Pedro Azagra Blázquez
Chief Executive Officer, AVANGRID

Pedro was appointed to the position of CEO in May 2022. Pedro has served as a member of the AVANGRID Board of Directors since 2019, and previously served as a member of the Board of Directors from 2014 to 2018.

Pedro formerly served as the Chief Development Officer for Iberdrola, where he executed more than 100 transactions and led the international expansion of Iberdrola. Pedro has a degree in Law and Business Administration from the Instituto Católico de Administración y Dirección de Empresas (ICADE) at the Universidad Pontificia de Comillas in Madrid, and an MBA from the University of Chicago.



Captain Michael R. Burns Jr

Executive Director of Maritime Center for Responsible Energy, Massachusetts

Capt. Michael Burns currently serves as the Executive Director of the Maritime Center for Responsible Energy (MCRE) where he is involved in the development and delivery of a variety of training programs for workers in the maritime and offshore wind industries. Capt. Burns is a senior level deck officer with significant shipboard, management level experience. He is also an experienced professional maritime education administrator, and an approved instructor for several US Coast Guard and offshore wind training programs. He is a US Naval Reserve Officer as well as a part time instructor at the Naval Surface Warfare Officer School in Newport RI. Capt. Burns earned a BS in Marine Transportation and a MS in Emergency Management from MMA, and holds a USCG Master's license of unlimited tonnage. He is a Trustee of the Boston Marine Society and an Associate Fellow of the Nautical Institute in London.



Aubrey Church
Policy Manager, Cape Cod Commercial Fishermen's Alliance

Aubrey has spent the entirety of her career working closely with the fishing industry. Before joining the Fishermen's Alliance in 2023, she was a Research Biologist for seven years with the Commercial Fisheries Research Foundation (CFRF), a nonprofit private research foundation based in Rhode Island. There, she managed the Lobster and Jonah Crab Research fleet, and a gillnet preconstruction fisheries monitoring survey for winter skate and monkfish in the South Fork Wind Farm area.

In 2022, Aubrey earned her Professional Science Master's degree from UMass Dartmouth's School for Marine Science and Technology (SMAST). Aubrey also has prior experience as an at-sea monitor and northeast fisheries observer for NOAA, from 2011 to 2013, and was involved in several research endeavors, including working with artisanal spear fishermen in Turks and Caicos.



Mark S. Ells Town Manager, Town of Barnstable

Mark Ells has served as the Town Manager in Barnstable, MA since 2016 and has served as a manager in the Town of Barnstable for 33 years. Prior to working in municipal government, he worked as an engineering consultant, and he has served as adjunct faculty at Cape Cod Community College since 2001.
