



The Finest Hours

"The Finest Hours" is the remarkable true story of the greatest small boat rescue in Coast Guard history. On February 18, 1952, a massive nor'easter struck New England, pummeling towns along the Eastern seaboard and wreaking havoc on the ships caught in its deadly path, including the SS Pendleton, a T-2 oil tanker bound for Boston, which was literally ripped in half, trapping more than 30 sailors inside its rapidly-sinking stern.

As word of the disaster reached the U.S. Coast Guard station in Chatham, Massachusetts, a daring operation to rescue the stranded men was ordered. Despite overwhelming odds, four men, led by Coast Guard Captain Bernie Webber, set out in a wooden lifeboat with an ill-equipped engine and little, if any, means of navigation, facing frigid temperatures, 60-foot high waves and hurricane-force winds.

In 2016, Walt Disney Pictures released "The Finest Hours," directed by Craig Gillespie and starring: Chris Pine; Casey Affleck; Ben Foster; Holliday Grainger; John Ortiz; and Eric Bana. Produced by Jim Whitaker and Massachusetts local Dorothy Aufiero, the film is based on the acclaimed non-fiction book of the same name by Massachusetts' authors Casey Sherman and Michael J. Tougas.

Coast Guard Rescue Boat: The CG36500

Motor Life Boat CG 36500, famous for its role in saving 31 men from the ill-fated tanker Pendleton off of Chatham in 1952, is the only operating survivor of its type on the East Coast and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Orleans Historical Society acquired the boat in 1981, and it has been carefully rebuilt and maintained by many dedicated volunteers.
