Please Return Your Library Books

To avoid being inundated by hundreds of returned books when we reopen the Library, we encourage you to drop your Library books in the book drop at the front of the Library. We will process and disinfect all returned books before we shelve them, so they will be safe to be checked out again. **There will be no overdue fines.**

Board Notes

Both the April and May board meetings focused on when and how the Library will reopen. It was the consensus of the board that, because our volunteers are in a group that is vulnerable to COVID-19, we need to be especially cautious in reopening. The board decided that the Library will not consider reopening for regular Library services until Clatsop County is approved for Phase 3 of the Governor's reopening framework.

When the Library reopens, masks will be required of volunteers and patrons; patrons will be asked to use hand sanitizer that will be provided; and there will be a limit on number of patrons using the Library at any one time. A sneeze guard will be purchased for the circulation desk to protect Desk Volunteers.

The board voted to cancel this year's Fourth of July Book Sale. Book donations will still be solicited for future sales and the Book Sale Room.

While the Library is closed, we will rearrange the Library and the office to facilitate social distancing. We will also repaint the office, storeroom, and back hallway. Karen French will get bids from local painters.

Patrons will be encouraged to return their library books, using the book drop, so that we can gradually process and shelve them in advance of reopening. No Library fines will be assessed.

When We Reopen



Out of an abundance of caution, the Library will not reopen for regular Library services until Clatsop County is approved for Phase 3 under the Governor's reopening framework. We wish to assure the safety of Library volunteers and

patrons, many of whom are in a group that is at greater risk from COVID-19.

When the Library is reopened for regular services, patrons will be required to wear face coverings, use hand sanitizer, and observe social distancing. There will be a limit on how many patrons will be able to use the Library at any one time.

Book Donations Still Needed

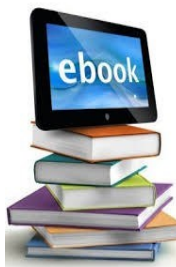
Because of the coronavirus pandemic, this year's Fourth of July Book Sale is unfortunately cancelled. But your book donations are still needed.

Don't Forget eBooks



A lot of our patrons are taking advantage of ebooks while the library is closed. This service is included with your annual library card, and includes thousands of titles for adults, YA, children, and audiobooks. Your 4-digit patron number is your login and password. Don't know your patron number? Contact Jen Dixon, our office manager, and she will get it to you asap. She also suggests downloading the Libby app,

which has a very user-friendly interface and makes searching for titles easy.

Disinfecting Books



We want to make sure our books are virus free, so we are monitoring research that is being done by the Battelle research institute in partnership with OCLC (the organization that maintains the huge WorldCat database of library collections) and the Institute of Museum and Library Services. This research project is named REALM (REopening Archives, Libraries, and Museums); it is examining how long the COVID-19 virus lives on Library materials. Hardback and paperback books are being infected with the COVID virus and examined after 1, 2, 4, and 6 days to see when the books are virus free.

The results of the REALM project will help us be sure we are handling our books in a manner that is safe for Library volunteers and patrons.

WiFi Available

The Library's free WIFI is still available 24/7 for anyone who has their own device. It can usually be accessed from the benches on the west, north and east sides of the Library or from the parking lot. You don't need a password; just connect to "CB Library."



Summer Reading Program



We had some fun, interactive, and hands-on programs planned for our young readers this year, which now won't be feasible due to COVID 19. We are currently brainstorming some ideas to engage our young readers, which may be posted

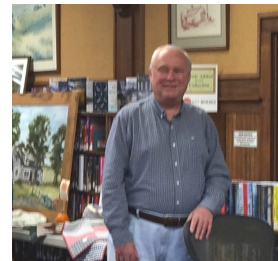
Volunteer Spotlight
