Through pioneering partnerships and programs, **five land-management agencies** provide Boulder County residents and visitors with car-free access to some of the most popular trailheads in Colorado:

- Chautauqua
- Eldorado Canyon State Park
- Indian Peaks Wilderness Area
- Rocky Mountain National Park

Getting to these areas is easier than ever. Skip the parking hassles and opt to hop on a shuttle and keep the good vibes rolling from Boulder to the trails.

BOULDER'S HIKER SHUTTLES

Weekends, Memorial Day Weekend–Labor Day*

City of Boulder Open Space & Mountain Parks CHAUTAUQUA PARK TO PARK SHUTTLE

Ride the free weekend shuttle to get to Chautauqua, Boulder's most popular hiking area at the foot of the Flatirons. Park for free at 5 downtown parking garages (the ones marked with this symbol), the CU Regent lot, or New Vista High School and then hop on the shuttle.

- FREE pickups every 15 minutes
- Saturdays and Sundays, 8am–8pm (plus Memorial Day, Labor Day and Fourth of July)
- Dogs, strollers and gear welcome

State Park ELDO SHUTTLE

Eldorado Canyon State Park, "Eldo" to locals, is 20 minutes from Boulder and is world renowned for rock climbing. Parking is limited at the park, and when it's full, cars are turned away. Instead, pick up the shuttle from the University of Colorado Regent Lot (Broadway and Regent) or one of five other stops shown on the map.

- FREE pickups every 20 minutes
- Saturdays and Sundays, 8am–7pm (plus holidays)
- Brief transfer at SH 93 & 170
- Bikes (3 per shuttle), climbing gear, leashed dogs and strollers welcome

A valid state parks pass is required for those 16 and older to ride the shuttle. Bring your annual pass, purchase a day pass at cpwshop.com or bring \$4 exact cash.

Federal Wilderness Area HESSIE TRAILHEAD SHUTTLE

Ride to the Hessie Trailhead that leads to popular hiking trails in the Indian Peaks Wilderness, where parking is scarce. You can take a bus from Boulder to the shuttle: Ride the RTD Bus Route NB from the downtown Boulder station to Nederland High School (fares apply).

*Operates late May to early October.

- FREE pickups every 15 minutes
- Pickup at Nederland High School
- Friday 6:30am–6pm, Saturday 6:30am–8pm and Sunday 6:30am–6pm (plus holidays)
- Leashed dogs welcome
- Bikes are not allowed

National Park BUSTANG TO ROCKY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL PARK

Catch the Bustang at Table Mesa Park-N-Ride and ride to Estes Park Visitor Center where you can transfer to a RMNP shuttle to Bear Lake Road.

*Operates early July to early October.

A valid park pass (nps.gov/romo) is required to ride the shuttle into RMNP. A timed entry reservation is not required for Bustang passengers.

- Bus tickets are \$5 each way and must be purchased in advance
- Saturdays and Sundays, July 3–October 3, 2021
- Pickup at Table Mesa Park-N-Ride (Gate B) in Boulder is at 7:50am or 8:50am
- Return to Table Mesa Park-N-Ride (Gate A) is at 4pm or 6pm
