Situated on Dorchester's Neponset Avenue, McGonagle's is a modern Irish pub offering a contemporary twist on traditional Irish hospitality. The two-level venue features live music and a commitment to the perfect pint of Guinness, poured using Irish-grade beer systems. The menu, overseen by chef Aidan McGee, includes classic Irish dishes and modern fusion touches. The lively atmosphere and authentic fare have quickly made McGonagle's a neighborhood favorite.



MIDA Fenway

Chef Douglass Williams brought his celebrated Italian restaurant, MIDA, to Boston's Fenway area in Q4 2024. Known for its soulful Italian dishes and handmade pastas, MIDA Fenway will offer a warm and inviting dining experience, with a menu that emphasizes fresh ingredients and authentic Italian flavors.



Dani's Lesbian Bar

(Opened Fall 2024)

Dani's is a sapphic queer bar in Boston that was created to provide a safe and inclusive environment for the LGBTQ+ community to celebrate identities and find a sense of belonging. Dani's Queer Bar will host community building events that showcases Boston's queer culture and allows everyone to be their true and honest selves.

Esmai's Cafe and Restaurant

In Brookline, the whiskey hotspot Hops N Scotch has undergone a transformation and is now Esmai's Cafe & Restaurant. The restaurant is still owned by the same team, David and Mai, who have introduced a refreshed menu with Vietnamese influences, paying homage to Mai's heritage. The new establishment is named after their daughter and is located at 1306 Beacon Street.

**Amba**

This all-day cafe offers a Mediterranean-inspired menu, featuring stuffed pitas, wraps, and borekas for breakfast, as well as hummus plates, shawarma, rice bowls, and an exceptional rotisserie chicken for lunch and dinner. **Shawmut Inn**

(Opened July 2024)

A new neighborhood spot, the Shawmut Inn, has opened in the South End, offering a menu that includes pasta, burgers, and grilled fish. You can find it at 477 Shawmut Avenue.

**Red Fox**

(Opened July 2024)

The Red Fox is a chic new pasta destination in the North End, quickly gaining popularity among patrons. With its luxurious red plush interiors, expertly crafted noodles by chef Jonathan Varela, and a hidden martini bar offering what could be Boston's first martini made with raw garlic, pepper, and parmesan, it's a must-visit. Find it at 326 Commercial Street.

**Le Mari**

(Opened June 2024)

Newbury Street is now home to the swanky new Le Mari (259 Newbury St.) from chef Leigh Whittaker. Whittaker traded in a longtime career in medical devices for a degree from the Cambridge School of Culinary Arts, going on to Maine's Earth at Hidden Pond and Fox & the Knife in South Boston.

**Folio Bistro**

(Opened June 2024)

The Boston Athenaeum has announced the opening of its new street-level bistro, Folio, launched in partnership with The Catered Affair. Folio will serve as the newest social hub in Boston, inviting all curious food lovers to enjoy made-to-order shareable plates, lively conversation, and impeccable service.

 **Monteverdi**

(Opened June 2024)

Seth Greenberg, one of Boston's most successful restaurant and hospitality professionals, has officially opened Monteverdi at 40 Edward H. Land Boulevard in Cambridge (The Royal Sonesta Boston). Monteverdi is located on the banks of the Charles River, offering one of the most intimate river views in all of Cambridge and Boston.

 **La Padrona**

(Opened May 2024)

Located within Raffles Boston hotel, La Padrona offers an exploration of Italy's diverse regional cuisines. From acclaimed chefs Jody Adams and Amarilys Colón, the menu features house-made pastas, local seafood, and inventive dishes. The bi-level space includes a bright, inviting lounge on the first floor and a sultry, dark-toned dining room upstairs. Since its opening, La Padrona has garnered accolades, including Eater Boston's Best New Restaurant of 2024.

 **BCB3**

(Opened March 2024)

Chef Jamie Bissonnette launched a new venture, BCB3, alongside restaurateurs Andy Cartin and Babak Bina. They opened three interconnected establishments in Downtown Crossing, Boston: a modern Korean restaurant named Somaek, a listening bar called Temple Records with a spirit-forward approach, and a subterranean sushi counter, Sushi @ Temple Place. Bissonnette, drawing inspiration from his Korean mother-in-law, spearheads Somaek and the sushi spot, which offers a menu of Korean rice cakes, noodles, and soups. Cartin manages the drinks program at Temple Records, which promises a Japanese cocktail lounge vibe with highballs and an eclectic wine list.

 **Baleia**


(Opened March 2024)

Nestled in Boston's South End, Baleia offers a contemporary take on Portuguese coastal cuisine. Led by Executive Chef Andrew Hebert, the menu emphasizes seafood dishes and the traditional cataplana—a savory stew of braised pork and fresh seafood. The restaurant's design reflects Mediterranean coastal aesthetics, featuring soft lines and sun-faded hues, creating an atmosphere that transports diners to Portugal's scenic shores.


**Shybird**

(Opened March 2024)

Shy Bird's latest and largest location brings its all-day rotisserie, bar, and café concept to Boston's Fenway neighborhood. Founded by restaurateur Andrew Holden, this third outpost offers an expanded dinner menu. The space includes a cozy dining area and a welcoming patio, making it a versatile spot for any time of day or year.

 **Museum of Ice Cream**
(Opened Q4 2024)


Museum of Ice Cream has opened a location in the Seaport in 2024, allowing visitors to explore two floors of entertainment and discovery, inspired by the frozen dessert. It features 14 interactive installations that will immerse guests in the celebration of ice cream and Boston's culture — while offering them the chance to indulge in some sweet treats.

 **Harry Potter: The Exhibition**
(Through April 25, 2025)

Warner Bros. Discovery Global Themed Entertainment, Imagine Exhibitions, and Eventim Live have announced that the U.S. tour of Harry Potter: The Exhibition is continuing and making its Boston debut at CambridgeSide on September 13, 2024. Prepare yourself for the most extensive touring exhibition ever created that celebrates the enchanting world of Harry Potter and beyond, which has already mesmerized over 2 million fans worldwide.

 **Titanic at the Castle**
(Through June 1, 2025)

Opening on October 17, 2024, Titanic at the Castle is an immersive exhibition that brings to life the story of the Titanic. Featuring artifacts from the ill-fated ship, recreated environments, and interactive displays, this exhibit will take visitors on a journey through history.

 **Dewey Square Mural**
(Unveiled Q4 2024)

Jeffrey Gibson, the multidisciplinary artist who represented the United States at this year's Venice Biennale, has created the next mural at Dewey Square, the Rose Kennedy Greenway Conservancy. Gibson is scheduled to complete the mural, titled "your spirit whispering in my ear," this September. The project is a collaboration with the Massachusetts Museum of Contemporary Art, where Gibson is slated to open an immersive installation in late 2024.

 **Witnessing Humanity: The Art of John Wilson**

(Through June 22, 2025)

Born in Roxbury, Massachusetts, John Wilson (1922–2015) is one of Boston’s most esteemed artists. His work, made over the span of 60 years, continues to resonate with the persistent realities of disenfranchisement, racial prejudice, and social injustice. “Witnessing Humanity: The Art of John Wilson” is the largest-ever exhibition of Wilson’s work, co-organized by the MFA and the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York. Featuring approximately 110 works by the artist in a wide range of media—prints, drawings, paintings, sculpture, and illustrated books—the exhibition explores the many ways Wilson called attention to racial, social, and economic injustices through his art.

 **Van Gogh: The Roulin Family Portraits**

(Through September 7, 2025)

Visitors can see approximately 20 works by Van Gogh, including the MFA’s iconic portraits Postman Joseph Roulin (1888) and Lullaby: Madame Augustine Roulin Rocking a Cradle (La Berceuse) (1889) as well as important loans from museums such as the Van Gogh Museum in Amsterdam, Museum of Modern Art in New York, Art Institute of Chicago, and Musée d’Orsay in Paris. Additionally, key works of earlier Dutch art and Japanese woodblock prints—both of which profoundly informed Van Gogh’s portrait practice—provide critical insight into elements of the artist’s creative process. Letters written by Postman Roulin bring to life the deep bond of friendship and a major turning point in Van Gogh’s life, as he moved to a new city and grappled with his mental health. He dreamed of creating a vibrant community of artists in Arles, which led to a visit by fellow painter Paul Gauguin, whose work is included in this exhibition.

The Boston Public Art Triennial is an exciting citywide event celebrating contemporary public art. It will showcase digital installations, sculptures, performance art and interactive pieces by both local, national, and international artists. The exhibition will transform parks, streets, and public buildings into creative canvases throughout Boston's diverse neighborhoods.



Tall Ships Return - Sail Boston

(July 11-16, 2026)

Boston, known for its Visiting Ship Program, eagerly awaits the return of the tall ships for Sail Boston 2026®. The city, rich in American Revolution history, invites visitors to explore the Freedom Trail. This 2.5-mile path weaves past sixteen historic sites, from Boston Common to Bunker Hill and the Charlestown Navy Yard, home to the USS Constitution, the oldest commissioned ship still afloat.
