your-breath moments at the Santa Ana Star Center on Sunday afternoon but managed to earn a 46-39 victory over the Colorado Ice in their Indoor Football League debut.

A partying crowd estimated at 3,600 saw the Stars overcome a 9-0 second-quarter deficit to beat the established IFL squad that had an 11-3 record last season.

"That says a lot about our club," coach Chris Williams said of the comeback victory against a solid team. "I'm not surprised that we won, but I'm also not saying that in an arrogant way. We do have a lot of talent on this club."

Stars second-year quarterback Arkelon Hall threw for three touchdowns and 172 yards on

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. — The Daytona 500 has been postponed for the first time in its 54-year history.

NASCAR postponed The Great American Race after heavy rain saturated Daytona International Speedway on Sunday.

Officials spent more than four hours waiting for a window to dry the famed track, but it never came. And when the latest storm cell passed over the speedway, they had little choice but to call it a day.

The 500-mile race was rescheduled for today.

"This is one of the toughest things for us drivers," pole-sitter Carl Edwards said. "It's now who can really stay focused. That's not just the drivers, that's the pit crews, the crew chiefs, everyone, the officials. But I think we'll be just fine."

But today may be another test for both drivers and fans.

The forecast calls for more rain, and officials are prepared to wait all day and into the night to avoid a Tuesday race.



Lowe Breaks U.S. High Jump Record

Chaunte Lowe did not set out to become the crowd favorite.

Setting a new American record in the high jump, however, did just that for Lowe at the USA Track & Field Indoor National Championships at the Albuquerque Convention Center on Sunday.

Lowe's mark of 6 feet, 7½ inches bested Tisha Waller's record 6-7 jump back in 1998.

"It means a lot to me. I think it's the thing that means the most to me is to come back on the world stage and say I'm valid again," Lowe said. "There's always those question marks after you have

a child."

Lowe was named the women's Visa Championship Series winner as the best overall athlete, while Galen Rupp claimed the men's VCS title despite not winning any events. The VCS titles are accumulated over the course of all the USATF indoor events.

A total of 18 other gold medals were handed out Sunday afternoon.

Jennifer Simpson claimed her second gold of the meet, winning the 1,500 meters with a time of 4 minutes, 15.04 seconds.

"I knew when I took the lead I couldn't just get up there and sit around, I needed to really take command," Simpson said. "I'm just really happy with what I

did."

Simpson just edged Brenda Martinez (4:15.11), a much closer victory than Simpson's triumph in Saturday's 3,000, which she claimed with a time of 9:19.15 to hold off Jackie Areson (9:20.61).

"I'm coming down the home stretch and everyone's going crazy. I didn't hear (Martinez), but when that's going on you don't shut it down," Simpson said.

The men's and women's 60-meter hurdles were marred by false starts in both the preliminaries and the finals.

"It is what it is; false starts happen, but you've got to stay focused and do what you have to

do," said Aries Merritt, whose time of 7.43 seconds edged Kevin Craddock (7.46).

It was not any easier on the women's side.

"I'm used to false starts, I've been a victim myself. It was really good to get through the race and get a (personal record) for me," said Kristi Castlin, who won with a time of 7.84.

Sanya Richards-Ross, the wife of New York Giants cornerback Aaron Ross, claimed the 400 meters in 50.71 seconds, coming from behind at the 200-meter mark to overtake Natasha Hastings (51.66).

"I wasn't sure how the first turn was going to go. I didn't want to run the first 200 too quick," Richards-Ross said after her husband presented her with the gold medal.

"We really push each other," she added. "I saw how hard he worked in his offseason. I wanted to duplicate that. I tripled my efforts and I feel I'm in great shape."


The women's 60-meter dash saw Tianna Madison (7.02) slip past Barbara Pierre (7.06).

Erica Moore cruised to victory in the 800 meters with a time of 2:01.08, finishing ahead of her training partner, Phoebe Wright (2:03.07).

Other track champions for the men included Trell Kimmons (6.45) in the 60 dash, Gil Roberts (45.39) in the 400 dash, Duane Solomon in the 800 (1:48.58) and Leonel Manzano (3:48.05) in the 1500.

In the field events, Jillian Camarena-Williams won the shot put with a throw of 64 feet, 2¼ inches to top Michelle Carter (63-2¾). Janay DeLoach took the long jump with a leap of 22 feet, 7¼ inches. Former UNM track standout Alesha Walker was seventh (20-9¾).

For the men, Reese Hoffa took the shot put with a throw of 71-4¼. Ashton Eaton took home the gold in the long jump with a mark of 26-5½. Brad Walker captured the pole vault with a height of 19-2¾.

The 411: Your guide for getting to Albuquerque to support Rebels in NCAA Tournament

How to snag tickets, plan travel to cheer on the Rebels

It's time for the dance. Destination: Albuquerque.

As the [UNLV](#) basketball team packs its bags for the NCAA tournament, university officials expect more fans than the Rebels' past two tournament appearances to do the same given the relatively close tournament site. UNLV, a No. 6 seed in South Region, will take the court Thursday against Colorado at the University of New Mexico's basketball arena, "The Pit."

Travel mania begins tonight as fans scramble for a limited number of tickets. Here's your need-to-know guide for snagging game tickets and getting to Albuquerque for Thursday's matchup.

First step: Tickets

There's a small time frame to request a limited supply of tickets, which the NCAA allocates to each participating school. Plan accordingly.

For UNLV season ticket holders, that means submitting a ticket request by noon Monday. University officials said instructions will be emailed to all season ticket holders and also will be available at [UNLVRebels.com](#). As of 9 p.m. Sunday, a link to place ticket requests will be available on the site. A non-refundable processing fee of \$15 per order will be charged for all requests. UNLV will dispense tickets according to its postseason ticket policy, which is based on priority points from the Rebel Athletic Fund membership.

Those selected to receive tickets will be notified by 8 p.m. Monday. The limit is four tickets per season ticket holder account. Everyone who receives tickets will be charged the full, non-refundable ticket price Monday.

UNLV students hoping to snag tickets must enter an online lottery system. University officials said students should log onto their UNLV tickets account online (the same way they would for regular-season tickets) from 9 p.m. Sunday until noon Monday. They will be prompted to place their ticket request in a lottery system. An undisclosed number of winning names will be drawn Monday. Winners will be contacted via email by 4 p.m. Monday. The limit is one ticket per winning student.

The general public can visit [UNLVRebels.com](#) beginning 8 p.m. Monday to purchase tickets based on availability.

Ticket buyers will not be able pick them up in Las Vegas. The exact pickup location will be emailed to fans and posted at [UNLVRebels.com](#). The original purchaser must provide a valid photo identification to pick up the NCAA tournament tickets in Albuquerque.

If UNLV advances to the third round of the tournament, fans who received tickets will automatically get tickets to the next game in Albuquerque. The cost of those tickets will be automatically charged to the purchasers' credit cards.

If UNLV makes the Sweet 16, the university will release more information about how to obtain tickets.

Fans also can scoop up game tickets by visiting [NCAA.com](#). Visitors can attempt to purchase tickets in any of the tournament sites. As of Monday morning, tickets were still available for the Rebels opening game on the site.

Second step: Getting there

Fans should consider themselves lucky: Of the eight second- and third-round NCAA tournament sites, UNLV scored the one closest to home. The roughly 570-mile journey from Las Vegas to Albuquerque is a nine-hour trip by car or a short plane ride away.

If you're driving to Albuquerque, budget at least \$200 toward gas for the round-trip getaway. For instance: A 2010 Honda Accord will require \$222.94 worth of gas round trip based on average fuel prices along the way, according to AAA's Fuel Cost Calculator.

A roundtrip flight — leaving Wednesday and returning Sunday — will be at least double or triple the cost of driving. Most roundtrip flights for those dates were running anywhere from the mid-\$400s to more than \$700, according to [Expedia.com](#) and [Travelocity.com](#) rates early Sunday evening.

Third step: Where to stay

The [University of New Mexico](#) sits conveniently in downtown Albuquerque, offering guests a decent selection of hotels within a short distance. The options strike a

variety of price points as well.

As of early Sunday evening, [Hotels.com](#) included the following hotel rates for Wednesday and Thursday night:

- \$55 average nightly rate at Americas Best Value Inn (0.92 miles from the University of New Mexico)
- \$66 average nightly rate at the Plaza Inn (1 mile from the University of New Mexico)
- \$100 average nightly rate at Holiday Inn Express & Suites Airport (1.2 miles from the University of New Mexico)
- \$152 average nightly rate at Hotel Andaluz (1.4 miles from the University of New Mexico)
- \$199 average nightly rate at DoubleTree by Hilton Albuquerque (1.5 miles from the University of New Mexico)

Fourth step: What to do

As fans flock to Albuquerque this week, they likely will spend most their time in “[The Pit](#)” — the University of New Mexico’s home for college basketball. The name doesn’t disappoint. The basketball arena was built in a 37-foot hole in Albuquerque, according to the university website.

When Rebel fans aren’t cheering inside “The Pit,” Albuquerque offers everything from hot air balloon rides to golfing and museums, according to the Albuquerque Convention & Visitors Bureau website. And, yes, there are even casinos for those missing Las Vegas.

The website also offers a helpful warning to potential visitors:

“Before coming to Albuquerque, visitors should be aware of the city’s high elevation of over 5,000 feet. When visiting Albuquerque, it may take your body a couple of days to adjust to the high altitude.”


