Good Morning,

The Biden administration will announce today that the US border will open to vaccinated international visitors on November 8. This will apply to both air travel into the US from international locations, as well as travel by land across southern and northern borders.

What this Means for Air Travel: Commencing November 8, international travelers to the US must be fully vaccinated and prepared to provide the necessary documentation to prove it. Fully vaccinated travelers will still be required to produce proof of a pre-departure negative test administered within three days of travel prior to boarding.

What this Means for Travel across the Land Borders: Also starting November 8, international visitors crossing the Canadian and Mexican land borders into the US, or coming by passenger ferry for leisure purposes, must be fully vaccinated. Upon crossing the border, they will be required to submit an attestation and to provide vaccination credentials upon request.

What's Next: The CDC will soon provide further guidance on exceptions to these vaccination requirements, what vaccination credentials are acceptable, and other operational details well in advance of November 8.
