AN AFTERNOON HISTORY LESSON





1. HISTORY


Growing from a small Wild West settlement to a proper town by the late 1880s, Casper was a hub for the culture, politics and business opportunities in the state. Most of the historic buildings you see today were built in the early 1900s, including postmaster and local sheep rancher M.L. Bishop's home. Through the booms and busts of the oil industry, Casper was shaped by the resilience and ingenuity of its residents. Stop by the Visitor Center and pick up a self-guided walking tour map to discover the stories and history of downtown Casper up close.

2. ARTS & CULTURE

Wherever you turn in downtown Casper, you see the creative touch of our community. Start your day with a pick me up at Scarlow's Art and Coffee while enjoying their gallery of locally curated art. Take a walking tour of the murals and/or sculptures that adorn our streets and businesses. Be sure to stop into the Nicolaysen Art Museum and check out their permanent collection and rotating displays from across the Rocky Mountain region.







No matter what you're craving, you can find it downtown.

With several new restaurants popping up alongside longtime staples, you won't go hungry.

Looking for breakfast? Try one of our many unique local coffee shops or head on over to Eggington's for brunch and mimosas. Want to really rub elbows with the locals? Sherrie's Place has you covered. This family-owned cozy restaurant has been going strong for over 100 years.

4. LOCAL SHOPPING

LET THE LEGENDS OF THE WEST LEAD YOU TO THE ONE & ONLY CASPER

t the heart of Wyoming lies some of the state's richest history, just waiting to be uncovered. Casper's storied past includes tales from American Indian trails, fur trappers, pioneers, a thriving oil and gas industry, dinosaurs and the Wild West. To truly experience our touchable history, it's best to just dive in.

PREHISTORIC WYOMING

The area's amazing history predates humans by thousands, and even millions, of years. Start by discovering rich geological and prehistoric history at the Tate Geological Museum at Casper College. This museum is free to the public and you can often watch the museum's paleontologists working on their latest findings from the field. You can also meet Dee – an 11,600-year-old Columbian mammoth – and 3,000 of his closest fossilized friends. Out at Alcova Reservoir, you can hike along the Cottonwood Creek Dinosaur Trails and see fossils from some of our earliest dinosaurs in their natural setting.

WHERE HISTORIC TRAILS MEET

As pioneers and forty-niners headed west in the mid-1800s, Casper became a central hub for some of the nation's most historical and well-traveled trails. With the Oregon, California, Pony Express, Bozeman and Mormon trails all converging in Casper, more than half a million travelers stopped in Casper to rest and refuel before they continued on with their journey. Before they made their final trek west, pioneers would carve their names into Independence Rock, a unique historical landmark that sits southwest of Casper off Highway 220. Visitors can learn more about these trails at the world-class National Historic Trails Interpretive Center, Fort Caspar Museum and the Mormon Handcart Visitors Center at Martin's Cove.

THE OIL CITY

As early pioneers began to see the beauty of Casper, a settlement was built. What began as a cluster of shacks grew into a



small town of around 1,000 residents in the late 1800s. Within 20 years, Casper's population grew by more than 600% following the boom of oil around 1910 and our small western town became known as the "Oil Capital of the Rockies."

A WWII MILITARY HUB

During World War II, Casper briefly served as an Army Air Base to support the war effort. Today, the site of the base is partially intact with several original buildings and hangars still standing on the airport grounds, including the Good Aviation and Veterans Museum.

The QR code will direct you to a self-guided audio tour where you can learn more about the airport's World War II operations and how soldiers had their own bowling alley right on base.



Casper took its name from Fort Caspar, a fully reconstructed frontier outpost named after Lt. Caspar Collins who was killed in the 1865 Battle of Platte Bridge Station. The Fort Caspar Museum showcases Casper's first 100 years of history.

ONLY IN CASPER IS BIG CITY ENTERTAINMENT THIS EASY TO EXPERIENCE

ou surely won't suspect it, but when you visit Casper, you'll be surrounded by some of the most creative and talented individuals in the Mountain West. With art museums showcasing local talent, drinkeries with crowds being serenaded by Casper musicians and our streets painted with murals, the experiences you can find in a big city are at your fingertips right here in our mountain town.

ART MUSEUMS

ART 321, a lively art incubator set in an old Pacific Fruit Warehouse, was established in 1924. Organized to promote the visual arts in the community and the legacy of our artists, it continues to support our bold creative community in Casper and across Wyoming. The Nicolaysen Art Museum is a beautifully lit contemporary museum and has been a cultural icon in our community since it opened in 1990.

MUSICAL PERFORMANCES

If music is more your muse, you're never far from a live performance in downtown Casper. With several drinkeries throughout town pairing live music with their delicious brews or coffee, you're able to soak in the arts scene as you sip a local drink. We'd also recommend planning your visit around a Wyoming Symphony Orchestra performance. Celebrating over 70 years, the Wyoming Symphony Orchestra is comprised of the region's best musicians.



KEEPING LOCAL HISTORY ALIVE

Association: Wickman Historical Consultants, Research Arsenal, Fort Casper Museum

Why call Casper your home?

I've spent nearly 30 years here and was one of the first graduates of the Casper College Museum & Gallery Studies degree program. I have always had an interest in the American Civil War; I feel very fortunate to live in Casper where I can indulge that interest by supporting the Fort Caspar Museum.



What opportunities in Casper have helped you pursue your passion for history?

Starting in 2012, I spent five years at the Wyoming Veterans Museum and have spent time working in the archives of the Casper College Western History Center. I founded Wickman Historical Consultants in 2012 and am proud to serve as the Lead Archivist for the Research Arsenal, a premier Civil War online database based here in Casper.

Bringing History to Life at Fort Caspar Museum

I helped design and install an annual exhibit on the 11th Kansas Volunteer Cavalry and presented several programs on the regiment's last commanding officer, Preston B Plumb. I also helped organize and host a reunion of the descendants of the regiment and obtain headstones for the nine soldiers of the 11th Kansas Volunteer Cavalry who were not represented in the museum's commemorative cemetery.

What's the story behind the North Platte River trails project?

I've lived here for 65 years and have seen many groups in town come together to make the Platte River Trails possible. Since the 70s Casper has called itself the "cando" city. Cleaning up the river and creating a recreational space was a big job, but we pulled together to build this dream. It's still one of the most resilient places I know.

As a geologist for one of the big oil companies at the time and working with the trails project to bring a conservation perspective, I was able to bring a unique common ground to the project. It really has been about the community coming together to make the trails what they are from the very beginning. As for what's next, we're working to expand the trail all the way to Edness K. Wilkins State Park on the east end of Casper.


SPRING

Spring is one of Wyoming's bestkept secrets, and is also one of the most beautiful times to travel in. around, and through the Cowboy State. It's not too early to tune your mountain bike up for the season, but it's also not too late for one last run on the ski slopes. It just depends on the day! If you love wildlife, Edness Kimball Wilkins State Park is a bird-watchers paradise in the spring, and throughout its 360-acres, you're also likely to spot deer, antelope and fox. On the opposite side of Casper, Fremont Canyon boasts towering rock walls ranging from 40 to +400-feet tall for beginners to the most experienced rock climbers.

SUMMER

Casper Mountain takes center stage in the summer months. With over 50 miles of multi-use trails to ride, hike, or run, time between the iconic mountain sunrises and sunsets is easily lost. Local favorites include the Bridle Trail at Rotary Park, a 4.5 mile loop that wraps around the Garden Creek Falls waterfall and showcases stunning vistas of Casper, or the 4.1-mile Eadsville Trail that starts at the Casper Mountain Trails Center and immerses visitors in the mountain's lush forest filled with colorful Aspen trees.

Although golfers will have most likely already played a round or two by the first day of summer, the game is in full swing come June. With two visitor-friendly courses, tee times are easy to come by in Casper. Out at Three Crowns, a former oil refinery once known for pumping 100,000 barrels of oil in its prime during 1923, the front and back nine are as challenging as they are scenic with clear views of Casper Mountain. Casper Municipal Golf Course, a more affordable and beginner-friendly course, features three different nine hole courses and twilight golf after 5pm for a discounted price.





FALL

Although fly-fishing enthusiasts cast their lines in Casper's waters year-round, some of the most scenic fishing takes place amongst the changing colors that fall brings along the North Platte River. With beautiful days, cool afternoons, and shades of gold, yellow, and red as your backdrop, fall sets the scene for your next trophy catch. As the world-famous North Platte River cuts into downtown and spans across Casper, there are several access points to test the waters and plenty of guides to show you the secret fishing holes. It's always best to refer to the experts with fishing-related questions, so check out page 65-66 for our extensive list of local guides and outfitters.

WINTER

The most slept on and underrated season in Casper, winter is when the true thrill of Wyoming's outdoors comes to life. Hogadon Basin Ski Area on Casper Mountain is one of Wyoming's most notable hidden gems. 

World-Class Fishing

elcome to Casper, the jumping off point to some of the best fishing in the Lower 48. Our professional guides and fly shop staff are true authorities on the local fishing opportunities. They fish and tie flies 365 days a year. Any visitor to the area should consider a float trip with one of the shops, or, at the very least, a dropin to read the river reports and current conditions. It pays to grab a few flies and talk trout with the locals.

The North Platte River runs directly

species here. Images of them in jumbo sizes dominates the walls of the fly shops. Several reservoirs compliment the fishing scene with stillwater options. Poke around in the high country and you'll find tiny streams and beaver ponds that hold wild brook trout. There are many opportunities for DIY visitors to wade, camp, and experience our powerful fish up close.

Although you're almost guranteed to catch a fish year-round, here's what you can

expect from each season. through Casper, and is a world-famous fly-fishing destination. The river offers a tailwater experience with a real chance at catching a trophy fish. Rainbow, brown, and cutthroat trout are the targeted



Warming waters stir the river's resident trout into feeding mode. Rainbow trout, the dominant species in the famous 29-mile stretch that runs from Grey Reef through downtown Casper, begin to feed voraciously in preparation for the annual spawn. Anglers use leeches, annelids, and egg patterns to experience action-filled days. Spring flows are low, so wading is definitely an option. Fly-fishing culture is on full display in April as trucks hauling drift boats are a daily occurrence, and wind-burnt guides huddle with their clients in breweries after a long day of action.

As the spring ripens, anglers are asked to be mindful of the redds (spawning areas where rainbows pair up), and guides encourage fishermen to catch smaller fish, the ten to fifteen inchers, that are not spawning. These hard-fighting, smaller fish, are energetic, leaping slabs of silver.

Just after ice-out is the time to try Goldeneye Reservoir, an overlooked prairie reservoir where you can cast for a true giant. Rainbow, cutthroat, and brook trout of epic proportions live in Goldeneye. But you'll need a canoe, belly-boat, or some sort of watercraft to get out past the weeds.

SUMMER

Flows increase and the riparian landscape thrums with birdsong. Fly fishermen launch their drift boats for long, bright days of casting and changing flies. The food sources broaden to include blue wing olives, caddis, and yellow sallies. Fishermen spread out and make use of the whole drainage, and some evenings, the river is an unending mirage of rising trout.

Fly fishing for carp has gained popularity in Natrona County. Some guides offer trips in flat boats that bring to mind Key West. These fish, going five to fifteen pounds, make blistering runs that are reminiscent of bonefish. Carp are targeted in Alcova and Pathfinder reservoirs and require eight and nine weight rods. Walleye fishing in Alcova and Pathfinder brings trollers from all over the country. In the high country, streams and beaver ponds hold healthy populations of gorgeous brook trout.







FALL

Streamer fishing for big rainbows and browns is one of the highlights of fall fishing. This is your best chance for a trophy German brown. Fish feed with tenacity as the days shorten and the nights become chilly. Occasionally, there will be a "hopper" event, where large insects are blown into the river in the late afternoons. Even the largest trout leave their lairs to feed on the surface during these rare events.

The Casper area is known for its heroic efforts to clean and restore the North Platte. In September, Platte River Revival group holds its annual river clean-up. Fly-fishers, birders, kayakers, and others turn out to restore the riverbanks. The whole community rallies around the unifying force of the North Platte.

WINTER

For those brave enough to fight the cold, Wyoming offers some phenomenal winter fishing. A tribe of diehards keep vigil at the Grey Reef dam. Some even sleep in wall tents to take advantage of the fishing. Water levels drop and fish are concentrated in obvious pools and turn-outs. It's a great time to wade fish and cover the whole river.

Eighty-one-year-old George Sichterman is one of the hardcore fly fishermen who actually looks forward to the solitude of winter. Conventional wisdom says that you must go way down in fly sizes, but George doesn't buy that.



Every March, the Bureau of Reclamation performs a ten-day flushing flow to aid in successful spawning. Check with fly shops about these highwater days.





Hell's Half Acre

This vibrant roadside attraction sits only 42 miles west of Casper. It was declared a land mark in 1922, and has since welcomed visitors, sight-seers, geologists, and even Hollywood movie crews over the years.

Fun fact: it was the filming location for the fictional planet of Klendathu in the movie Starship Troopers. Since 2005, its deep ravines, caves, rock formations, and hard-packed eroded earth has only been visable from the designated parking lot.

In 2025, the historic landmark will fully reopen to visitors and will feature upgraded picnic facilities, informational signage that highlights it historic significance, and hiking trails.




