**ACL Live at the Moody Theater**  
State-of-the-art live music venue that also serves as home of KLRU-TV produced PBS program *Austin City Limits*.
- 2

**Austin City Hall**  
Austin City Hall was designed with a plaza to host community events and live music.
- 3

**Austin Convention Center**  
Closed for redevelopment April 2025 through Spring 2029
- 4

**Austin FC's Q2 Stadium**  
Home of Austin FC, the 20,500-capacity stadium features an amphitheater, local food and drink and plenty of live sports action.
- 5

**Austin Nature & Science Center**  
The outdoors are celebrated through nature trails, exhibits, a dinosaur pit and refuge for rescued wild animals.
- 6

**The Austin Public Library**  
The Central Library, designed to be flexible enough to serve our community for the next hundred years, forms the backbone of the Austin Public Library System.
- 7

**Austin Visitor Center**  
The official visitor information center, souvenir shop and tour departure point can be found at 103 E. Fifth St.
- 8

**Bass Concert Hall**  
This popular performing arts venue is located on the UT Austin campus.
- 9

**Blanton Museum of Art**  
The nation's largest university-owned art collection includes nearly 21,000 works.
- 10

**Bullock Texas State History Museum**  
Interactive exhibits, rare artifacts, multimedia shows and an IMAX theater captures Texas history.
- 11

**Congress Avenue Bat Bridge**  
More than 1.5 million bats fly out from beneath the bridge each night at dusk from March - October.
- 12

**The Contemporary Austin – Jones Center**  
Through statewide exhibitions and programs, The Contemporary Austin helps nurture artists' careers.
- 13

**Darrell K. Royal Texas Memorial Stadium**  
It's game time in Texas Longhorn football stadium, with a 100,000-person capacity.
- 14

**Driskill Hotel**  
Originally built in 1886, this iconic hotel combines authentic Texas charm with modern sophistication.
- 15

**French Legation State Historic Site**  
Built in 1841 as the private home of a French representative to the Republic of Texas, the historic structure, landscape and new visitor center provide an engaging cultural destination.
- 16

**George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural & Genealogy Center**  
Celebrate the history of Austin's African-American community and historic contributions of Dr. Carver.
- 17

**Governor's Mansion**  
Take in the historic official residence of Texas Governors since 1856.
- 18

**Harry Ransom Center**  
This center houses the world's first photograph, a rare Gutenberg Bible, a self-portrait by Frida Kahlo and more.

**Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center**  
Explore hundreds of wildflowers and native plants of Texas in the beautiful gardens at the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center.

Parks + Recreation

**Alliance Children's Garden**  
Kids will love this interactive 2-acre park featuring nature inspired elements, musical equipment, splash pad and more.

**Barton Springs Pool**  
Dive into this 3-acre natural swimming hole with 68°F year-round water temperature.
- 42

**Boardwalk**  
With stunning views of the downtown skyline, the 7,250-foot boardwalk is a great accompaniment to your stroll along Lady Bird Lake.

**Brush Square**  
This wonderful downtown oasis is just steps from the O. Henry Museum and the Susanna Dickinson Museum.
- 44

**Fiesta Gardens**  
On the north shore of Lady Bird Lake, east of IH-35, this park hosts regular festivals.
- 45

**Hike & Bike Trail**  
A popular draw for runners, cyclists and walkers are the 10.1 miles of trail that loop around Lady Bird Lake.

Districts

- 2ND Street District**  
Keep things local at some of Austin's top retail shops, boutiques, coffee houses and wine bars.
- Central Austin**  
You'll find cafes and vintage stores resting between neighborhood homes and craft bars.
- The Domain & Arboretum**  
Journey north to find walkable outdoor districts with retail stores and local restaurants, family-friendly events and high-end shopping.
- East Austin**  
Head to East Austin to experience one of the fastest-growing and most alternative areas in town.
- Rainey Street District**  
This laid-back area is home to converted bungalows that provide only-in-Austin music and bar experiences.
- Red River District**  
From big name acts to local legends, Red River blares with the sounds of local Austin bands.
- Sixth Street District**  
Stroll down Austin's most famous nightlife area and experience more than a dozen blocks of live music venues.

**LBJ Presidential Library & Museum**  
This presidential museum chronicles Lyndon B. Johnson's career.

**Long Center for the Performing Arts**  
Home to the Austin Symphony, Austin Opera, and Ballet Austin, as well as home to the Austin Music Memorial.
- 22

**Mexic-Arte Museum**  
Stop in for exhibits of amazing Mexican and Latin American art.
- 23

**Mike A. Myers Stadium**  
Soccer and track events are held at this UT Austin 20,000-seat stadium.
- 24

**Moody Center**  
Moody Center is a world class venue that features the best and biggest names in the music industry, along with The University of Texas Women's and Men's basketball games, family shows and other sporting and local events.
- 25

**Neill-Cochran House Museum**  
Visit this stately Greek Revival residence, built in 1855 and located near the UT Austin campus.
- 26

**O Henry & Susanna Dickinson House Museums**  
Historic Brush Square is home to the cottage where writer William Sidney Porter (O. Henry) lived, as well as the former residence of Battle of the Alamo survivor Susanna Dickinson.
- 27

**Palmer Events Center**  
Overlooking Lady Bird Lake, this multi-use special events center feels park-like.
- 28

**Paramount Theatre**  
Opened in 1915, the Paramount was restored for local productions and touring shows.
- 29

**St. Mary's Cathedral**  
St. Mary's showcases a rose window built in 1872 by Victorian architect Nicholas Clayton.
- 30

**State Capitol Visitors Center**  
The former General Land Office building houses historic exhibits, visitor information and a gift shop.
- 31

**Stevie Ray Vaughan Statue**  
Visit the bronze statue of the "Patron Saint of Austin Music" on Auditorium Shores.
- 32

**Texas Science & Natural History Museum**  
Don't miss displays of dinosaur artifacts, fossils, gems, minerals and meteorites.
- 33

**Texas State Capitol**  
Completed in 1888, the Texas statehouse stands 14 feet higher than the U.S. Capitol building.
- 34

**Texas State Cemetery**  
Tour the final resting place of Texas' most notable sons and daughters.
- 35

**Texas Toy Museum and Arcade**  
Museum exhibiting vintage toys from the 1920s to the 2000s, plus classic arcade games. It is located at 312 Congress Avenue.
- 36

**UMLAUF Sculpture Garden & Museum**  
View this unique outdoor display of more than 100 sculptures by the late artist, Charles Umlauf.
- 37

**UT Tower**  
This 307-foot tower, constructed in 1937, is the most visible landmark on the UT Austin campus.
- 38

**Whole Foods Market Flagship**  
The national headquarters for the world's largest natural grocer spans 80,000 sq. ft.
- 39

**Zilker Botanical Gardens**  
Adjacent to Zilker Park, these gardens include a "prehistoric" area in tribute to 100 million-year-old dinosaur tracks discovered here.

**Lady Bird Lake**  
The Lower Colorado River meanders through downtown.
- 47

**Pfluger Pedestrian Bridge**  
Located on the Lady Bird Lake Hike & Bike Trail, the scenic Pfluger Pedestrian Bridge provides a scenic spot to view Downtown Austin.


**Republic Square**  
Free live music, a weekly farmers market and outdoor activities can be found at this historic park.
- 49

**Waterloo Park & Moody Amphitheater**  
Winding along Waller Creek, this park offers gardens and meandering pathways plus live performances at the Moody Amphitheater.
- 50

**Woolridge Square**  
Relax at this scenic square at Ninth and Guadalupe Streets, with its center piece gazebo and giant chess set.
- 51

**Zilker Park**  
At 358 acres, this park is home to Barton Springs Pool and ACL Music Festival each October.

- South Austin**  
Quaint houses, vintage restaurants and new eateries by some of the city's top chefs populate this lively area.
- South Congress (SoCo) District**  
Just south of Lady Bird Lake, "SoCo" is a vibrant neighborhood of boutiques, eateries and music venues.
- The University of Texas at Austin**  
An Austin icon since 1883, explore this diverse campus that more than 50,000 students call home throughout the school year.
- Warehouse District**  
The industrial Warehouse District offers refined stomping grounds in the heart of Downtown Austin.
- West Austin**  
Head to West Austin to experience stunning views of the Texas Hill Country and unique local upscale flair.
- West Sixth Street District**  
Here you can shop iconic home-grown retailers including Whole Foods, BookPeople and more.
