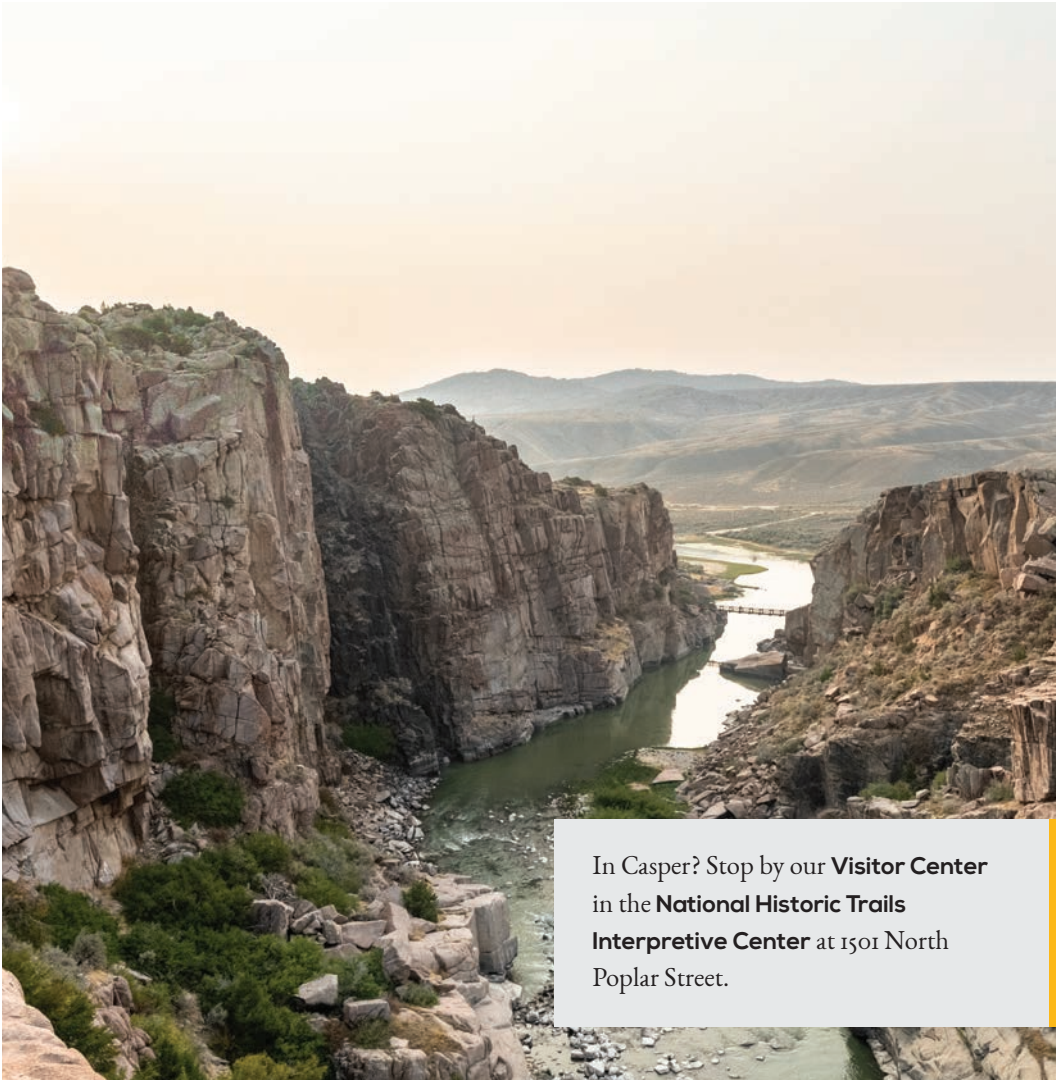

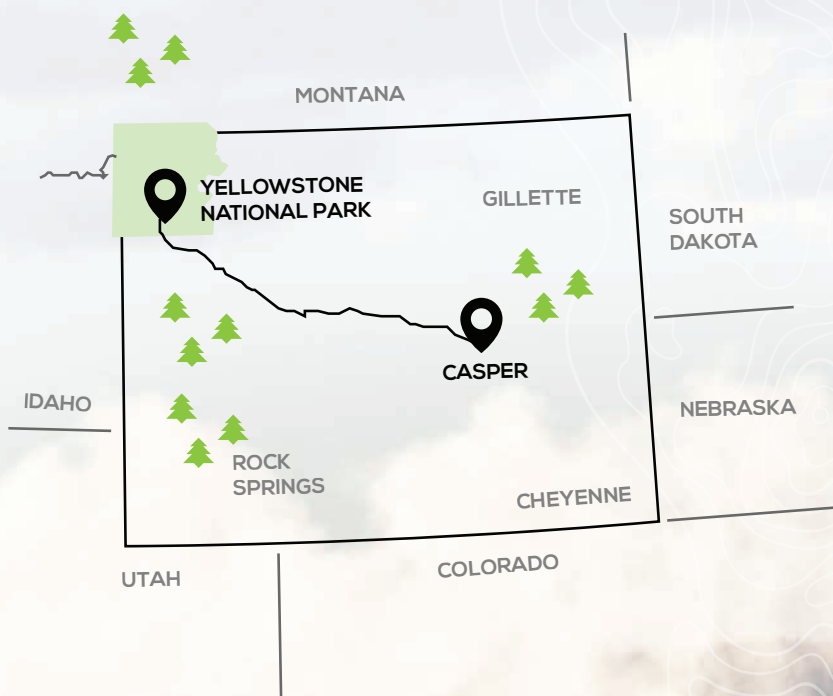

COFFEE, COCKTAILS, & CRAFT BEER



A trip to Casper isn't complete without indulging in our local craft culture. Whether you prefer beer, cocktails or coffee, you're never far from your next delicious craft drink in Casper.

Coffee

With enough coffee shops to fuel a city much larger than its size, Casper's coffee scene will delight you. Highlights include: **Metro Coffee Company**, a downtown Casper staple that's conveniently located right across the street from David Street Station and often hosts open mic nights; **Grant Street Grocery and Market**, a craft coffee lover's dream destination; **Scarlow's Art & Coffee**, a classy coffee shop with a constant rotation of modern art displays; or **The Bourgeois Pig**, a cozy coffee shop and ideal place to relax while sipping on one of their iconic cortado's. If you think the list ends there, you would be wrong. Casper's list of amazing coffee shops goes on with other local favorites such as **Blue Ridge Coffee**, **Melrose Coffee House** and **Wind City Books**, which is the perfect place to enjoy your dose of caffeine while browsing for a new read.



Cocktails

No matter where you go for a drink in Wyoming, a **Backwards Distilling Company** creation will most likely be on the menu. With an impressive line-up of craft spirits made right here in Casper, Backwards' popularity is well-deserved. Stop by their downtown tasting room for a locally-made seasonal cocktail that is as delicious as it is Instagram-worthy.

Another happy hour favorite is **Vintage Fine Wine & Martini Bar**. Vintage serves high-end cocktails, glasses of fine wine, local microbrews and one of the largest selections of whiskey in the area. We also strongly suggest stopping into **Urban Bottle** to taste whichever uniquely-crafted cocktail they happen to be offering that night, or to simply browse through their extensive selection of craft beer and specialty wines.



Craft Beer

Casper’s brewing scene is on the rise as we welcomed two new breweies this year, **Oil City Beer Company** and **Mountain Hops Brew House**. Oil City Beer Company has quickly become a popular destination for cornhole players and Mountain Hops Brewhouse often partners with delicious local food trucks, which makes both an ideal spot to enjoy a taste of Casper. The new breweries join the ranks of the city’s existing establishments: Gruner Brothers Brewing, Skull Tree Brewing and Frontier Brewing Company. Each of the five offer their own unique flavors and atmospheres, so your next trip to Casper must include a visit to each.

- 1.5 oz Milk Can Cinnamon Moonshine
- 0.75 oz fresh lemon juice
- 0.75 oz blackberry simple syrup

Instructions

First, combine the Milk Can Cinnamon Moonshine and your .75 ounces of lemon juice into a shaker with ice.

Shake until chilled.

Then, strain the shaken liquid into a rocks glass filled with crushed ice.

Next, add the .75 ounces of blackberry syrup on top.

Finally, garnish your perfectly crafted cocktail with mint sprig.

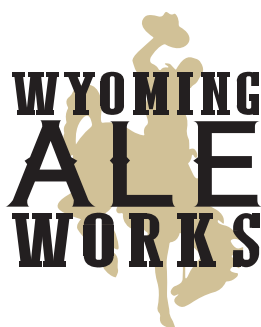

5 REASONS YOU CAN'T MISS DOWNTOWN CASPER



Art 321



The rumors are true: downtown Casper is *thriving*. A gem for locals and visitors alike, downtown is where early history meets the hustle and bustle of our modern city. Walk the historic streets, window shop, grab a drink or bite to eat and take in live music. From free events in our year-round outdoor plaza to specialty crafted local cocktails and craft brews, there's something for everyone in downtown Casper.

Living History

01 / Casper's earliest history happened in the streets of what is now downtown. As the city became more modern in the late 1800s, the center of town was Center and First streets, just as it is today. This means that a lot of life, business and history has been played out on these streets and in the historic buildings that line them. Many of the buildings you see today were built in the early 1900s. Stop by the Visitor Center and pick up a self-guided walking tour map to discover downtown's history up close.

02 / David Street Station

One of Casper's newest attractions is **David Street Station**, where there is always something happening. This versatile gathering space hosts hundreds of events year-round including live music, festivals and farmers markets, a splash pad in the summer months and an ice rink in the winter. The cherry on top of this already-sweet venue: admission to events is always free.

03 / Experience Casper's Artistic Side

Well known for outdoor recreation and wild west history, Casper also has a surprisingly vibrant and active arts scene, and there's no better place to experience it than downtown. You'll find iconic institutions like the **Nicolaysen Art Museum** and **Art 321**, as well as countless displays of public art like murals, sculptures and small galleries like **Scarlow's Art & Coffee** that tell local stories through visual arts. One of the highlights of the art scene in Casper is the monthly **Art Walk** held on the first Thursday of the month, May - September. The event invites local artists, musicians and creators to partner with downtown businesses for an inspiring walking tour.

04 / Indulge in Casper's Culinary Scene

No matter what you're craving, you can find it downtown. With several new restaurants popping up alongside longtime staples, you won't go hungry. Fuel up on made-from-scratch cuisine at the **Yellowstone Garage**. A 1920s gas station converted into a hip and cozy space, this bar, restaurant and music venue is now a cornerstone downtown. If you're in the mood for something sweet, local favorite **Frosted Tops** makes homemade macaroons, cupcakes and cinnamon rolls. They also serve fresh acai bowls and smoothies with real fruit. If it's time for happy hour, stop by **Urban Bottle Wine & Spirits**, a hip liquor store and tasting room that often hosts live music, food pairing classes and other events.

05 / Local Shopping

Casper's downtown is home to one-of-a-kind shopping. To fuel your walk, grab a coffee from **The Bourgeois Pig**. Then peruse boutiques like **Floral Rhino** and **Cadillac Cowgirl**, or gear up at the legendary **Ugly Bug Fly Shop**. Take home something handcrafted from **307 Metal Works** or locally made products at **WyoMade**. You're sure to find a perfect gift, souvenir or something you didn't even know you needed.



EXPERIENCE CASPER'S ART SCENE

For the past few years, Casper's art scene has been described by many as up-and-coming, but with a world-class art museum, newly installed sculptures along some of our best walking trails and a downtown now filled with murals, our art scene has officially arrived and deserves your attention. Leah Varela, president of the Casper Mural Project, says that the organization has been working diligently to infiltrate Casper's core with public art.

In late 2019, Varela and the Casper Mural Project finished work on one of the community's most recent murals, the James Reeb mural which honors the civil rights leader who called Casper home. After the successful completion of their first new art piece, the organization had to change their plans for new murals in 2020 when the COVID-19 pandemic hit.

"We came together to brainstorm a way to honor our community, create a sense of togetherness and thank our frontline workers. Thus, the "Better Together" mural was born. The meaning behind it is that we as a community were able to come together, support one another and build upon one another's strengths in an era of doom and gloom. We wanted something positive, bright, bold and beautiful, and I think we've accomplished that."



According to Varela, a handful of existing murals served as inspiration for the Casper Mural Project's mission. "We're fortunate to already have a handful of stunning murals right downtown that make for a lovely walking tour. You can begin at 225 S David St., where you'll see the Prairie Woman mural, continue down the alley to the James Reeb mural located on the backside of the building, right across the street in the parking garage you'll find the Fox Den mural, and if you cut through the alley and head to the Atrium Plaza at 201 E 2nd St., the Better Together mural is right there on the corner. This was our goal all along: a corridor of murals, a space that encourages people to get outside and explore while enjoying the history of our downtown."

Looking ahead, the Casper Mural Project plans to continue building on the already established collection of murals throughout the community. On the future of the group, Varela said, "We want to continue telling Wyoming stories and giving visitors a way to experience our history and culture through art."

National Historic Trails Interpretive Center

Prehistoric Wyoming

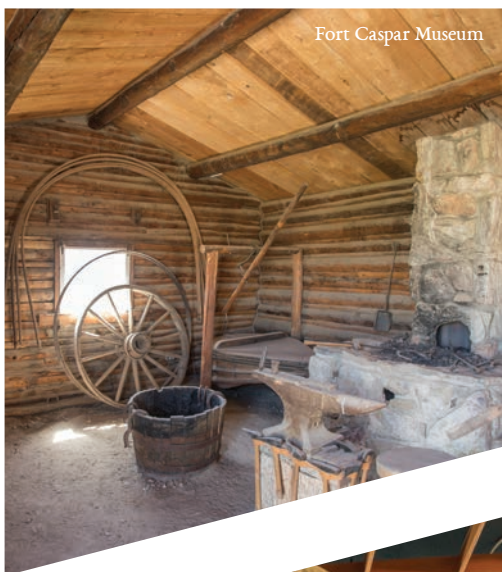
The area's amazing history predates humans by thousands of years. Start by discovering rich geological and prehistoric history at the **Tate Geological Museum** at Casper College. While you're there, sign up to go out in the field with the museum's paleontologists on the next dinosaur dig. You can also meet Dee – an 11,600-year-old Columbian mammoth – and 3,000 of his closest fossilized friends.

Westward Migration

When westward expansion began in the mid-1800s, Casper was a central hub for the nation's overland trails. The Oregon, California, Pony Express, Bozeman and Mormon trails all converged right here in Casper. More than half a million bold settlers made the grueling trek on these trails. Some carved their names into **Independence Rock**, an important historical landmark less than an hour from Casper off Highway 220. Learn about these early days of Casper at the world-class **National Historic Trails Interpretive Center**, **Fort Caspar Museum** and the **Mormon Handcart Visitors Center at Martin's Cove**.

The Oil City

Along the way, some pioneers stayed and put down roots. What began as a cluster of shacks grew into a small town of around 1,000 residents in the late 1800s. Casper's population grew by more than 600 percent in just 20 years following the boom of oil business that began around 1910. When oil was discovered in the nearby Salt Creek Field, Casper became known as the "Oil Capital of the Rockies," a reputation that stuck. Even today, the Casper area is home to some of the nation's most productive oil fields. The **Salt Creek Museum** in Midwest (44 miles from Casper) chronicles the field's activity, the workers, their families and communities from 1889 to today (by appointment only).



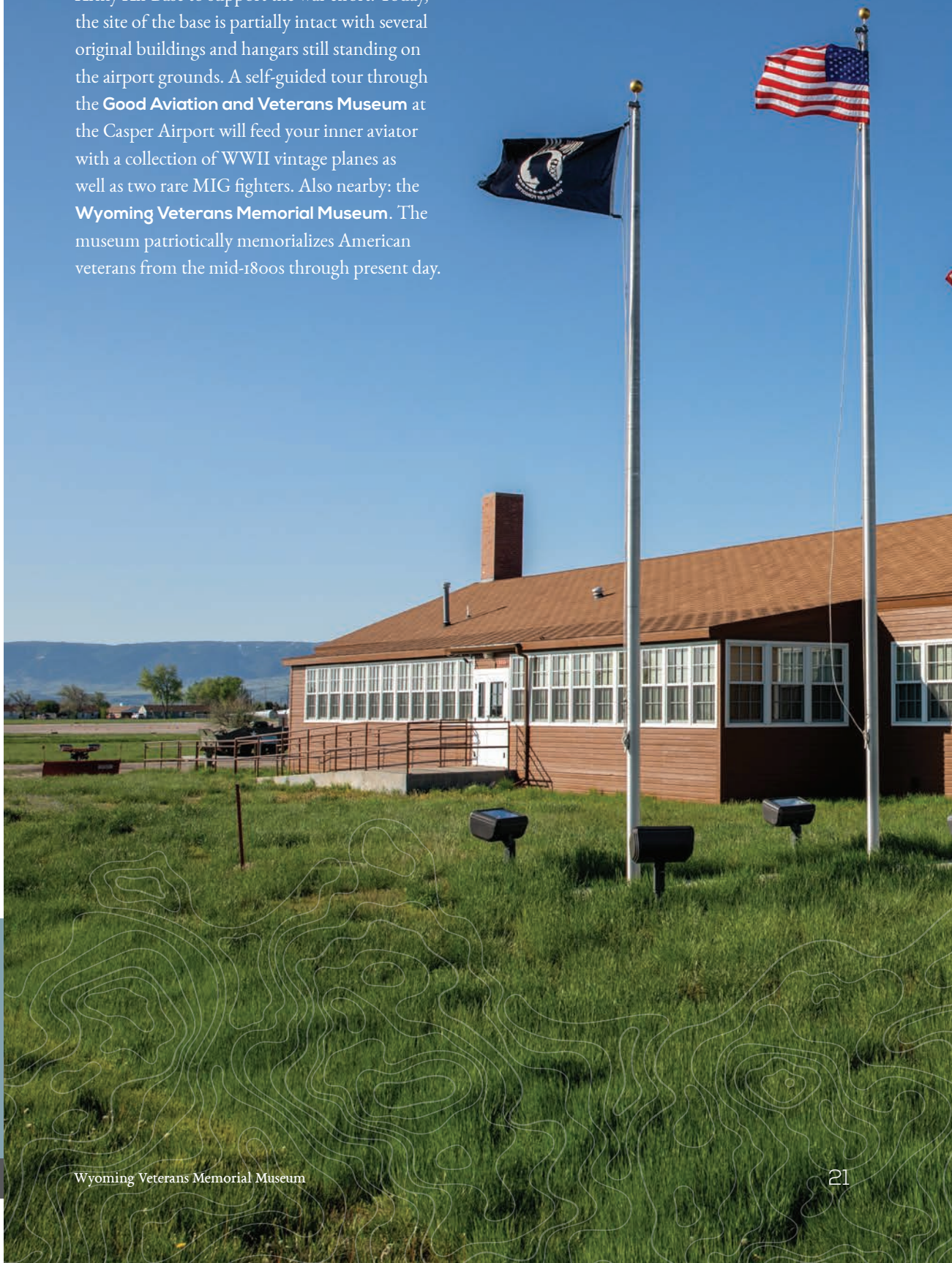

A WWII Military Hub

During World War II, Casper briefly served as an Army Air Base to support the war effort. Today, the site of the base is partially intact with several original buildings and hangars still standing on the airport grounds. A self-guided tour through the **Good Aviation and Veterans Museum** at the Casper Airport will feed your inner aviator with a collection of WWII vintage planes as well as two rare MIG fighters. Also nearby: the **Wyoming Veterans Memorial Museum**. The museum patriotically memorializes American veterans from the mid-1800s through present day.





SMALL TOWN, BIG CULTURE

Wyoming Symphony Orchestra

Casper is full of surprises and our creative scene is no exception. Casper offers residents and visitors a wide range of inspiring cultural outlets, the likes of which you wouldn't be surprised to find in a large metropolis. The arts have been a part of the fabric of the community for nearly 100 years. In 1924, the Casper Art Guild (now **ART 321**) was organized to promote the visual arts in the community and the artistic legacy of early Casperites lives on in the present day city. With countless opportunities to take in all kinds of live music, theatre and art, Casper's cultural landscape might just captivate you.

One of the best ways to take in the area's lively and varied art scene is at the monthly **Art Walk**. On the first Thursday of the month from May through September, downtown Casper comes alive with artisans and live music. Businesses, restaurants and museums in the downtown district host creators and makers of all types and open their doors to the community. It's a multi-block party of all things artistic in Casper.

Casper is the home of the renowned **Wyoming Symphony Orchestra**. Celebrating their 70th season in 2019-2020, the Wyoming Symphony Orchestra is comprised of the region's best musicians who are dedicated to their craft. The Wyoming Symphony also partners with the **Nicolaysen Art Museum** and local restaurants to host "Brunch and Bach", a morning event the day after the symphony (the first Sunday of the month, January - March) filled with amazing local art, music and, of course, brunch.

I started making pottery in a night class at Casper College and in 2016, I took a leap and converted part of my basement into a home studio. I didn't expect many people to be interested in buying my work, but the Casper community has been incredibly supportive and uplifting in a way that feels impactful to locals.

UNIQUE STYLE

Although much of the imagery and color in my work is familiar from this area (buffalo and bear, blues and greens, mountainscapes, etc.), I try to come up with work that I don't see anywhere else. The buffalo was an obvious way to start and, initially, was the only image I produced. Now, I have mugs that sport European mounts of elk and antelope, mountains carved out of the base of nearly every mug and phrases that feel are local and important.



WHY CASPER?

Life in Wyoming, and especially Casper, has greatly influenced my work. I have always loved the scenery here: the ever-present mountain backdrop, the colorful prairies filled with flowers and the wildlife, such as elk, antelope, buffalo and fish, can all be found throughout my work.

FISHING "THE MILE"

The Miracle Mile, or as locals call it— the Mile— has a reputation for amazing fly fishing. And it is well-deserved. With a near-even split of rainbow and brown trout, this famous stretch of the North Platte River boasts unlikely conditions that make for a fly-fishing perfect storm. With a huge variety of food sources for the trout, it's no wonder it hosts around 4,000 fish per mile, some of which grow up to 25-30 inches.

Fun fact: the Miracle Mile is actually longer than a mile. It can range anywhere from 5-8 miles, depending on water levels. Which means there's plenty of room to spread out from other anglers and catch your trophy trout.

MEET ADDIE DEES

Close your eyes and think of, “The West.” What do you see? While most might picture the classic American cowboy from a movie screen, it’s time for this image to be reimagined. Because today, the west, and especially Casper, is much more than that. Our grit, passion and dedication to hard work hasn’t changed, but the people who represent us have, and they’ve gotten stronger.

Meet one of the toughest fly-fishing guides in the West, Addie Dees. As a female in a male-dominated industry, Addie represents everything that Casper stands for. She’s not only a guide, but is also the manager of the **Ugly Bug Fly Shop**, making her an expert in what she does. Considering the North Platte River runs through the heart of our city making Casper one of the most popular fishing destinations in the West, we’re lucky to have her.

Q: Can you recall the moment you knew you wanted to pursue a career in fly-fishing?

I moved to Wyoming with my family when I was 10, and my dad has been the driving force behind my love for the outdoors. After spending years with him backpacking, kayaking and fly-fishing, I knew I needed a career in the great outdoors. In 2015, I took a fishing trip right here in Casper that was guided by a female and from that point on I wanted her job.

Q: Casper has become a bucket-list destination for fly-fishing, what do you believe makes this place so special?

One thing I always remind my clients while we are out on the water is to pick your head up and just look around, because when you come to Casper, you’re not only welcomed by our

trout-filled waters, but also by the beauty that surrounds you. A day out on the water isn’t just about fishing, it’s also filled with breathtaking scenery and lots of wildlife.

Q: Historically, your industry has been dominated by men. What has it been like being one of only a few female guides on the North Platte River?

Initially it was nerve-racking, I felt like I had something to prove to others and myself. Thankfully, I had a lot more support than I ever imagined I would, but that doesn’t mean that there aren’t plenty of naysayers. To those naysayers, I say absolutely nothing, I just put my head down, go to work and halfway through the trip they realize why I’m out there. It hasn’t always been easy, but it’s getting a lot easier and there’s plenty of room for more females out on the water.

Q: Can you talk about yours and Ugly Bug’s role in the Orvis 50/50 On The Water initiative and how you’ve been proactive in helping more females pursue their love of fly-fishing?

Since Orvis launched their 50/50 campaign in 2017 dedicated to getting more females out on the water, we’ve put a lot of focus on being extra welcoming to women in our shop and breaking the elitist culture that has been experienced in other fly shops around the country. This past summer we successfully launched “Ugly Bugs & Crazy Ladies”, a full-experience fly-fishing course for women where we teach casting, how to tie flies and go on a guided trip to put what they’ve learned to use.

SOAK UP SOME SUN ON THE WATER

There's more to Casper's rivers and lakes than just world-class fishing. At the heart of Casper is the **North Platte River**. Meandering 718 miles from its headwaters in Colorado to its confluence with the South Platte River in western Nebraska, the North Platte flows through Casper and Natrona County and provides abundant opportunities for a day well-spent. Float, canoe or kayak the North Platte for a serene and scenic trip down an iconic river.

Covering nearly 2,500 acres, **Alcova Reservoir** is one of the most popular recreational reservoirs in the region. Known for beautiful sunrises, abundant water recreation and fishing, Alcova Reservoir is one of the best places to spend a summer day. The reservoir's offerings include six campgrounds, eight boat ramps, an interpretive walking/hiking trail, fishing pier and more. Plus, the on-site Alcova Marina offers rentals, boating supplies, a convenience store, fuel and a full restaurant and bar.



Just down the road, you'll find **Pathfinder Reservoir**. With 117 miles of shoreline, Pathfinder Reservoir and its expansive waters are controlled by Pathfinder Dam. For a helping of local history, visit the Pathfinder Interpretive Center to learn about this engineering feat, one that has been in place since the early 1900s. For incredible views of the area, set out on the 1.7-mile-long interpretive trail near the dam. Additional amenities include campsites, a marina and restrooms. The reservoir is a great spot for camping, boating, fishing, hiking and birdwatching.

IT'S ALL HOME WATER: THE PEOPLE'S RIVER

On the following pages you'll find excerpts from Casper resident Dave Zoby's recent article for *Patagonia*. This story showcases the traits that Casper, and the state of Wyoming, have always represented—grit, resilience and passion. When the North Platte River needed restoring, our community came together and put in the work to create a unique section of river that anglers from all over the world now come to experience. When I first moved to Casper, Wyoming, I did what almost every eager fly angler does—I drove the 20-plus miles to the dam at Grey Reef and started flogging the obvious pools and tail-outs. I wasn't alone that first time, or any of the thousands of times I've fished the Reef since. I knew that I had stumbled into something special by moving to Casper. But I also knew that there was a lot more to the North Platte River than the three miles of frothy water below the towering cement structure at Grey Reef.

Vaguely, I knew the shameful history of how the river was treated. Like many rivers in America, the North Platte was seen as a place to dispose industrial and human waste. In fact, in 1958, a government survey determined that the North Platte near Casper was the most polluted waterway in the country.

As far as I was concerned, fishing in the North Platte only began well upstream of Casper. What flowed through town was degraded beyond hope, saturnine, sacrificed for profit.

Roughly the same time I moved to Casper, the city and its residents identified the North Platte as a major economic and cultural driver for the region. People didn't give up on the river. They

decided to do something about it. The Two-Fly Organization, a nonprofit that raises money through its celebrated fly fishing tournament, partnered with the city to study the viability of a complete hydrology project that would restore the river channel, stabilize the banks, create fish habitat and improve spawning areas.

What began as a modest idea of an annual river cleanup grew into a multifaceted conglomeration to overhaul seven sections of river, from city border to city border, 13.5 miles of river in total.



Jolene Martinez, with the city of Casper, sees fishing the river as a birthright. She imagines a legacy of wetlands complete with migrating waterfowl and wild birds, smackdab in the middle of the city.

Martinez is quick to point out the many entities involved in the restorations project: Natrona County Weed and Pest, the Bureau of Land Management, the Wyoming Game and Fish Department, the National Audubon Society, the Two-Fly Foundation, the Department of Environmental Quality and, of course, the City of Casper. Bringing all of these disparate groups together for one goal, Martinez tells me, is the essence of Wyoming. To call public attention to the project, the group hosts an annual river cleanup day in September that culminates in a community BBQ at Mike Lansing Field, just off the river. This year saw more than 400 volunteers.

Randy Walsh, who has worked on river restorations in Wyoming for years, always buys an annual fishing license so that he can tote his fly rod along and test the results of his projects on his days off.

“People here understand that what they have is special and unique—you have a metropolitan area with some of the finest trout water in the country,” he said.

Brian Connelly, from Natrona County Weed and Pest, has a way of talking about history that makes you want to listen. He wove tales of just how devastated the river was before the restoration work began. “The trash was insane. There was nobody cleaning it up—there was nobody that cared. It wasn’t trout habitat by any means,” he stated.

Brian and I met in January to talk about the river over espresso. Perhaps it was the caffeine or the effects of a long winter, but both of us wanted to stretch our legs. We rumbled through town in Brian’s truck, stopping at various points of interest, he showed me some of the wetlands and anti-erosion structures that had been put in place along the river.

He said that what he loved about Wyoming is that it’s big. “I don’t mean size. What I mean is that Wyoming—the people and the place—it has a big heart. We are big enough to have grizz and wolves. We have the heart to take care of what we have. We are big enough to make things right.

Explore Casper Mountain

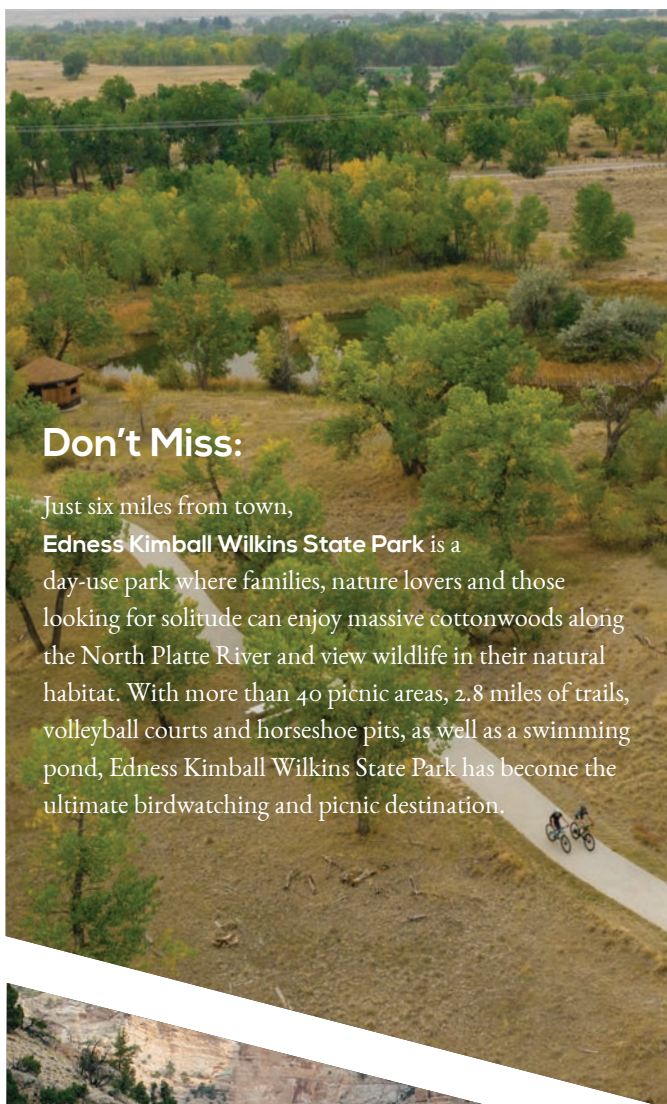
With miles of multi-use year-round trails, you can hike, bike, Nordic ski, snowshoe or fat bike on **Casper Mountain** almost any day of the year. Popular trails include: the **Bridle Trail**, a 4.5-mile trek that starts at Rotary Park and features Casper Mountain's iconic **Split Rock** near the peak; **Eadsville Trail**, a popular mountain biking trail that offers amazing scenery; and the **Braille Trail**, a short hiking trail that was designed for the visually impaired and includes interpretive signs, handrails and picnic areas.

In the snowy season, the **Casper Mountain Trails Center** boasts nearly 26 miles of groomed trails that range from flat runs to steeper inclines. One of the trails is even well-lit in the evenings. Yes, you read that right: this illuminated trail means that your snow day adventure doesn't have to end just because the sun goes down. In the winter months, a trails pass is required to use the Nordic trails. Get your day-use or season pass online at natrona.net. If snowboarding or alpine skiing is your snow day activity of choice, put **Hogadon Basin Ski Area** at the top of your to do list. With 27 trails of varying difficulties, two lifts and a brand new lodge, Hogadon is a great way to spend a winter day. Other notable attractions atop Casper Mountain include the **Adams Memorial Archery Range**, **Beartrap Meadow Park**, **Crimson Dawn** and the world-class **Casper Mountain Biathlon Center**.



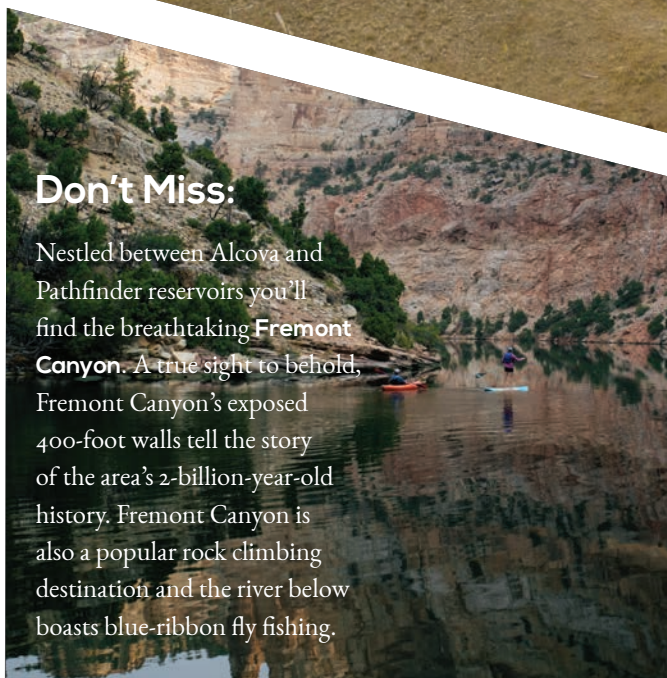
Don't miss:

One of the best places to start your Casper Mountain adventure is at **Rotary Park**. A short drive from town, followed by a short hike from the parking lot, and you'll be at the gem of Casper Mountain, **Garden Creek Waterfall**. And don't forget to pack a lunch— Rotary Park also has fire pits, picnic areas and a gazebo.



Don't Miss:

Just six miles from town, **Edness Kimball Wilkins State Park** is a day-use park where families, nature lovers and those looking for solitude can enjoy massive cottonwoods along the North Platte River and view wildlife in their natural habitat. With more than 40 picnic areas, 2.8 miles of trails, volleyball courts and horseshoe pits, as well as a swimming pond, Edness Kimball Wilkins State Park has become the ultimate birdwatching and picnic destination.



Don't Miss:

Nestled between Alcova and Pathfinder reservoirs you'll find the breathtaking **Fremont Canyon**. A true sight to behold, Fremont Canyon's exposed 400-foot walls tell the story of the area's 2-billion-year-old history. Fremont Canyon is also a popular rock climbing destination and the river below boasts blue-ribbon fly fishing.

Leave No Trace

Be aware of trail conditions. Please avoid riding or hiking on muddy trails, this can lead to damage that is difficult to repair. If you encounter a muddy trail please turn around and leave the trail to avoid causing permanent damage. Occasionally the majority of the trail may be dry but still have small mud puddles, please ride or hike through them rather than around them to avoid widening the trail. Stay on designated trails and pack out any trash you bring in.

With so much to see and do in Casper, it might be hard to know where to start. So to help, we've compiled a two-day itinerary. Mix and match these activities to create your own perfect Casper weekend.

(Unless otherwise noted, all establishments are family friendly.)



Adventure Starts Here

Fuel up for day one at **Sherrie's Place**, here you'll get a taste of some of the best breakfast in Casper as everything is fresh and made from scratch.

Hit the Trail (or Mountain Road)

No matter the season, it's probably a good time to hit the mountain. If you're up for a hike, we recommend the **Bridle Trail** that begins at **Rotary Park** (read more on page 32). If you're more in the mood for a scenic cruise, you can meander on **Casper Mountain Road** all the way over the summit and continue on to stunning **Muddy Mountain** on the backside of Casper Mountain.

Recharge & Fuel Up

After a morning exploring, you've likely worked up an appetite. Our advice: a burger at **The Branding Iron**, where according to the *Travel Channel*, you'll find the best one in Wyoming.

Shop Local

After you've refueled and recharged, it's time to discover **downtown**. Peruse dozens of shops bursting with the creations of local makers. Highlights include **Wyoming Shirt & Gift**, **Lou Taubert Ranch Outfitters**, **Mountain Sports** and **Mustard Seed**.

Dinner & a Show

In the summer, **David Street Station**, Casper's live music and events venue, has concerts, movies, farmers markets and events several nights a week. If you're more interested in an indoor experience, several downtown venues host live music regularly. (Check VisitCasper.com/events to see what's happening.) Downtown is also home to three of Casper's iconic and historic movie theaters: the **America** and the **Rialto**.

There are a variety of quality local eateries to help you savor the flavor of Wyoming in our walkable downtown. Looking for something very Casper? **Racca's Pizzeria Napoletana** offers a taste of Italy with a drool-worthy menu. If your crowd is all 21+, **The Gaslight Social** has an extensive beer and cocktail menu with a lively environment.

Other popular downtown picks: **The Branding Iron**, **Dsasumo**, **The Office** and **Yellowstone Garage**. (Check out "5 Reasons You Can't Miss Downtown Casper" on page 15.)

Retire for the Night

Rise & Shine

With an early start, you may be able to catch one of Casper's famous blazing sunrises from Lookout Point on Casper Mountain. Early risers also get a great table at one of Casper's very popular breakfast spots: **Eggington's**. Kick off the day with their phenomenal omelets, savory scrambles or their french toast that is basically a work of art. Pro tip: Don't leave without a cinnamon roll.

Experience the North Platte

The best way to experience the world-famous **North Platte River** is to just get in it. Spend the morning on the river floating, canoeing, kayaking or fishing. Need gear or advice? Don't worry. Our expert guides & outfitters have you covered (see a full list on page 54). If you're not up for a full immersive experience, the **Platte River Trails** system offers all the views with a much drier encounter.

A Historical Lunch

Take a break for lunch at one of the area's most unique restaurants: **The Hangar**. Aptly named, this restaurant was an actual airplane hangar at the original Natrona County Airport in 1927. Now, it is one of the area's most popular spots.

Get a Dose of History

After lunch, get ready to be amazed by Casper's storied past. Spend the afternoon soaking up the area's pioneer history at the **National Historic Trails Interpretive Center**, a world-class museum with interactive exhibits. Or meet some of Wyoming's earliest residents at the **Tate Geological Museum**, home of Dee the Mammoth.
