NORTHWEST AUSTIN

Northwest Austin has a variety of shopping, dining and meeting venues, making it a vibrant and upscale area that offers all that downtown Austin has and more. The area includes The Domain, a walkable outdoor district containing more than 100 retail stores, local restaurants and chic meeting places, and the Arboretum, which offers family-friendly events along with a variety of multicultural restaurants, hike and bike trails and high-end shopping.

HOTELS

The Domain features more than a dozen hotels, many within walking distance of live music, local restaurants and shopping.

- » Aloft Hotel (140 rooms). which has the latest amenities and is in the center of the business district. The biggest of Aloft's three meeting spaces is more than 1,000 square feet and can be adjusted for more intimate meetings.
- » Archer Hotel (171 rooms), which provides curated luxuries and shows off Austin's creative and quirky side within its limestone and wildflower walls. Archer has meeting spaces ranging from 275-16,525 square feet.
- » Lone Star Court (123 rooms), a boutique hotel boasting an Austin aesthetic impossible not to love, has more than 2,000 square feet of interior meeting space in addition to outdoor pavilions and lawn space.
- » Westin Austin at The Domain (341 rooms), where you can experience a vibrant and versatile setting for connection

and collaboration, has more than 17,000 square feet of event space/meeting facilities.

If you're looking for hotels within shuttle-distance from The Domain, the Arboretum has several unique hotels:

- » Renaissance Austin Hotel (492 rooms) blends contemporary sophistication with the awe-inspiring beauty of its Texas Hill Country surroundings. The hotel offers nearly 70,000 square feet of meeting space and seating for up to 1,300 people in the Grand Ballroom.

VENUES

» 77 Degrees is a chic and sunfilled three-story rooftop patio bar boasting a trendy vibe, fla-vorful tapas and tropical craft cocktails (read: the perfect place for attendees to unwind for happy hour).

» The Commons Conference Center (operated by University of Texas) features two auditoriums with a combined capacity of 448 people, an 11,000-square foot atrium for exhibit space or meals and 8 breakout rooms.

DINING & NIGHTLIFE

North Austin boasts numerous world-renowned chefs while remaining true to its roots with local fare from taco shops and food trucks alike. The Rock Rose district is full of local watering holes that showcase the area as a thriving entertainment district that can compete with the best of Austin nightlife.

SHOPPING

With hundreds of upscale and affordable retail stores, like Louis Vuitton and David Yurman, to local staples like Luxe Apothetique, Scout & Molly's and Mana Culture, it's no secret that The Domain and the Arboretum are top spots to get some shopping done.

TECHNOLOGY & START-UP CORRIDOR

The Domain and Arboretum area are considered the future second city center. Some of the tech giants that maintain offices in the area include Amazon, Homeaway, Facebook, IBM, BazaarVoice, Accruent and Blackbaud.

TRANSPORTATION

- » Renaissance Hotel and Embassy Suites operate complimentary daily shuttles (3-5 mile radius), and Westin, Archer, Aloft and Lone Star Court offer complimentary shuttle service around The Domain area.
- » Airport shuttles available from the Arboretum and The Domain starting at \$19.
- » Capital Metro Light Rail: \$7 daily commuter, \$3.50/ride, stops at Downtown Station and near The Domain at Kramer Station.
- » Uber, Lyft and other rideshare options are available.



The Domain and the Arboretum are 20 minutes to downtown by car, bus or Capital Metro light rail and 30 minutes to Austin-Bergstrom International.
