- **Bullock Texas State History Museum** Interactive exhibits, rare artifacts, multimedia shows and an IMAX theater captures Texas history.
- Congress Avenue Bat Bridge More than 1.5 million bats fly out from beneath the bridge each night at dusk from March - October.
- The Contemporary Austin

 Jones Center
 Through statewide exhibitions and programs, The Contemporary Austin helps nurture artists' careers.
- Darrell K. Royal Texas Memorial Stadium It's game time in Texas Longhorn football stadium, with a 100,000-person capacity.
- **Driskill Hotel**Originally built in 1886, this iconic hotel combines authentic Texas charm with modern sophistication.
- French Legation State Historic Site Built in 1841 as the private home of a French representative to the Republic of Texas, the historic structure, landscape and new visitor center provide an engaging cultural destination.
- George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural & Genealogy Center Celebrate the history of Austin's African-American community and h munity and historic contributions of Dr. Carver.
- Take in the historic official residence of exas Governors since 1856.
- Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Cen Explore hundreds of wildflowers and native plants of Texas in the beautiful gardens at the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center.

- **LBJ Presidential Library & Museum**This presidential museum chronicles
 Lyndon B. Johnson's career. 20
- Long Center for the Performing Arts
 Home to the Austin Symphony, Austin
 Opera, and Ballet Austin, as well as home
 to the Austin Music Memorial.
- Stop in for exhibits of amazing Mexican and Latin American art.
- Mike A. Myers Stadium Soccer and track events are held at this UT Austin 20,000-seat stadium.
- Moody Center Moody Center
 Moody Center is a world class venue that
 features the best and biggest names in
 the music industry, along with The
 University of Texas Women's and Men's
 basketball games, family shows and other
 sporting and local events.
- Neill-Cochran House Museum
 Visit this stately Greek Revival residence, built in 1855 and located near the UT Austin campus.
- O Henry & Susanna Dickinson Historic Brush Square is home to the cottage where writer William Sidney Porter (O. Henry) lived, as well as the former residence of Battle of the Alamo
- survivor Susanna Dickinson Palmer Events Center Overlooking Lady Bird Lake, this multi-use special events center feels park-like.
- Paramount Theatre
 Opened in 1915, the Paramount was
 restored for local productions and touring
- St. Mary's showcases a rose window built in 1872 by Victorian architect Nicholas
- The former General Land Office building houses historic exhibits, visitor information
- and a gift shop. Stevie Ray Vaughan Statue Visit the bronze statue of the "Patron Saint
- of Austin Music"on Auditorium Shores Texas Science & Natural History
- Don't miss displays of dinosaur artifacts, fossils, gems, minerals and meteorites. Texas State Capitol
 Completed in 1888, the Texas statehouse stands 14 feet higher than the U.S. Capitol
- Texas State Cemetery
 Tour the final resting place of Texas' most notable sons and daughters.
- Texas Tov Museum and Arcade Museum exhibiting vintage toys from the 1920s to the 2000s, plus classic arcade games. It is located at 312 Congress Avenue.
- **UMLAUF Sculpture Garden**
 - & Museum
 View this unique outdoor display of more than 100 sculptures by the late artist,
 Charles Umlauf.
- UT Tower This 307-foot tower, constructed in 1937, 37 is the most visible landmark on the UT Austin campus. Whole Foods Market Flagship
- The national headquarters for the world's largest natural grocer spans 80,000 sq. ft Zilker Botanical Gardens Adjacent to Zilker Park, these gardens include a "prehistoric" area in tribute to 100 million-year-old dinosaur tracks discovered here.

PARKS + RECREATION

- Kids will love this interactive 2-acre park featuring nature inspired elements, musical equipment, splash pad and more.
- **Barton Springs Pool** Dive into this 3-acre natural swimming hole with 68°F year-round water temperature.
- Boardwalk
 With stunning views of the downtown
 skyline, the 7,250-foot boardwalk is a
 great accompaniment to your stroll along
 Lady Bird Lake.
- This wonderful downtown oasis is just steps from the O. Henry Museum and the Susanna Dickinson Museum.
- On the north shore of Lady Rird Lake east of IH-35, this park hosts regular
- Hiko & Riko Trail A popular draw for runners, cyclists and walkers are the 10.1 miles of trail that loop around Lady Bird Lake.

- **Lady Bird Lake** The Lower Colorado River meanders
