Getting into Villagefest

Hosted downtown on Palm Canyon Drive every Thursday night, this festive pedestrian street fair takes fun to another level. Come enjoy shopping, eating, art, and more in the center of excitement.



Joshua Tree National Park

Located about an hour from Palm Springs, Joshua Tree National Park is a beautiful nature preserve. With 12 self-guiding nature trails available, there are all sorts of sights including rock formations, different species of plants, and the Keyes Ranch.



The Living Desert Zoo and Gardens

Meet and see more than 450 animals in their natural habitats by visiting the Living Desert Zoo and Gardens. Specializing in the deserts of the world with a mission of desert conservation through preservation, education, and appreciation.



Red Jeep Tours

Offered for both individuals and groups, these open-air excursions take riders to all sorts of scenic and interesting locations like the San Andreas Fault, Palm Springs Indian Canyons, or the majestic Painted Canyon in the Mecca Hills Wilderness Area.



Palm Springs Aerial Tram

Catch views of the Mt. San Jacinto State Park and Wilderness area by taking a ride on the world's largest rotating tram. Stretching 2.5 miles along the Chino Canyon, this aerial rail vehicle takes visitors on a 10-minute journey over the pristine wilderness—giving riders spectacular views of the valley below.
