

## **Board Notes**

Several issues were addressed at the August board meeting. Claire Landrum reported on the Door -Side Service program, which is growing slowly. The board agreed to double the number of items a patron can request. Patrons will be able to request 8 adult books, or 4 DVDs, or 8 children's books.

The board discussed the possibility of allowing browsing by one patron at a time by appointment. Claire will ask the Desk Volunteers if they are interested in providing such a service. Phyllis will investigate the precautions that are being taken by Seaside Library, which does allow browsing

The Follett system sends out overdue notices on Sunday mornings. Since returned books are quarantined for 4 days, that means patrons are sometimes getting overdue notices on books that have been returned. The board decided to stop sending overdue notices at this time.

Phyllis reported that the first NW Author Speaker series Facebook Live event on August 22 was a success. About 18 people watched the live event and over 200 people have watched the recorded version, which is available for viewing on the Library's website and the Library's Facebook page.

The next NW Author Speaker Series event is scheduled for September 19. It will be provided over Zoom, which will give us experience with that platform. Paula Butterfield will discuss her fictional biography of painter Berthe Morisot. Apricot Irving is scheduled for October 10 and Karl Marlantes for November 28.

Membership renewals were discussed. In September, Karen French will compile this year's membership directory. The board discussed plans for this year's annual appeal letter. This year's appeal letter will be especially important since we haven't been able to do any fundraisers.

On a housekeeping note, the board reviewed the list of people who have been issued keys to the Library, and also reviewed the list of books that have been overdue since the Library closed. Board members were reminded to report their volunteer hours.

# **Cannon Beach Reads Returns**

Cannon Beach Reads is going virtual! Because of the COVID pandemic, Cannon Beach Reads has not been able to meet since February.

Using the Zoom videoconferencing software may not make it possible to share coffee and cookies, but it will provide Cannon Beach Reads partici-



pants a chance to discuss some engaging literature and to "see" one another again. The book that will be discussed at this first Zoom Cannon Beach Reads meeting on Wednesday evening, September 16, will be *Mozart's Starling*, by Lyanda Lynn Haupt.

Intrigued by the fact that Mozart had a pet starling during three of his most musically productive years, Haupt decided that the best way for her to explore the impact of the pet bird on Mozart's life and music was to adopt her own starling, whom she named Carmen. Haupt intertwines her experiences in raising, training, and nurturing Carmen with stories of Mozart's family life and professional experiences. In the process she provides insights about the creative process and the relationship between humans and birds.

Haupt is an ornithologist and naturalist. In addition to being a nature writer, she has worked as a seabird researcher and in a raptor rehabilitation program. In 2002 she won the Washington State Book Award. Reviewers have described *Mozart's Starling* as a "hard-to-put-down, charming blend of science, biography, and memoir."

Cannon Beach Reads plans to meet via Zoom videoconferencing on the third Wednesday of each month at 7 p.m. until in-person meetings are possible again. New members are always welcome. If you are interested in participating, contact Cannon Beach Reads coordinator Joseph Bernt at berntj@ohio.edu.
