SPRING IN BOONE IS A HIDDEN GEM, BURSTING WITH BRILLIANT COLORS ALONG PLEASANTLY UNCROWDED TRAILS.

As winter melts into spring, the area comes alive with lush greens and vibrant blossoms. Between the melting snow and the occasional spring showers, our rivers and streams are in peak condition for waterfall viewing, canoeing, rafting, and kayaking.

April ushers in the start of trout season in one of the best fly-fishing destinations in the Southeast. Our professional outfitters can guide you to secret spots for a memorable day of casting from the shore, wading in the rapids, or floating with the flow. Don't underestimate the therapeutic power of hip waders.

Merlefest, in nearby Wilkesboro, kicks off the festival season in April, followed by the High Country Jazz Festival and the Boonerang Music & Arts Festival in June. Showy spring wildflowers like the bright orange flame azalea and bright pink Catawba rhododendron begin blooming in mid- to late May.

FIND YOUR SUMMER COMFORT IN BOONE'S COOL MOUNTAIN AIR - AVERAGE HIGHS ARE AROUND 77°F.

If you think summer in the South is too hot and humid, come to Boone and enjoy our refreshing mountain air.

Besides ideal weather, there's so much to enjoy outdoors that you may not go inside all season long. From hiking the valleys to cycling the Blue Ridge Parkway to zip lining through the canopy, there are adventures for all ages and skill levels. There's also whitewater rafting through world-class rapids, boating on picturesque

mountain lakes, and tubing along North America's oldest river (ironically named the New River).

If you prefer education to adventure, check out Hickory Ridge History Museum to learn how early settlers adapted to mountain life in the late 1700s. Or treat the family to a blast from the past at Tweetsie Railroad, a Wild West theme park offering rides on two narrow-gauge steam locomotives, one of which is on the National Register of Historic Places.


THE BOONE AREA IS HOME TO THE FRENCH-SWISS SKI COLLEGE, WHICH HAS TAUGHT MORE THAN A MILLION PEOPLE TO SKI, AND TO THE ONLY SLEDDING HILL WITH FRESHLY BLOWN SNOW IN THE AREA.

With three area ski resorts—Appalachian Ski Mountain, Beech Mountain, and Sugar Mountain—all within a 20-mile radius, Boone is considered the ski capital of the South.

There are also plenty of fun winter activities for those seeking less of an adrenaline rush. In addition to skiing and snowboarding, the Boone area offers ice skating, sledding,

snowshoeing, and snow tubing. Hawksnest, located in nearby Seven Devils, is the largest snow tubing operation in the Southeast.

After a day of fun in the great outdoors, head to one of our popular restaurants for a meal featuring local ingredients, or cozy up by the fire back at your rental cabin. Whether there's snow or not, winter in Boone is always a memorable time.



FIRST TIMERS' GUIDE

Known as the Heart of the High Country, Boone is perfectly positioned to offer endless mountain adventures and awe-inspiring experiences. We know it can be a daunting task to decide on things to do, so here is the must-do guide for your first visit to the area!



THE BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY

America's Favorite Drive offers some of the most spectacular scenery in the United States. Countless trails, trout streams, mountain lakes, waterfalls, and jaw-dropping overlooks can be enjoyed all within a short, scenic drive of Boone.

DOWNTOWN

Historic downtown Boone is where visitors and locals alike gather over locally roasted coffee, peruse galleries and old-time general stores, and meet up for music at the Jones House and shows at the landmark Appalachian Theatre.

THRILLING ADVENTURES

If the 40-foot climbing tower downtown didn't tip you off, the Boone area is home to a world of thrills and exciting excursions. Race along the treetops on a zipline tour, or zoom down a mountain on NC's first alpine coaster. A day on the river can range from whitewater rafting to relaxing floats. Mountain bikers will want to head to Rocky Knob for a challenging progression trail system and pump track.

APPALACHIAN STATE UNIVERSITY

Enjoy performances from internationally touring acts at the Schaefer Center for the Performing Arts, hear from artists exhibiting at the Turchin Center galleries, or revel with fellow football fans at "The Rock," the Southeast's most picturesque stadium.

FOODIE HAVEN

Boone boasts a fantastic food scene that caters to everyone's tastes. Enjoy classic Southern cooking at places like the Dan'l Boone Inn, or indulge in refined dishes at restaurants like the Gamekeeper and Artisanal. Fresh, local, and seasonal foods are easy to find at local restaurants and markets.

WINTER FUN

Boone is the preferred place to eat, play, and stay for those who love to spend their days on the slopes at nearby Beech Mountain Resort, Sugar Mountain Resort, and Appalachian Ski Mountain. Hawksnest is another great destination nearby, offering snow tubing in the winter and a zipline course in the summer.

High-adventure seekers and leisure travelers alike can find bliss in Boone, whether by driving the iconic Blue Ridge Parkway for stunning vistas or walking across the Mile High Swinging Bridge at Grandfather Mountain, an International Biosphere Reserve.

There are adrenaline-pumping ziplines, extensive hiking and biking trails, challenging ski slopes in winter, and a fun-filled alpine coaster to ride. After an adventure, it's even easier to indulge in spa days, fine dining, and relaxing yoga.

Families in particular will create cherished memories at attractions like Tweetsie Railroad, where a

historic steam engine takes guests on an unforgettable ride. The area's gem mines allow you to sift for your own treasures, and stopping at the gravitational anomaly at Mystery Hill adds a uniquely puzzling experience to any itinerary.

The natural beauty and adventure of Boone's surroundings clearly influence the area's vibrant art and culture scene. Several excellent concert series are hosted throughout the area, and the historic Art Deco Appalachian Theatre in downtown Boone has been beautifully restored and offers a wide range of year-round programming.

More than just a beautiful mountain town, Boone serves as the ultimate base camp for adventurers, providing unparalleled access to world-class hiking, biking, and river excursions.



Feel crisp mountain air rush past as you take on challenging mountain-biking trails that plunge and climb the rugged terrain at Rocky Knob Mountain Bike Park, or the spray of the churning river rapids as you whitewater raft on the Watauga River. Gaze down from a bird's-eye view while ziplining through the towering treetops, or test your grit by scaling sheer mountainsides and boulders.



Grandfather Mountain's Mile High Swinging Bridge is plenty of excitement for some, which spans from the park's Top Shop to Grandfather Peak at 5,280 feet above sea level. The truly daring will continue on to the craggy, ladder-laden trek to the mountain's highest point, Calloway Peak.

Every season delivers an unlimited potential for exhilarating, heart-pounding outdoor adventures. Winter brings low temperatures and snow to the South in Boone's High Country, allowing for our ski resorts, a dedicated snow-tubing park in the area, and even a municipal sledding hill (free for kids!) in the town of Beech Mountain.


Spend a slow day in the refreshing mountain air, and you can't help but feel renewed and relaxed.

Instead of handling them, take pictures of flowers and insects. Also, don't stack river rocks.

BE CAREFUL WITH FIRE

Check local regulations, gather wood locally, and burn wood completely to ash.

Observe all wildlife from a safe distance. Store food securely, and never feed a wild animal.

ARTS & CULTURE

BOONE'S RICH HISTORY

The Appalachians were “America’s first frontier” in the nation’s early days. Boone is known for the often isolated and relatively self-sufficient pioneers who explored and settled the area. Explore a collection of sites, from museums and sculptures to historic cabins, to truly appreciate this early American period of exploration.

Daniel Boone, the town’s famous pioneering namesake, actually grew up in the foothills of North Carolina and was said to have visited Boone often on hunting trips. The Daniel Boone Heritage Trail marks several sites, and the annual Horn in the West Outdoor Drama celebrates Boone’s lasting impact.

INSPIRING ARTISTS

Creativity has always been a part of the Boone area's culture, with artists among the area's earliest tourists. Numerous galleries showcase local and regional talent; our great venues host musical, theatrical, and dance performances; and our thriving busking culture brings impromptu musical and artistic performances to the streets. In fact, the first Friday of each month is an Art Crawl in downtown Boone featuring artists of all kinds.

Explore the Blue Ridge Craft Trails, which promote heritage crafts and working studios. Hands Gallery, a local artists' collective, has celebrated over 50 years at its downtown gallery.

Art Galleries & Museums



Near Hands Gallery, Appalachian State University's Turchin Center for the Visual Arts elevates the scene, offering rotating exhibits from around the world and hosting engaging art talks.

Venturing outside of Boone, places where art, history, and heritage are on display are easy to find. The Blowing Rock Art & History Museum (BRAHM), nearby, features a beautiful, historical permanent exhibit alongside new, ever-changing temporary exhibits. Admission is always free. Adding to the area's rich history and artistry are the unique frescoes that adorn the walls of several area churches.

Delve deeply into the art and heritage of the region, offering the option to explore for just a couple of hours or devote an entire day.

THE BUZZ ABOUT BOONE

- 1** The Blue Ridge Mountains, among the oldest ranges in the world, get their color from a chemical called isoprene, which is produced by the area's unique trees.
- 2** Tom Hanks visited Grandfather Mountain to shoot the iconic scene in *Forrest Gump*, running across the U.S. and up a jaw-dropping curve in the road to the Mile High Swinging Bridge.
- 3** Athletes like Lance Armstrong have trained for the Tour de France in the high elevations around Boone and Beech Mountain.
- 4** Boone was the first municipality in NC to generate 100% of its municipal energy using renewable sources in 2022.
- 5** Shortly after it was constructed in 2021, Tony Hawk visited Boone's first skate park, right on the Boone Greenway.
- 6** In 1979, NASA built what was once the largest windmill in the world at Howard Knob.
- 7** The New River is the oldest river in North America, and it also flows north.
- 8** The Appalachian High Country American Viticulture Area (AVA) was established in 2016 and spans much of the highest elevations in NC as well as the bordering areas of TN and VA.
- 9** Local legend and Grammy-winning bluegrass musician Doc Watson, who began his own career busking in Boone, is credited with discovering the Old Crow Medicine Show when they were busking outside of Boone Drug on King Street. Now, Boone celebrates that legacy with Buskers Fest every September.


