## **ONE-DAY VISIT:**

Recognized as one of the most culturally diverse cities in the country, Albuquerque's ethnic tapestry is reflected in its architecture, artwork, cultural centers and cuisine.

- Start the day off by enjoying a classic New Mexican breakfast at Church St. Café
- Explore historic Old Town, the birthplace of Albuquerque
  - » Visit Museum Row, including Albuquerque Museum, the New Mexico Museum of Natural History & Science, Explora, and the nearby American International Rattlesnake Museum
- Tour the Indian Pueblo Cultural Center
  - » Watch traditional Native Pueblo dances in the courtyard (schedule found at IndianPueblo.org)
  - » For lunch, sample a dish from the on-site Indian Pueblo Kitchen
- Visit the National Hispanic Cultural Center
  - » Choose from over 700 annual events at nhccNM.org
- End the day with traditional Spanish tapas and a thrilling performance at Tablao Flamenco Albuquerque (located within Hotel Albuquerque at Old Town)







## .\*.\*.\*.\* IF YOU HAVE MORE TIME:

Due to its central location, Albuquerque provides easy access to a variety of cultural landmarks, most located within an hour's drive.

- Visit a living Pueblo
  - » The Sky City Cultural Center & Haak'u Museum found at Acoma Pueblo—one of the oldest continuously inhabited communities in North America—is open year-round
  - » New Mexico's 19 Pueblos also open to the public during Feast Days, when the communities welcome visitors in celebration of a patron saint
    - Find a calendar at IndianPueblo.org
- Discover an ancient landmark
  - » Check out **Petroglyph National Monument**, which protects one of the largest petroglyph sites in North America
  - » Heritage Inspirations, affiliated with Albuquerque's Hotel Chaco, offers guided tours and multi-day glamping trips to Chaco Culture National Historical Park
