Consider the following alternative destinations in the area. All offer great opportunities for recreation.

NOTE: Parking at many trailheads fills up early. Plan to arrive before 6 a.m. or after 3 p.m. to find a spot.

West Magnolia "West Mag"

- Managed by US Forest Service
- Hiking, biking, and equestrian use
- Dogs allowed on leash

South Sourdough Trail

- Managed by US Forest Service
- Hiking, biking, and equestrian use
- Dogs allowed on leash

Mud Lake Open Space

- Boulder County Parks & Open Space
- Hiking, biking, and equestrian use
- Dogs allowed on leash

Caribou Ranch Open Space

- Boulder County Parks & Open Space
- Hiking only
- No dogs allowed
- Closed April 1 – June 30

THE HESSIE TRAILHEAD

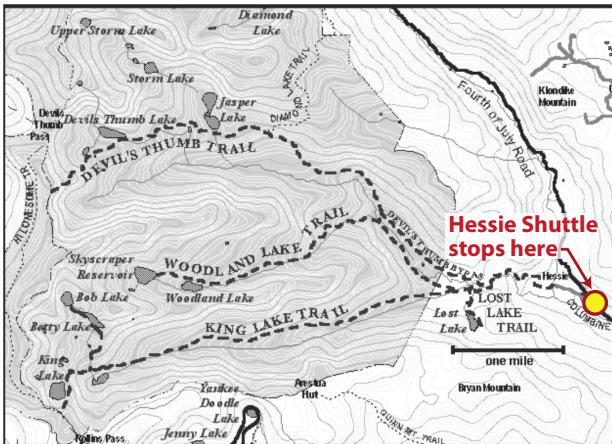
The Hessie Trailhead is a very popular destination and can be extremely congested on weekends.

- Indian Peaks Wilderness
- Woodland Lake
- Devils Thumb
- Diamond Lake trails
- Lost Lake
- King Lake

FREE SHUTTLE SERVICE

Free Hessie Shuttle service is available Fridays, weekends and holidays from Friday, May 24, 2024, through Sunday, Oct. 6, 2024 from Nederland High School (Beginning Aug. 16, Friday shuttle service will operate from the Nederland Park-N-Ride). The shuttle takes you to the junction of Fourth of July Road and Hessie Road to access the trailhead.

FIRST SHUTTLE OF THE DAY

The first shuttle of the day leaves at 6 a.m. After that, shuttles depart every 15 minutes.

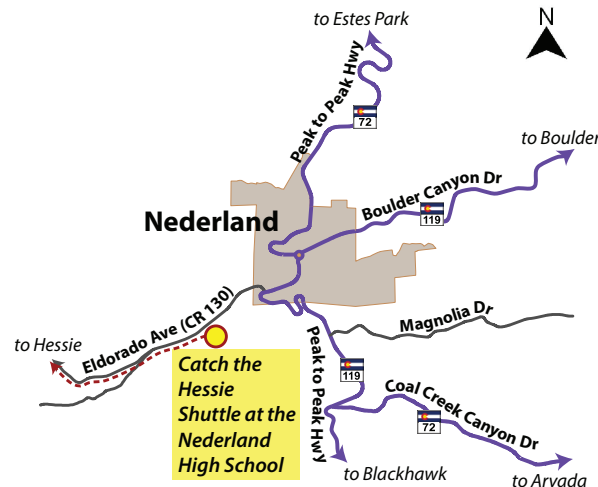
LAST SHUTTLE OF THE DAY

The last shuttle of the day leaves Hessie at:

- Fridays: 6 p.m. (Beginning Aug. 16, service from RTD lot)
- Saturdays: 8 p.m. (6 p.m. after Labor Day)
- Sundays: 6 p.m. (8 p.m. on May 26, Sept. 1)
- Holidays (May 27, June 19, Sept. 2): 6 p.m. (July 4 and 5): 8 p.m.

RIDE ROUTE "NB" TO NEDERLAND

RTD's "NB" bus provides service from Downtown Boulder Station and the Boulder County Justice Center to Nederland High School and Nederland RTD Park-N-Ride. For more information including fares, visit www.rtd-denver.com or call 303-299-6000.



SHUTTLE PARKING IN NEDERLAND

Free parking for the Hessie Shuttle is available at the Nederland High School on CR 130 (see map).

SHUTTLE PARKING IN BOULDER

On weekends, free parking is available at the Downtown Boulder Station and Boulder County Justice Center.

HESSIE TRAILHEAD PARKING

Parallel parking on CR 130 is allowed between parking permitted signs only. All other parked vehicles will be ticketed or towed.

- No parking on north side of Fourth of July Road.
- Trailhead parking usually full by 6 a.m.
- Parking regulations are strictly enforced. See map of parking on back.

4TH OF JULY TRAILHEAD PARKING

Parking is available in the City of Boulder parking lot at the trailhead. Parallel parking on CR 111 (4th of July Rd) is allowed between parking permitted signs only. All other parked vehicles will be ticketed or towed.

- Trailhead parking usually full by 6:30 a.m.
- Parking regulations are strictly enforced.
