Mostly moderate winter weather means Asheville's Art Deco downtown remains walkable and cozy with picture-perfect long-range views of snowy peaks, romantic restaurants and hiking trails all to yourself.

Fireplaces With a View

From rooftops to cozy spots to imbibe, Asheville's trend of fireplaces accompanied by spectacular vistas of downtown architecture and mountain scenery is highlighted by the new **Asheville Rooftop Bar Tours**, offering a bird's-eye view from some of the city's newest scenic venues like **Capella on 9** at the **AC Hotel Asheville Downtown** and **Hemingway's Cuba** at **Cambria Downtown Asheville**. Other hot spots with epic fireplace offerings: **Omni Grove Park Inn, Pillar Bar at the Hilton Garden Inn Asheville Downtown** and **Wicked Weed Brewing**.

Brisk Outdoor Winter Adventures + Cozy Cultural Experiences

NEW at Biltmore: Beginning Nov. 8, Biltmore guests will experience an immersive exhibition featuring set recreations, costumes and exclusive multimedia from the show Downton Abbey. Included in "Downton Abbey: The Exhibition" will be never-before-seen multimedia elements along with the series' most recognizable sets and artifacts. The exhibition runs through April 7, 2020. ► Also at Biltmore, ride the remote trails and roads of America's Largest Home via electric recumbent tricycle on the Outrider Tour. The Deerpark tour route goes to the Lagoon and offers spectacular views of Biltmore House.
► Winter is the perfect time to take a hike, offering quiet trails with the best views of the year thanks to leafless trees and crisp air. Check out guided hiking companies like Namaste in Nature

(yoga and meditation hikes), **Blue Ridge Hiking Co.** and **Asheville Hiking Tours**. ► **Asheville Art Museum** offers a brand new state-of-the-art facility that features education facilities, an art library, a lecture and performance space, a new ArtPlayce for families and children and the addition of a rooftop sculpture terrace and cafe. ► Opening to the public later this year, one of Asheville's most beloved festivals now has a brick and mortar location downtown. **LEAF Global Arts Center** will offer educational experiences for guests rooted in music, art, community and culture via a mini-theater and global immersion room using virtual reality, unique musical instruments and a stage for performances and interactive artist workstations. ► Opening this November, **The Center for Craft** is expanding with **The National Craft Innovation Hub**, including new public galleries featuring local and national makers, lecture space, classrooms and a co-working space, cementing Asheville's reputation as a force in the nation's fine art and maker scene.

► Unobstructed Views | Take in stunning panoramic views of the surrounding mountains while on a winter hike. Multiple trailhead access points remain open all year long on the Blue Ridge Parkway and across the Pisgah National Forest.

► Cabin Fever, Redux | Asheville's array of mountaintop retreats and inviting B&Bs offer private hot tubs overlooking the surrounding peaks and valleys, candlelight dinners and the opportunity to get away from it all.

► Secret Season for Music | Deep-seated bluegrass roots harmonize with new talent and innovative sounds in Asheville. In winter many nationally-traveling local bands come home to the region to play local shows and pop in to jam sessions.

Tap into Asheville's century-old wellness culture by spending a day at **Omni Grove Park Inn Spa** - subterranean spa, hydrotherapy waterfalls and mineral pools. Shorter rejuvenation sessions can be found at **Wake Foot Sanctuary**, **Asheville Salt Cave**, **Alchemy** (tearoom, apothecary + acupuncture) or **Shoji** (a private Japanese spa on the side of a mountain). Seasonal treatments include the Heal Your Sole pressure point foot massage (Asheville Salt Cave) and tea blends and herbal syrup shots to boost immunity (Alchemy).

Asheville's creative culinary community, Foodtopia, showcases regional ingredients through special menu items, events and experiential opportunities. ► Coming off the honor of having Food & Wine name Cúrate as one of the "40 Most Important Restaurants of the Past 40 Years," Chef Katie Button opened **Button & Co. Bagels**, an Appalachian-inspired bagel and sandwich shop. Button will utilize traditional local ingredients like winter wheat, country ham and sorghum. ► Also experience traditional ingredients and culinary practices at **AUX Bar** (vinegar pie, potatoes, pickled fruits and vegetables AND pork) and **Sovereign Remedies** (savoring harvested plants from leaf to root and using house-made vinegars in vinaigrettes, sauces and even cocktails).

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New Cozy Places to Stay

► The Foundry Hotel, part of Hilton's Curio Collection, has opened in the city's historical African-American business district. With dishes like braised rabbit, fried catfish and waffles and crispy quail with hot water cornbread, five-time James Beard semifinalist Chef John Fleer's newest venture **Benne on Eagle** at The Foundry pays homage to the often-overlooked contributions of African-American cooks to Appalachian and Southern food.

► Asheville's famed Art Deco skyline has a new icon and a four-star luxury property. **Hotel Arras** opens October 2019 with 128 rooms and two restaurants by local chef Peter Pollay. **Bargello** will be a Mediterranean-inspired restaurant with small plates. **District 42**, will be a casual spot with outdoor seating.
