As the most active volunteer environmental organization in Western North Carolina, their mission is to inspire, equip and mobilize individuals and communities to take care of the places we love to live. With flexible scheduling available any day of the week, GreenWorks can work with groups of up to 50 people ranging from conference to corporate. Year-round volunteer opportunities include roadside and creek cleanups, tree nursery/orchard maintenance, and maintenance of the Trash Trout, their aquatic litter-capturing device. Depending on the time of year, your group could also participate in a river cleanup, live staking, or tree planting.

Groups of all ages (from pre-school to retirees) and as large as 30 can engage in a variety of projects at the FoodBank. Their service opportunities are designed to impact a local need and create a meaningful volunteer opportunity for large groups of people, with projects ranging from beautification to kit-making. Able to accommodate groups of nearly any size, United Way can integrate your group's team-building and networking goals with education about community issues and a volunteer activity. Their on-site opportunities – called "We Care Experiences" – feature guest speakers from the local benefiting nonprofit/school organization(s) who share their story and talk about the impact of the project while volunteers assemble kits and care packages. Each package is personally decorated and includes a handwritten note of encouragement.

Seed Programs International is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing access to good quality vegetable seeds, expertise, and training to humanitarian organizations around the world to alleviate hunger and poverty. SPI's seed packing events are a mobile, fun, and easy way to fight hunger - the supplies are shipped to your meeting or event venue and set up on-site, where participants work together to package seeds for shipment around the world to communities in need. A seed packing event is suitable for a group of 25 people to over 200, with costs determined by the amount of seed packets ordered. Seed packing can even be done as part of a virtual meeting agenda, with an option to ship supplies directly to participant's homes. Seeds packed at home are donated directly to charities selected from a suggested list.

Through numerous innovative programs and partnerships, tens of thousands of families are assisted each year with heating, utilities, medication, housing, food, clothing, medical and other emergency assistance. Eblen Charities can help coordinate on-site donations at your conference host hotel. Examples of donation collections include food (easy to prepare food items), new or gently used coats, school supplies, hygiene products, and new books, toys, or stuffed animals for the Saint Nicholas Project. Eblen Charities also accepts volunteers to help with events, projects, and in their office.

Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry (ABCCM) provides emergency assistance to those in need and develops strategic plans to address the root causes of poverty and restore lives in the community. ABCCM has several different ministries located across Asheville: the Crisis Ministry, serving the low-income citizens of Buncombe County who are facing financial emergencies and are struggling to meet life's basic needs; the Homeless Services program, which includes the Veterans Restoration Quarters and Steadfast House transitional housing facilities; the Medical Ministry, providing urgent care, medication assistance, and crisis dental care to those in need; and the Jail Ministry, serving Buncombe County prisoners who need hope and direction in order to re-enter the community responsibly. Volunteer opportunities are available at each ministry, from beautification projects to cooking and serving meals.
