

Board Notes

The December board meeting addressed several issues. Karen French reported that the response to the annual appeal letter has been good. In her Office Manager's report, Jen Dixon noted that use of eBooks has been increasing appreciably during the pandemic. Claire Landrum reported that participation in Door Side Service and Limited Browsing continues to increase.

Phyllis Bernt announced that the upcoming NW Authors Speaker Series event on January 23 will be using a new technological approach: zoom-to-Facebook LIVE. A couple of members of the NW Authors committee will establish a zoom meeting with the author; this meeting will be broadcast to Facebook LIVE in real time. Viewers will use Facebook LIVE to access the presentation and ask questions if they wish to. This approach avoids some of the logistical problems posed by Zoom.

We won't be able to have the annual Rare and Old Book Sale in May. Jen proposed that we explore the possibility of using a free online auction site like OneCause to do an online auction instead. She and Linda Sugano will look into this possibility.

All indications are that we will be unable to have membership meetings this spring. This means that once again we won't be able to have a regular election during a May meeting. Board members discussed alternatives, looking for an approach that reflects the process outlined in our bylaws as much as possible. The board voted to conduct an election by mail, using the slate put forward by the Nominating Committee which has not yet been voted on because of the pandemic, and incorporating a call for nominations.
