Planted by a Sunset Beach couple over 30 years ago, the mailbox belongs to both no one and everyone and encourages thousands of visitors to anonymously share their story with the universe each year. Readers of his new novel will come to find that this quirky mailbox is the center of the storyline in Every Breath.

In preparation for his new novel, Sparks' fanatics can enjoy a "Safe Haven" of their own by taking a "Walk to Remember" to Kindred Spirit and the other iconic landmarks in the Brunswick Islands and surrounding North Carolina coastal communities that were made famous by Sparks' novels and films.

Brunswick Islands, NC:

Sunset Beach and Southport have both served the book or filming backdrop for "Every Breath" (2018), "Safe Haven" (2010) "A Walk To Remember" (1999) and "The Longest Ride" (2013).

Sunset Beach, Brunswick Islands: Featured in "Every Breath."

• Send a message to a higher power at the <u>Kindred Spirit Mailbox</u>, the central location in the novel and the destination that Nicholas Sparks' character in the novel finds the manila envelope detailing the "The Most Amazing Story Ever" of Tru Wallace and Hope Anderson's romance

• Visit the charming town of Sunset Beach where Hope Anderson goes to spend time at her family's cottage.

Southport, Brunswick Islands: Featured in the film adaptions of "Safe Haven" & "A Walk To Remember"

Featured in "Safe Haven":

- Have a drink on the dock at Old American Fish Co restaurant, which transformed into Ivan's Fish Shack where Katie Feldman worked as a waitress.
- Walk through Downtown Southport to see some of the storefronts and restaurants that made their way into the film as well as housed the crew
- Explore West Moore and Bay Streets where the dramatic NC 4th of July Festival was recreated in Fall for filming of the iconic Fourth of July scenes
- Fans will recognize the W Brunswick Street house where Alex Wheatley lived with his children in the film.
- Enjoy a meal at Ports of Call restaurant—where Katie and Alex shared their first romantic dinner.
- See where Alex kept his boat at the Southport Marina.

Featured in "A Walk to Remember":

- Stop by the beautiful church where Jamie Sullivan's dad was a pastor.
- Dry your tears at the Old Smithville Burying Ground where Jamie was buried in the movie.
- Watch the sunset over the water at the Riverwalk Gazebo where Jamie and Landon shared a kiss.
- Orton Plantation Chapel (no longer open to the public) where Jamie and Landon Carter (Shane West) got married.

Caswell Beach, Brunswick Islands: Featured in the film adaption of "The Longest Ride."

• Visit the delightful seaside town of Caswell Beach where Ruth's family spent the summer.
