

BOARD - TAKING A STAND

The Bayfield Chamber of Commerce & Visitor Bureau Board of Directors may take a public stand on a major issue or public policy matters when a majority of the full Board votes in favor of doing so. The procedure for such a vote will be as follows:

The President, Executive Director, or any Board member may request that an issue be placed on the agenda of the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. The proposed position should be presented in written resolution form and discussed as an agenda item. A vote on the resolution shall not take place until the next regularly scheduled meeting or at a duly called special meeting of the Board. Board members shall use the following criteria in their decision making:

1. Is it critical to the economic well-being of the Bayfield area?
2. Is it at odds with the special image, culture and traditions of the Bayfield area?

If a public stand on an issue is taken by the Board, the Executive Director will notify the membership, the media, and any other interested parties.
