

## Attractions

- 1 ACL Live at the Moody Theater**  
State-of-the-art live music venue that also serves as home of KLRU-TV produced PBS program Austin City Limits.
- 2 Austin City Hall**  
Austin City Hall was designed with a plaza to host community events and live music.
- 3 Austin Convention Center**  
With nearly 900,000 square feet, this facility accommodates major conventions and large consumer shows.
- 4 Austin FC's Q2 Stadium**  
Home of Austin FC, the new 20,500-capacity stadium features an amphitheater, local food and drink and plenty of live sports action.
- 5 Austin History Center**  
This research center for Austin and Travis County has archives dating back to 1839.
- 6 Austin Nature & Science Center**  
The outdoors are celebrated through nature trails, exhibits, a dinosaur pit and refuge for rescued wild animals.
- 7 The Austin Public Library**  
The Central Library, designed to be flexible enough to serve our community for the next hundred years, forms the backbone of the Austin Public Library System.
- 8 Austin Visitor Center**  
The official visitor information center, souvenir shop and tour departure point can be found at 602 E. Fourth St.
- 9 Bass Concert Hall**  
This popular performing arts venue is located on the UT Austin campus.
- 10 Blanton Museum of Art**  
The nation's largest university-owned art collection includes nearly 19,000+ works.
- 11 Bullock Texas State History Museum**  
Interactive exhibits, rare artifacts, multimedia shows and an IMAX theater captures Texas history.
- 12 Congress Avenue Bat Bridge**  
More than 1.5 million bats fly out from beneath the bridge each night at dusk from March - October.
- 13 The Contemporary Austin - Jones Center**  
Through statewide exhibitions and programs, The Contemporary Austin helps nurture artists' careers.
- 14 Circuit of the Americas's**  
This purpose built Formula 1 racing venue also hosts other sporting events, Austin Bold FC matches, regular tours, go kart racing, outdoor concerts, a holiday festival and more.
- 15 Barrell K. Royal Texas Memorial Stadium**  
It's game time in the Texas Longhorn football stadium, with a 100,000-person capacity.
- 16 Driskill Hotel**  
Originally built in 1886, this iconic hotel combines authentic Texas charm with modern sophistication.
- 17 Emma S. Barrientos Mexican-American Cultural Center**  
Mexican-American arts and heritage are highlighted with exhibits and performances.
- 18 French Legation State Historic Site**  
Built in 1841 as the private home of a French representative to the Republic of Texas, the historic structure, landscape and new visitors center provide an engaging cultural destination.
- 19 George Washington Carver Museum, Cultural & Genealogy Center**  
Celebrate the history of Austin's African-American community and historic contributions of Dr. Carver.
- 20 Governor's Mansion**  
Take in the historic official residence of Texas Governors since 1856.
- 21 Harry Ransom Center**  
This center houses the world's first photograph, a rare Gutenberg Bible, Watergate papers and more.
- 22 Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center**  
Explore hundreds of wildflowers and native plants of Texas in the beautiful gardens at the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center.
- 23 LBJ Presidential Library & Museum**  
This presidential museum chronicles LBJ's career.
- 24 Long Center for the Performing Arts**  
Home to the Austin Symphony, Austin Opera, and Ballet Austin, as well as home to the Austin Music Memorial.
- 25 Mexic-Arte Museum**  
Stop in for exhibits of amazing Mexican and Latin American art.
- 26 Mike A. Myers Stadium**  
Soccer and track events are held at this UT Austin 20,000-seat stadium.
- 27 Neill-Cochran House Museum**  
This stately Greek Revival residence, built in 1855 and located near the UT Austin campus.
- 28 O. Henry House & Museum**  
Stop by the cottage where writer William Sydney Porter (O. Henry) lived.

## Parks & Recreation

- 44 Barton Creek Greenbelt**  
Enjoy biking, rock-climbing, bouldering, seasonal swimming and 12 miles of hiking trails on this sprawling South Austin greenbelt. Multiple access points.
- 45 Barton Springs Pool**  
Dive into this 3-acre natural swimming hole with 68-degree year-round water temperature.
- 46 Boardwalk**  
With stunning views of the downtown skyline, the 7,250-foot boardwalk is a great accompaniment to your stroll along Lady Bird Lake.
- 47 Brush Square**  
This wonderful downtown oasis is just steps from the O. Henry Museum and the Susanna Dickinson Museum.
- 48 Fiesta Gardens**  
On the north shore of Lady Bird Lake, east of IH-35, this park hosts regular festivals.
- 49 Hike & Bike Trail**  
A popular draw for runners, cyclists and walkers are 10.1 miles of trail loop around Lady Bird Lake.
- 50 Lady Bird Lake**  
This 20-mile-long stretch of the Lower Colorado River meanders through downtown.
- 51 Pfluger Pedestrian Bridge**  
Located on the Lady Bird Lake Hike & Bike Trail, the scenic Pfluger Pedestrian Bridge provides a scenic spot to view downtown Austin.
- 52 Republic Square**  
Free live music, a weekly farmers market and outdoor activities can be found at this historic park.
- 53 Waterloo Greenway Moody Amphitheater**  
Winding along Walter Creek in the heart of downtown Austin, Waterloo Greenway is home to an array of natural and cultural spaces: from epic gardens and meandering pathways to live performances at the Moody Amphitheater.
- 54 Waterloo Park**  
Austinites head outdoors to this site of festivals and events.
- 55 Woolridge Square**  
Located at this scenic square at Ninth and Guadalupe Streets, with its center piece gazebo and giant chess set.
- 56 Zilker Park**  
At 358 acres, this park is home to Barton Springs Pool and ACL Music Festival each October.

## Districts

- 57 2ND Street District**  
Keep things local at some of Austin's top retail shops, boutiques, coffee houses and wine bars.
- 58 Central Austin District**  
You'll find cafes and vintage stores resting between neighborhood homes and craft bars.
- 59 The Domain & Arboretum**  
Journey north to find walkable outdoor districts with retail stores and local restaurants, family-friendly events and high-end shopping.
- 60 East Austin District**  
Head to East Austin to experience one of the fastest-growing and most alternative areas in town.
- 61 Rainey Street District**  
This laid-back area is home to converted bungalows that provide only-in-Austin music and bar experiences.
- 62 Red River District**  
From big name acts to local legends, Red River blares with the sounds of local Austin bands.
- 63 Sixth Street District**  
Stroll down Austin's most famous nightlife area and experience more than a dozen blocks of live music venues.
- 64 South Austin District**  
Quaint houses, vintage restaurants and new eateries by some of the city's top chefs populate this lively area.
- 65 South Congress (SoCo) District**  
Just south of Lady Bird Lake, "SoCo" is a vibrant neighborhood of boutiques, eateries and music venues.
- 66 Warehouse District**  
The industrial Warehouse District offers refined stamping grounds in the heart of downtown Austin.
- 67 West Sixth Street District**  
Here you can shop iconic home-grown retailers including Waterloo Records, BookPeople and more.
