Mountain_{Biking}

Chewacla is located in the southern most footbills of the Appalachian Trail. This varying terrain complete with rocky outcrops, wide-banked curves, and steep dropoffs is the perfect setting for the best single track the state of Alabama has to offer.

The park offers a wide variety of trails, ranging from beginner-friendly with progression built in, to hand-built trails with texture and options, along with a small skills area and numerous hand-built features.

Some of the best trails in the park aren't about speed or skill, but scenery. Creek View parallels Chewacla Creek, which converges with Town Creek at the Natural Falls, a wide cascade that tumbles into a social swimming hole.



Things to do

BOATING

Chewacla offers a 26-acre lake fed by Moore's Mill Creek. A man-made spillway forms picturesque Chewacla Falls. From the falls, the water converges with Chewacla Creek and flows away from the park. There is no ramp to the water; however, small personal water crafts that can be carried down to the water such as canoes, kayaks, and paddle boards are welcome. Due to the small size of the lake, no boats with gas powered engines are allowed.

SWIMMING

The 26-acre lake at Chewacla State Park is open year round for swimmers and includes a diving platform with a high dive.

FISHING

Chewacla Lake is teeming with largemouth bass, crappie, and several species of catfish and sunfish. Fishing is allowed with an Alabama Fishing License and guests must follow the general Alabama fishing regulations.





Cabins

Nestled along the banks of Chewacla Lake lie six rustic stone cabins available to rent year-round. (Five of which were originally constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps (C.C.C.) in the 1930s with the only exception being Cabin Four; which is of new construction.) All have been renovated and are located within a beautiful setting in which to find respite from the bustle of modern living.

The cabins at Chewacla State Park offer lodging for up to four people in the small cabins and up to six people in the large cabins. All offer a wood-burning fireplace, breakfast nook, bathroom with a stand-up shower, and linens. There is a kitchen with oven/range, refrigerator, toaster, microwave, coffee maker, and basic cookware/serveware.

- Reservations for seven or more days can be taken up to a year in advance. The full stay must be paid and it is non-refundable.
- One night reservations will be taken for weekday stays Sunday - Thursday.
- Regular reservations can be taken up to four months in advance.
- Auburn home football game reservations are taken on special call days determined in late February and posted on the website.
- Check in is at 4 p.m. Check out is at 11 a.m.
- Reservations excluding home football games are refundable up to 72 hours prior to arrival minus the transaction fee.

- Home Football Games vary by game.
