# BATTLE CREEK WELCOME CENTER

## **MAPS & INFO**

You have questions and we have answers - at least, answers about experiencing Calhoun County. Please don't ask any questions about solving calculus problems. As you enter the door to the Welcome Center, a bell rings and you'll be greeted by staff. You may notice a gold star on our name tags. Those are given to Certified Tourism Ambassadors. Besides the Welcome Center staff, there are more than 270 people who have been certified in the county.

## **GIFTS & SOUVENIRS**

Once you know where you're going, take a minute to look at the store. We have a lot of great items, curated by our store manager. See the necklaces, hanging by the counter? They have little Michigan charms and they're made by a Battle Creek artist. Flip through the T-shirts by the stairs. You'll find cereal mascots and Battle Creek shirts in all colors and sizes.

#### **CEREAL FACTS**

*Have you ever begged your parents* for a box of cereal to get the prize?

In marketing, the prize is called a premium, and W.K. Kellogg was the first to engineer it. We have a display case of cereal premiums that people have collected over the years.

#### Ever wonder how "Grape-Nuts" got its name, when it contains neither grapes nor nuts?

There are two stories about this. One is C.W. Post called glucose "grape sugar," and the cereal combined that with a nutty taste. The other story is someone thought the cereal looked like grape seeds, or "nuts."

#### Tony the Tiger was born in 1952.

Designed by Eugene Kolkey, the first design was a Slinky-like tiger with a red bandana. Eventually, Tony got a more muscular update, but kept the bandana. You can buy your own Tony at the Welcome Center Gift Shop.

# **CEREAL HISTORY EXHIBIT**

What does a world-famous spa and Corn Flakes have to do with each other? Stop by the Cereal History Exhibit to find out. We're located right next to the Battle Creek Welcome Center.

#### **CEREAL MASCOT WINDOWS**

# Flash Flood Water Park

More than a pool, Flash Flood has indoor and outdoor equipment. In the summer, whoosh down the twists and turns of the outdoor slides. Indoors, there are courts that can be rented for basketball, floor hockey, volleyball and more.

# Have a Tasty Lunch

Sandwiches are delicious and portable – it makes lunch easy for anyone who has to juggle bags and young children. At Barista Blues Café ask for the peanut butter and banana sandwich. Across the street, there's Simply Sensational Berries. It serves healthy options for a take-out lunch, like fresh fruit, but there are a lot of chocolate-dipped sweets and cakes as well.

# **Mill Race Park**

This large green space in the middle of downtown has an eye-catching water feature. Feel the spray of the waterfall on your face while checking out icons explaining Battle Creek's industrial history. The kids, however, are going to want to go straight to the play structure, which features towers and slides. The park includes picnic benches.

# 📙 Binder Park Zoo

Have you ever been up close to a giraffe before? Their big eyes and long lashes make them look sweet, but if you aren't paying attention, they'll snatch lettuce right out of your hand. The zoo is a great place for such animal encounters, whether it's standing face-to-face with a giraffe or watching the bear siblings wrestle. Play areas include: life-sized dinos at Zoorassic Park, a musical garden and a zip-line course. Also plan for a carousel, a whimsical train ride, nature paths and a large picnic area.

# 🗕 Torti Taco

If you need food that appeals to kids, preteens and teens, you can't go wrong with tacos. Torti Taco is near the zoo and the mall, with a second location downtown. The food is fresh and authentic, plus there's a salsa bar. Teenagers (or crazy adults) might want to try the super-hot Torti Burrito Challenge.

# **Critchlow Alligator Sanctuary**

If you loved Zoorassic Park, then swing by this sanctuary to meet some modern-day dinosaurs. Critchlow is home to more than 200 reptiles, the majority of them alligators. These are gators that started as pets but needed a new home when they became too big or difficult. At the sanctuary, you can share treats with baby alligators or feed carrots to tortoises and learn their stories.

# Lux Cafe

When families gather for breakfast, they do it at Lux Cafe. The traditional diner food comes in big portions and ranges from sweet to savory. Stop by in the morning for pancakes, skillets and French toast served with a side of bacon or sausage.

# Kids 'N' Stuff Museum

There's still time to play! Head over to Albion for a hands-on museum. Kids can build, pretend, experiment and create. It's aimed at preteen ages and younger, but even older siblings can be engaged in playtime. There's also a room for babies, who might not be able to keep up yet.

# **Cereal History Exhibit**

Learn about the history of cereal at the Battle Creek Welcome Center. The exhibit explains how cereal grew from a kitchen fail to a multi-million-dollar business. The Welcome Center is also the best place to buy Battle Creek mementos or to take your picture with Tony the Tiger.

# Monuments

Take a walk around downtown Battle Creek. Follow the Linear Park Trail along the Battle Creek River, and you'll find the Kellogg House gardens. The star attraction is a 14-foot-tall monument dedicated to the Underground Railroad – Battle Creek was an important way station for African Americans seeking safety and freedom. Cross the nearby bridge and walk along the street until you see the Sojourner Truth monument.

# **Firekeepers Casino Hotel**

The gaming is hot at FireKeepers, with 70 game tables, a poker room and more than 2,900 slots. What might be even hotter, however, is the food. Six restaurants serve some of the best food in Battle Creek. There's everything from filet minjon at Nibi to shrimp and grits at Smoke 'n Fire. Check the casino's event schedule for big name acts, like Louie Anderson, Boyz II Men and Reba.

A quick drive down East Michigan Avenue will take you from FireKeepers to Marshall. There are lots of quirky downtown shops to discover. You'll find specialty stores with outdoor gear, stationery, mandolins, plants, toys, natural dog treats, books and more.



# Sage Creek Winery

Stop by Marshall's Sage Creek Winery and you'll be treated like family. They have some bold dry wines, but it's the sweet and semi-sweet wines where Sage Creek really has fun. Try the popular Twilight Blues, a pinot noir which has a tangy burst of blueberry combined with cherry spice flavor. A bottle of wine is a good souvenir.



# American Museum of Magic

Experience the treasures of famous magicians such as Houdini and Blackstone. This charming museum is located in one of downtown Marshall's historic 19th-century buildings. The museum has a vast poster art collection, objects used in magic tricks and chances to see some magic for yourself.

# Breakfast

A trip to downtown Marshall isn't complete without a nut roll from Louie's Bakery. This classic Marshall treat is cinnamony dough smothered in icing and nuts. If you're a Bloody Mary fan, then plan your stay around the weekend and go to brunch at Grand River Brewery. It has a free-range Bloody Mary bar along with ricotta pancakes, eggs benedict and poutine for breakfast.

# **Marshall Riverwalk**

To help digest your breakfast, go for a walk along the river. Marshall has an easy 1.6-mile path that includes paving and a boardwalk. It's a peaceful stroll no matter the season. See it!

## **Albion Malleable Brewing Co.**

Albion Malleable Brewing Company serves good food in a chill environment. The burger was voted best in Michigan by Mlive and the Belgian-style beer has won at the Great American Beer Festival. On some nights you'll find live music, or you can pick a board game from the shelves. It's a brewery that invites you to hang out.



# **Bohm Theatre**

Take your gang down the street to the Bohm Theatre for a movie or concert. After all, it was a favorite spot for the notorious Purple Gang in the 1930s. The restored movie palace plays the current blockbusters on the weekend. Or you can rent the theater for movies or big-screen video game sessions. Blues at the Bohm happens monthly, with professional musicians taking the stage, then inviting the audience for a jam.

# ] Kayaking

The Kalamazoo River is a fairly smooth ride and you'll see lots of wildlife. If you don't mind carrying your kayak down some stairs, start at Ceresco Green. For a long trip – we're talking about three and a half hours without stops – go all the way to Paddler's Grove. You can take a break at Historic Bridge Park, which has bathrooms and a kayak launch, so it's easy to get on and off the river.

# Disc Golf

People take their disc golf seriously in Battle Creek, so prepare to be challenged. We recommend Irving Park to start. Besides the disc golf course, there are walking paths, grills and a Japanese garden that is especially beautiful in the spring. But you'll see people playing disc golf in all seasons, even winter. For more courses, look up Begg Park, Dexter Lake Church and Leila Arboretum.

# Taqueria San Francisco

This Mexican food restaurant is so popular, they have two locations. The original restaurant is at 691 Capital Ave. S.W. There's a large selection of ice cream, paletas, chocolate-covered bananas, elote and more. You can't leave without trying a sweet-salty-spicy-tart mangonada.

# Sweetwater's Donut Mill

Swing by in the morning for something sweet. There's a specialty doughnut every week, where the bakers flex their creativity. Rice Krispies and marshmallows on top of a doughnut? Yes please. But you can't go wrong even with a simple glazed doughnut or apple fritter at Sweetwater's.

# Brunch

If you want a late breakfast indulgence on Sunday, try Kitchen Proper in Battle Creek or Copper Athletic Club in Marshall. Their menus change every month with exciting new options and creative cocktails. For something more traditional, try the buffet at Clara's on the River. You can have as much bacon and mini waffles as you want.

## Home Run Dog Park

There's plenty of space to run around in this park. Hopefully your human has a strong throwing arm, because you'll want to go the distance when chasing that ball. There's also a space for small dogs only. If you need a drink, go to the hydration station. Remember to share nicely!

# **Battle Jacks**

Humans like to chase balls, too, and the dog park is part of a larger place to play called Bailey Park. There's a playground, sand volleyball and lots of baseball fields. They love dogs so much in Battle Creek that they named the local baseball team the Battle Jacks, with a Jack Terrier mascot. Look for "Bring Your Dog Night".

# The Scoop

Get your puppy-dog eyes ready, because you're going to need them when you want your human to buy all of the holistic treats at The Scoop. The store was opened by Dr. Pete VanVranken of Dickman Road Veterinary Clinic. We know you're not a fan of the Scary Place, but the people there really want you to be healthy and happy. At The Scoop, your human can get advice on how to keep you in good shape.

# Go for Walkies

Dog parks can be fun, but you need to make sure your human gets exercise, too. There are a lot of trails to visit, such as the Battle Creek Linear Park Trail and the Calhoun County Trailway. The Calhoun County Trailway ends at Historic Bridge Park, and humans like to walk over the bridges. Make sure they're holding onto the leash so they won't get lost, and then lead them for a walk along the river or through the woods.



# **State Street Pawfitters**

Another good place to walk around is historic downtown Marshall. Some people leave out dishes of water in case you get thirsty. Visit State Street Pawfitters. You're going to need a leash, mostly so your human can keep you from instantly snarfing down all the snacks you can reach. That's considered rude. The first thing you'll notice at Pawfitters is the bins of biscuits and chew toys, then the bakery case full of fresh cookies, sausages and duck heads.

For something more personal, there's the Palmer House Inn Bed & Breakfast in Albion. The canine hospitality pack includes a bed just for you, treats and a water bowl. The owners have two pugs of their own, so they know all of the pet-friendly spots in town. The humans do have to pay an extra \$15 fee per night for extra cleaning, but part of that fee is donated to nonprofit animal shelters and dog rescue organizations in Michigan.





# PICK YOUR PAIRING

The craft brewing trend proves a pub is more than its beer. Attitude is everything, and craft breweries in Calhoun County have personalities as strong as their drinks. Here we suggest some pairings for travelers who aren't just looking for a pit stop, they're looking for an experience.

#### **ALBION MALLEABLE BREWING CO.**

Albion Malleable Brewing Company has the warmth of the city's industrial past, balanced with the bright notes of future possibilities. "Porter" used to be a physically demanding job, and the workers were known to like dark beer. So it's fitting that they call their porter "American Molder." It honors the iron company that put Albion on the map while using hops grown by a local farm. Travel experts also named them as the place to find Michigan's best burger – so raise a toast to Albion's delicious new industry.

#### **DARK HORSE BREWING COMPANY**

Dark Horse pairs well with a sense of adventure, really bringing out a zest for life. This quirky establishment was once the subject of a reality TV show called "Dark Horse Nation." They're serious about making beer and serious about having fun. The beer garden is a great spot to find live music and dogs are allowed.

#### **GRAND RIVER BREWERY**

The rich flavors of Grand River Brewery will soothe anyone looking to come in from the cold. Warm up with a cocktail made with spirits from the distillery. The food menu is heavy on comfort too: chronic fries with garlic brown butter and Balsamic reduction, poutine covered in Small Town Brown Ale gravy, a burger with bacon jam, or mac 'n' cheese topped with pulled pork. Wash it all down with the awardwinning Monkey Mouth IPA. See it Scan the QR code for addresses and more information about Calhoun County's amazing breweries.



#### **NEW HOLLAND BREWING**

Smooth and sophisticated, New Holland Brewing goes down easy. The light filled space in Battle Creek is just as good for a date night as a business lunch meeting. The beer garden is open in warm weather. There will be more than beer to imbibe, as plans include onsite brewing and distilling.

#### HANDMAP BREWING

For a relaxed taste and down-to-earth finish, Handmap Brewing has the essence of Michigan. Look at your right palm and point to the bottom left - that's where you'll find this brewery serving up craft beer in a renovated historic space on the banks of the Battle Creek River. Maybe try the fruity Two-Can beer, inspired by cereal.

#### TERRITORIAL BREWING COMPANY

Raise a glass to the motherland at this bold brewery with undertones of nostalgia. Even if you've never been to Europe, you can crave the German-inspired menu. There's classic pretzels and schnitzel, along with newer trends, such as the popular street food called doner kebab. Pilsner tops the list of mainstay beers, but you'll also see lagers and a rotating list of whatever is currently striking the brewers' fancy.

## **SOCIAL DISTRICT**

Take advantage of Battle Creek's social district to take your happy hour into the sunshine. It works like this: Go to one of the following venues, order a drink in a to-go cup with the State Street Commons logo and take it outside. The district is marked by signs throughout downtown.



# BINDER PARK ZOO

Starting as a small roadside attraction in the '70s, Binder Park Zoo is now one of the largest zoos in Michigan. From the blue poison dart frog to the reticulated giraffe, animals are given natural environments large enough for them to play, learn and be themselves.

#### AUSTRALIA

If you hear someone laughing at you when you enter the zoo, don't take offense, that's just the kookaburra. The first animals to greet you are from Australia. Everyone has heard of dingoes, wallabies and kangaroos, but what about wallaroos? Watch them hop around in the morning.

#### **SOUTH AMERICA**

Drop by the Conservation Discovery Center. The building is located near the zoo entrance. That's where the sloths hang out, literally. The Discovery Center is also where you'll find tiny technicolor frogs and slithery snakes.

#### ASIA

If you spot a hut with colorful flags, you've made it to the Himalayas. From inside, you can encounter Raj, the snow leopard. He is both majestic and playful, like a house cat but much, much bigger. Another popular furry face native to Asia is Tushar, the red panda. Red pandas are arboreal, so you'll most likely see them lounging in trees. Tushar likes to stick his tongue out at humans.

#### **NORTH AMERICA**

Follow bear footprints to the North American woods. Take a turn and you can observe three American black bears. These siblings were rescued as cubs in Alaska. Like a lot of kids, they have a treehouse and want to wrestle. Stop by the lodge to see the Mexican wolves. They have a big patch of forest to explore. Wolves born in Binder Park Zoo have been released into the wild.

#### AFRICA

Now it's time to hop on the international tram for a trip to Africa. It's easy to locate the depot station because of the walkway lined with flags from African countries. Pick up a few words of Swahili in the ranger station and then head out for a wildlife journey on the savanna.

Along the shaded walkways, stop at the Twiga overlook, where you'll come face-to-face with giraffes. They're always looking for a lettuce treat, so buy a few leaves from zoo staff. Have your camera ready before approaching the overlook, if you're not paying attention, the giraffes will snatch the lettuce right out of your hand!

Farther along, you'll come to Chai Pride Tea Co. There's no actual tea, but you'll be able to see the African painted dog pack on the left, and a very vocal lion pride on the right.

#### **MICHIGAN**

Once you arrive back from your trip to Africa, it's time to explore more of the zoo. Do you hear the train whistle? Catch a ride on the Z.O. & O. Railroad. The tracks go through Michigan woodland, constantly changing from the buds of spring to the burnt colors of fall.

You'll easily spot Skylark Ridge. This aerial structure is as tall as two adult giraffes. It has three stories of rope ladders, suspended bridges, cargo nets and more to climb. Five zip lines curve around the structure, so you can soar through the air like a bird.

#### **ZOORASSIC PARK**

Families or other large groups can bring picnic lunches to the shelters, located outside the zoo, or pick up something to eat at one of the restaurants located in the zoo.

# LEILA Arboretum

Drive past Leila Arboretum and you will be hailed by the mighty centaur. He's raising a sword, but don't worry – he just wants you to stop by the park and enjoy all of the nature, history, horticulture and art it has to offer.

## **FANTASY FOREST**

Get an up-close look at the centaur. He lives in Fantasy Forest, a field of artwork that was carved from disaster. After a beetle called the emerald ash borer destroyed trees near the entrance, artists were invited to carve up the trunks into fantastical sculptures. Find wizards, creatures and a UFO in the garden. Take a shot for Instagram while sitting in the monster mouth or on the tree swing.

## **KALEIDOSCOPE GARDEN**

Follow the side road from Fantasy Forest to the Kaleidoscope Garden. The enclosed garden is educational for kids and adults alike. Learn how to grow plants you can eat or check out the many, many varieties of daylilies. None of it would be possible without bees, though. That's why, rising above the garden, is the Bee-Loon sculpture. It shows the different kinds of bees and their life cycle. How sweet!

## WALKING PATHS

Explore the arboretum's walking paths, which meander through the park. You'll find treasures such as a native flower garden, metallic sculptures, perennial garden and groves of evergreen trees. If you're looking for more brisk exercise, the one-mile paved road makes a loop from the entrance. After your walk, take a rest by the fountain and enjoy a cool mist on a hot summer day.

#### **DISC GOLF**

For a unique way to explore the arboretum, follow the disc golf course. Bring a disc and test your skill at 18 holes. The course takes advantage of the arboretum's rolling hills and shaded groves. You'll start out by the sumac trees and end on Fragrant Hill.

#### **FRAGRANT HILL**

This part of the park received its name from the magnolia, dogwood and other flowering trees that have been planted around the hill. When they bloom in spring, it's like clouds of blossoms are floating along the hill. It's also the highest point of the arboretum, so you get a great view, no matter the season. The pavilion at the top of the hill is available for event rental.

Underground Railroad Monument

If history is your jam, then Calhoun County is the place for you. We are rich in people and stories. From the bravery of Sojourner Truth to the lawlessness of the Purple Gang, here are some of the places that honor the past.

#### **INNOVATORS**

#### **Early Industry**

The waterfall at Mill Race Park in Battle Creek creates a pretty backdrop for photos, but it's also a reminder of why a city is here in the first place.

People have always built around waterways, and Battle Creek was no different. The convergence of two rivers attracted government surveyors. They were working near the water when two Potawatomi natives came to ask for food. The surveyors argued and sent them away and made a note of the encounter by simply writing "Battle Creek" on the map they were making.

It was land speculator Sands McCamly who bought the water rights and built a millrace between the rivers. Like an early version of a generator, the millrace provided power for businesses in the village. Battle Creek became an industrial city and shipped out farming equipment, printing presses, bicycles, cigars and more. "I prescribed zwieback for an old lady, and she broke her false teeth on it. She demanded that I pay her ten dollars for her false teeth. I began to think that we ought to have a ready-cooked food which would not break people's teeth. I puzzled over that a good deal." — Dr. J.H. Kellogg

#### **Adventist History**

Ellen White was a prophet and leader for the Seventh-day Adventists. She and her family moved to Battle Creek in 1855 and ten years later, she shared a Christmas Day vision: The Adventists should create a health institute.

Adventists were ahead of their time in promoting exercise, fresh air and plant-based diets for health. In 1866, the Western Health Reform Institute opened and grew into the Battle Creek Sanitarium, run by Dr. Kellogg. It attracted people from all over the world.

#### **Invention of Cereal**

Battle Creek is the Cereal City and that's because of two brothers who didn't clean up their mess in the kitchen.

Dr. J.H. Kellogg and W.K. Kellogg were cooking with wheat when they had to abandon it before the process was finished. They left the wheat mixture out, so it was stale by the time they returned.

Hoping it would still make dough, they ran the wheat through rollers: what came out was thin flakes. Once cooked, the flakes became cereal. In 1898, wheat was traded for a new ingredient and Kellogg's Corn Flakes were born.

C.W. Post started his own health food company. The first thing it sold was Postum, a caffeinefree coffee substitute. He then branched into Post Grape Nuts and a flake cereal that was eventually called Post Toasties.

The food innovation caught on quickly. In the early 1900s, there were more than 100 cereal companies in Battle Creek. Nowadays, it's back to the first two: Kellogg Company and Post Consumer Brands.

#### **RISK TAKERS**

#### **The Purple Gang**

The Purple Gang were the most merciless crooks in Detroit during Prohibition. When someone made even Al Capone nervous, then you know they had a tough reputation.

It's suspected the gang was part of the Valentine's Day Massacre. In 1945, the gang's leader and his brother were convicted for the murder of Senator Warren G. Hooper.

Albion was a convenient meeting point for smuggling booze from Detroit to Chicago. When alcohol became legal in 1933, the Purple Gang ran a very efficient bank-robbing operation from an Albion junkyard. There was even a custom-built bulletproof car.





#### RESILIENCE

#### **Underground Railroad**

Calhoun County was a hub for African Americans who were escaping slavery.

Adam Crosswhite and his family had settled to live in Marshall, until one night, when slave catchers arrived to kidnap them. The city's residents arrested the men, and the family was able to escape to Canada.

The Federal Court was not happy and fined the citizens. This was one of the deeds that led to the Fugitive Slave Act of 1850, which said African Americans were not people in the eyes of the law, and they should be treated as property even if they managed to free themselves from enslavement.

Crosswhite returned to Marshall after the Civil War and you can find his grave at Oakridge Cemetery.

Sarah and Erastus Hussey were conductors on the Underground Railroad in Battle Creek. The Quaker store-owners helped an estimated 1,000 people find freedom. Erastus became a state senator and in 1854 he wrote and passed the Personal Liberty Law. It made it illegal to capture people in Michigan and take them back to slavery. Then, what happened to the Crosswhites and many other African Americans who thought they had found safety was no longer legal.

#### **SOJOURNER TRUTH**

Sojourner Truth was a woman of extraordinary abilities. She escaped slavery in her 30s, but had to leave most of her family behind. When her son was illegally sold to a plantation in Alabama from New York, Truth found a lawyer and successfully sued for the freedom of her son. She was the first Black woman to win against a white man in court.

In her 40s, she started speaking out in public for equal rights. She chose the name "Sojourner Truth" for herself. She used her words to fight for abolition and women's suffrage. Her autobiography, dictated to a writer because Truth had never learned to read or write, was a bestseller.

It was the 1850s when Truth joined her daughters in Battle Creek. The next decade would bring a Civil War and then the work of helping African Americans find employment after emancipation.

Truth returned to Battle Creek and died in 1883. She's buried in Oak Hill Cemetery.

"Look at me! Look at my arm! I have ploughed and planted, and gathered into barns, and no man could head me! And ain't I a woman? I could work as much and eat as much as man – when I could get it – and bear the lash as well! And ain't I a woman? I have borne five children, and seen most all sold off to slavery, and when I cried out with my mother's grief, none but Jesus heard me! And ain't I a woman?"







Feel the beat of the Caribbean as soon as you walk into **Island Style BBQ.** With music and spicy smells in the air, Island Style serves flavors inspired by Haiti, Guyana and American soul food. The homemade jerk sauce is a must-try with whatever you order.

**Free Range Pancake House** serves olive oil straight from the Balkan Peninsula. The owner receives bottles of it from his family's farm in Greece. You'll find it in many of the dishes, such as the Olympus salad, the olive tapenade pita and the Sparta power bowl (pancakes are olive-free).

**Lopez Taco** has been serving authentic Mexican food in Albion since 1975. See why it's been a favorite for locals and college students for such a long time. You really can't go wrong with a crunchy taco and a fruity Jarritos soft drink.

"We got a lot of feedback from customers inquiring about if we were going to have food. It was our plan to have light pastries, maybe a bagel, nothing too crazy. But obviously the market was demanding more Also, be sure not to miss the of a lunch spot," Tristan said.

Sensing a void, they moved into a permanent location with a small kitchen and considered what kind of cuisine to add to the area.

It had to be fresh, to be shareable and to be available for customers on the go.

#### FIND A SYMPHONY OF FIND A SYMPHO

Chris McCleary plays with flavor the way a concert pianist plays piano. At Handmap Brewing Co., you'll find a wide range of flavors in the beers, seltzers and ciders – everything from a light golden ale to a barrel-aged imperial stout with cherries, toasted coconut and cinnamon.

Flavors can be smoky, citrusy or tart. The popular beers are made with blood orange, cherry or raspberry although a juicy plum kettle-sour brew is creating a splash right now.

There are no shortcuts. All of the fruit comes from Coloma, Michigan. "We don't use any extracts or essences in the beer," McCleary said. The flavor mixture people around Battle Creek like is the Two-can. It plays on the area's cereal history by flavoring an IPA with Froot Loops. When they brew it, there's a sweet, hoppy smell around the building – which is only a block away from Kellogg's World Headquarters.

While at Handmap, you should try the OTIS. It's a beer that can appeal even to wine lovers. McCleary made it with a buddy and former co-worker. They dreamed of a brew that used all of their knowledge and memories from working together at Goose Island.

# TAKE A TACO TOUR IN CALHOUN COUNTY

Calhoun County has some of the best Mexican food in West Michigan. If you don't believe us, check out these spots that are the talk of (or "taco") the town.

Start in Battle Creek, where you'll find authentic flavors. Some restaurants are so popular, they've opened two locations. You can find La Cocina on Beckley Road and West Columbia Avenue. While there are tacos a la carte for Taco Tuesday, go crazy with sizzling fajitas. Or try a favorite from California: Carne asada fries.

The original **San Francisco Taqueria** on Capital Avenue serves up classic street snacks along with some great tacos (the chicken tacos are our favorite). Grab Dorilokos (taco in a bag) or elote for an onthe-go treat. If you want something cool on a hot day, there's Mexican ice cream or the mangonada – it's made with sweet mango smoothie, fresh fruit, a drizzle of chili sauce and a candy-covered straw creating a taste combination unlike anything else. The second taqueria location on Columbia Avenue serves the same great tacos, along with a full-service bar. **Torti Taco** on Beckley Avenue has awardwinning tacos that get a lot of buzz. They recently expanded their repertoire with a downtown restaurant. More than tacos, the menu features culinary details like mole sauce, plantains, skirt steak and oysters. If you want to give them a run for the money, try the Torre de Mariscos, which is an artful tower of shrimp, tuna, octopus, avocado and cucumber with tortilla fresca sauce. When the weather is warm, they'll open up the walls so you can enjoy some chips and a signature cocktail while part of the summer nightlife.



Nina's Taqueria can also be found close to downtown Battle Creek. A longtime favorite for locals craving authentic Mexican food, the dining area received a remodeling during the pandemic. There was much cheering when they reopened. The cooks at Nina's are experts at the grill. There's also a delicious attention to detail. Even if you're only getting tacos, make sure to order refried beans and rice along with it. The flavor on the sides are more than an afterthought.

El Tajin in Marshall is known for its big portions and fresh flavor. Order your seafood tacos with a full order of nachos to share with the table. The nachos carbon are topped with three kinds of meat (steak, grilled chicken, chorizo) and covered in cheese dip. Accompany it with a sweet horchata.

Lopez Tacos is a longtime favorite for the people of Albion. There's nothing fancy going on here, just straight-up delicious tacos. If we had to guess why they turn out so good, it might be how the meat is perfectly seasoned and cooked. Or it could be that they're liberal with the cheese at Lopez Tacos. Either way, end your taco tour with a classic.

#### **EXPRESS YOURSELF**

Looking to try something new? **Glass Act** in Marshall offers classes in soldering and fusing. Make an appointment with artist and store owner Victor Terrasi for an introductory class – the price covers the materials for a project that can be made in one trip. Working with colored glass is actually pretty simple and you get a cool personalized souvenir to take home.

For a project that's as photogenic as it is creative, follow **Dew Drop Fresh Designs**. The collaboration between The Big Bloom and Marygold Meadows provides access to two big flower gardens in Battle Creek and Bellevue. Snip & Sip events are a chance to go beyond the canvas. From flower crowns to professionallooking bouquets, you can create floral art while being served cocktails and mocktails in a summer garden.

#### **STROLL THE GALLERY**

Appreciate the acumen of **EastEnd Studio and Gallery** in Marshall. They host a rotating show of artists curated from Michigan. There's a variety of mediums and something for everyone's price range. While paintings and photography are popular, there's also art you can use in your everyday life, such as pottery and glass.

Art Center of Battle Creek

For a spotlight on local work, check out the **Art Center of Battle Creek**. Exhibits change throughout the year. One of our favorite annual events is when kids get a chance to display their best work for Class Act. It's an exhibit that can inspire the entire family.

#### **GO TO CENTER STAGE**

Magic is the art of illusion, and some of the greatest artists are celebrated at the **American Museum of Magic** in Marshall. Learn how magicians have used perspective, design and theatricality to amaze audiences for centuries. One of the highlights is the collection of show posters that can be both beautiful and bizarre. Or if you check the schedule on the museum website, you can catch a magic act on the stage!

#### Speaking of stages, **Franke Center for the**


**Arts** is the best music venue in the county. It was once a church before being converted to a performing arts center. They've developed an impressive roster of acts, with an emphasis on Americana and blues music. Sometimes it even spills into the street of Marshall, like with the Mandolin Festival or the Ice, Wine & Blues event.

Once upon a time, the **Bohm Theatre** was a movie palace where the Purple Gang would meet in Albion. While it still shows weekend movies, the Bohm has also developed a strong open mic scene. Every month, Blues at the Bohm invites a band to play, followed by a jam session. Located halfway between Chicago and Detroit, it's a convenient spot for musicians to gather and perform.













# FOLLOW THE RIVER

The sparkle of sunshine, the smell of growing things, the burble of water as it flows on by – we love a day by the river.

Calhoun County has numerous river trails, so you can hike, ride a bike or find a boat launch just about anywhere.

**Ceresco Green** is one of the best spots to start your kayak trip. We recommend launching here and ending at Paddlers Grove for a trip that lasts about 3.5 hours. It's a peaceful stretch of the Kalamazoo River and you'll see lots of wildlife. Just be warned: Both spots have parking lots that are uphill from the river.

Bring your bike to the **BC Linear Park**. It has 26 miles of paved trail through Battle Creek. You can walk from Bailey Park all the way to Leila Arboretum, and much of it goes alongside the Kalamazoo river.

The trail's proximity to water means you'll find boat launches on Jackson Street West and at Verona Dam, near Bailey Park. Instead of biking, you can paddle your way downtown from there. The downtown part of the Battle Creek river is unique, because you'll head through the urban area of Battle Creek, paddling past murals, the old train station and Kellogg World Headquarters.


One of the best stretches for a walk also goes through downtown Battle Creek. Start at South Washington Avenue, then follow the Battle Creek River past Kellogg World Headquarters, the Math and Science Center, and then loop back to the Kellogg House gardens and stop at the Underground Railroad Statue on Division Street North. That's about a mile of walking.


**The Calhoun County Trailway** is a 5.6-mile stretch in Battle Creek, from Ott Biological Preserve to Historic Bridge Park. The trail takes you along the river and into the woods. Keep an eye out for wildflowers and frogs. **Historic Bridge Park** sits on the banks of the Kalamazoo River, where old truss bridges have been relocated and restored. It's one of the most popular places to take photos in Battle Creek. There's also a playground and kayak launch. During the summer, there's a constant flow of people getting on and off the river. Innertubes are just as popular as kayaks.

**Marshall's Riverwalk** has some lovely overlooks. The 1.6-mile boardwalk runs alongside a paved biking path following both Rice Creek and the Kalamazoo River. Keep an eye out for the South Marshall Dam waterfall and a Chinese pagoda. At Stuart's Landing there is a fishing dock and boat launch onto the Kalamazoo River.

Not too far from the Riverwalk is a mountain bike trail called **The Dump**. Experienced bikers will love the challenge.

Albion has more city parks per capita than any other city in America. **The Albion River Trail** will take you by three of them, starting with Victory Park and ending near Lloyd Park. It's 1.6 miles of paved pathway along the Kalamazoo River.





Turn left, and you'll be on the main street for downtown. Turn right on the pedestrian bridge by the farmers market and you'll be at the Porter Street canoe dock.

Albion locals like to use a spot at the end of Brownswood Drive, which is also near the Albion River Trail. From there you can paddle all the way to Marengo Township.

The Iron Belle Trail will one day weave across the state of Michigan, and then the Albion River Trail will be connected to the **Homer Bike Path**. The bike path is about two miles long – it's wide and paved to make it easy for bicycles and hikers. You'll find parking at Grist Mill Park. The Grist Mill is also the spot to put in your kayak if you want to head towards Albion on the Kalamazoo River.




## Full Blast





From its remarkable ceiling and wall paintings that depict ornate patterns and floral vistas, to the spiraling bridal staircase that leads to an observation deck, the interior of this unique Victorian home is an eclectic feast of varying styles.
