












Welcome to Our Story

Bastrop is a founding part of what's made Texas great. In fact, it's one of the oldest towns in the Lone Star State. It was established by Stephen F. Austin, the Father of Texas himself, during the Colonial period of the Republic of Mexico. In 1832, it was officially named for the town's earliest and most important ally, Phillip Nering Bogel, the Baron de Bastrop.

EARLY DAYS

As the western-most town in Texas, Bastrop lay deep within Native American territory and was subject to frequent raids by several hostile tribes. Later, many local men volunteered to fight in the Texas Revolution. Then three years after Texas became a new republic, Bastrop came in second to become the permanent capital. The town continued to serve as a staging area for the development of Austin, whose original buildings were constructed from lumber milled from Bastrop's Lost Pines forest.

CIVIL WAR

As Texas grew, Bastrop became a thriving town. In the decade before the Civil War, the Bastrop Military Academy educated some of the state's most then-considered elite boys, many of whom served as officers in the Confederate Army. After the war, emancipated slaves struggled to gain equal status in the community. These African Americans joined German immigrants and others in a mostly agricultural town, where businesses, churches, and county government prospered.

ENTERING THE 20TH CENTURY

After years of effort, Bastrop succeeded in attracting a rail line in 1886, which prompted many modernizations including a bridge over the river, an opera house, and a bank. The 20th century began with the development of lignite coal mines just north of town that led to further prosperity and the immigration of numerous Mexicans who worked in the mines.

DEPRESSION ERA

In the 1930s, Depression Era programs built the Bastrop State Park and the adjoining Buescher State Park. During World War II, nearby Camp Swift, a large military training center, temporarily transformed the town and neighboring areas.

21ST CENTURY

In the 21st century, Downtown Bastrop kept its 19th century look with many historic homes and churches nestled along its tree-lined streets. Ironically, missing out on becoming the capital of Texas has allowed Bastrop to retain its old-town charm and friendlier, more welcoming ways.

The state parks, three golf courses, and access to Lake Bastrop and the Colorado River puts several outdoor adventures well within reach. Being this close to Austin, Bastrop continues to serve as an open invitation to conveniently slip into life that's well worth living.





BIRD WATCHING

THINGS TO DO

A SOARING EXPERIENCE

Birds of a feather flock to Bastrop, more than 277 bird species to be exact. In fact, Bastrop has been certified as the official Bird City of Texas by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department and Audubon Texas through 2022.

It's fortunate to be located along the prolific route that millions of birds take on their way to South America and back during their biannual migration. A handful of key spots in Bastrop tend to be their favorite locations.

Bastrop State Park offers more than 3,500 acres for woodpeckers like the Northern Flicker, Yellow-Bellied Sapsucker and the Redheaded Woodpecker to visit. You can also spot flycatchers like Western and Eastern Kingbirds and Great Crested and Brown Crested Flycatchers out on the hunt. In the summer, keep an eye out for the Chimney Swift near the intersection of Park Roads 1A and 1C. The large concrete tank on the hill is their summer home.

McKinney Roughs Nature Park is another prime birding location. In its 1,140 acres, you can spot as many as 13 species a day, including rare Cerulean and MacGillivray Warblers.

In the winter, you may want to join naturalists here for the annual Lost Pines Christmas Bird Count. Test your skills and help count bird species. You may even be rewarded with a sighting of the famous American Woodcock while you're there.

A hotspot for Bald Eagles and Ospreys is the beautiful Lake Bastrop. During the winter, you'll also spot thousands of American Coots and other water birds. The South Shore park even has a designated bird viewing area.

The Colorado River Refuge provides 89 acres of stunning riverside forest and upland meadows. Expect to see everything from vultures, hawks and blackbirds to vireos, hummingbirds and cranes. For city birding, Bob Bryant Park offers treed areas and a half-mile nature trail, and Fisherman's Park across the Colorado River is packed with ducks and geese enjoying the river.

And that's just the half of it! Even birds feel right at home in Bastrop and we certainly hope you will too. Happy birding!

- THE NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD WAS ADOPTED AS THE TEXAS STATE BIRD IN 1927. THE MOCKINGBIRD CAN SING UP TO 200 SONGS INCLUDING THE SONGS OF OTHER BIRDS AND SOUNDS FROM INSECTS AND AMPHIBIANS.

With an emphasis on organic and local ingredients, they serve breakfast, lunch and all kinds of amazing desserts, including vegan, vegetarian and gluten-free options.

There's a whole day of fun to be had at the freshly renovated Film Alley Bastrop. Catch the latest movies, enjoy a game of pool or try out Spark Bowling™, all while enjoying their signature Texas hospitality.

The Bastrop Visitors Center Scavenger Hunt is another fun activity for families. You can go on a hunt for bronze toad statues around Downtown Bastrop. Pick up the "Toads in Town" scavenger hunt brochure at the Visitors Center to find them all and record their locations. Kids can then turn in the completed scavenger hunt for a prize.

ENJOY A HISTORIC AFTERNOON

With a rich heritage, legendary trees and Main Street charm, Bastrop is known as one of Texas' most historic small towns. Plan at least half a day to enjoy historic Main Street, Downtown Bastrop and the dozens of distinguished historic homes and buildings.

A good place to start is the Bastrop County Museum and Visitor Center for tips, maps and general information. The museum houses several exhibits you won't want to miss, spanning more than 200 years, their exhibits include Native American history, a look at colonies founded in Bastrop by freed slaves post-Civil War and a special WWII exhibit.

Be sure to check out the Bastrop Courthouse, too. It was built in 1884 by the father of Texas himself, Stephen F. Austin, with stone and lumber cut from the local Lost Pines forest

Although the interior is closed to the public, its historic architecture still leaves much to be admired and makes a terrific photo op.

Of course, there's also the Kerr Community Center, Bastrop's own bit of treasured history that was once a USO post for African-American soldiers stationed at nearby Camp Swift and hosted several significant black musicians, including blues pianist Roosevelt "Grey Ghost" Williams.

In December, you can also enjoy the Holiday Homes Tour for a personally guided look inside several of Bastrop's most beautiful historic homes.


