

ALBUQUERQUE VISITOR ITINERARY

FOR THE RELAXED EXPLORER

3 Days / 2 Nights

Motorcoach accessible. Minimal walking. Relaxed pacing with cultural and scenic highlights.

Day 1: Welcome to Albuquerque

Settle in at the hotel. Recommended options include the **Best Western Plus Rio Grande Inn, Embassy Suites by Hilton Albuquerque, Sheraton Albuquerque Uptown** and **Albuquerque Marriott**. All offer comfortable rooms, easy access and convenient locations.

Ease into your stay with the **ABQ Trolley Co.** "Best of ABQ City Tour," or opt for the **#ABQTours** "Old Town Albuquerque History Tour" for a bit of light walking. Both offer an excellent introduction to the city's history, culture and colorful neighborhoods.

In the evening, gather for a welcome dinner in Old Town surrounded by adobe architecture, tree-lined plaza and local charm. Consider a traditional New Mexican meal at **Church Street Cafe** or **Garduños at Hotel**



Day 2: Culture, Scenery, and Relaxed Exploration

Start the morning at the **Indian Pueblo Cultural Center**. Experience a self-guided museum tour, a weekend cultural dance performance with seated viewing and time to browse the gift shop, featuring Native artisans.

In the afternoon, take a scenic ride on the **Sandia Peak Aerial Tramway** (weather permitting). If conditions do not allow, visit the **National Museum of Nuclear Science & History** – the nation's only congressionally chartered museum in its field and a Smithsonian Affiliate – for a comfortable indoor experience.

Take a break for lunch at **The County Line of Albuquerque** or return to the Sawmill/Old Town district for an on-your-own meal at **Sawmill Market**, an artisanal food hall.

For those seeking another adventure in the evening, experience Albuquerque's flamenco tradition with a weekend show at **Tablao Flamenco** inside Hotel Albuquerque. For a more casual option, consider a wine tasting in Old Town at **Noisy Water Winery** or **Sheehan Winery**.



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Day 3: History and Light Sightseeing

Spend the morning exploring **Historic Old Town** at a comfortable pace. Highlights include boutique shopping, gallery browsing and a visit to San Felipe de Neri Church, one of Albuquerque's most photographed landmarks.

For guests who prefer an additional museum experience, the **Albuquerque Museum** is an excellent optional add-on. It offers strong accessibility, plenty of seating, and both docent-led and self-guided experiences.

Gather for a relaxed farewell lunch at **El Pinto Restaurant & Cantina** before departing Albuquerque in the afternoon.
