Cape Cod is accessible from virtually anywhere in the world, whether you're traveling by air, bus, train or car. The Cape is just 75 miles from Logan Airport in Boston, Massachusetts and T.F. Green Airport in Providence, Rhode Island.

Car rentals, rideshare/taxi transportation and bus service are available at both major airports. Ferry and train service from Boston is another popular option for getting here.

Cape Cod Gateway Airport, located in the hub of the Cape, offers scheduled flights between New York, Boston, the islands of Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket, and other points of interest.
