## KEY FACTS

- Big Sky Resort is the third largest ski resort in North America with **5,850 skiable acres** and **40 lifts**. It offers the most consistent snowfall in the Northern American Rockies with an average of more than **400 inches annually**.
- Gallatin Canyon is year-round playground for outdoor enthusiasts with an abundance of warm weather activities including ziplining, whitewater rafting, hiking, horseback riding and camping. **The Gallatin River is a world-class Blue Ribbon Trout Stream** known for its year-round rainbow and brown trout fisheries.
- Big Sky Resort's most challenging run is the **Big Couloir**, a triple-black diamond, expert-only couloir which drops **1,400 feet** from the summit of Lone Peak and is a sustained 50 degree pitch. The longest run on the mountain is more than six miles in length from the summit to the base.

## BIG SKY RESORT'S ALL-GLASS SCENIC VIEWING PLATFORM

Perched at 11,166 feet, Kircliff is a striking architectural feature integrated into the new Lone Peak Tram summit terminal. The all-glass platform offers a 360-degree experience with panoramic windows and a glass floor overlooking the fall line of Lone Mountain. On clear days, views stretch across Montana, Idaho, and Wyoming, with sightlines to Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks.



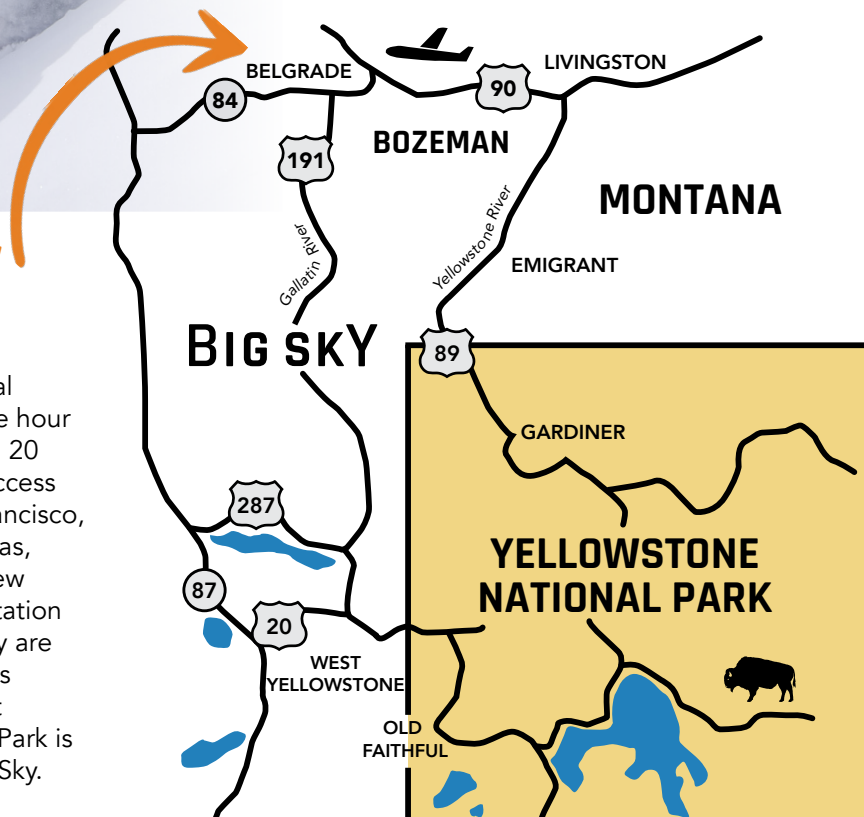
## CLIMATE & CONDITIONS

Big Sky sits high in the Madison Range above the Gallatin River Canyon, keeping temperatures cool year-round. The ski area summit sees an average annual snowfall of more than 400 inches. Due to the consistent snowfall, fresh powder can be found frequently throughout Big Sky. Summers are comfortable and mostly clear, with July being the warmest month with an average high temperature of 77.9°.

## LODGING GETTING THERE

Big Sky offers a wide range of accommodations to suit every travel style, from refined alpine retreats and private residences to slope-side lodges, moderate-rate hotels, and exceptional five-star resorts.

Big Sky is located in the Rocky Mountains of southern Montana. Bozeman Yellowstone International Airport (BZN) is approximately one hour from Big Sky and offers more than 20 nonstop routes with convenient access from major hubs including San Francisco, Los Angeles, Seattle, Denver, Dallas, Chicago, Minneapolis, Atlanta, New York and others. Ground transportation options from the airport to Big Sky are readily available, including shuttles and private car services. The West Entrance of Yellowstone National Park is approximately one hour from Big Sky.



Located in the heart of the meadow area, Big Sky Town Center is a gathering place where visitors will find a village of local boutiques, farmers markets, events, and numerous dining options featuring everything from artesian foods to handcrafted cocktails.
