Seward's Folly

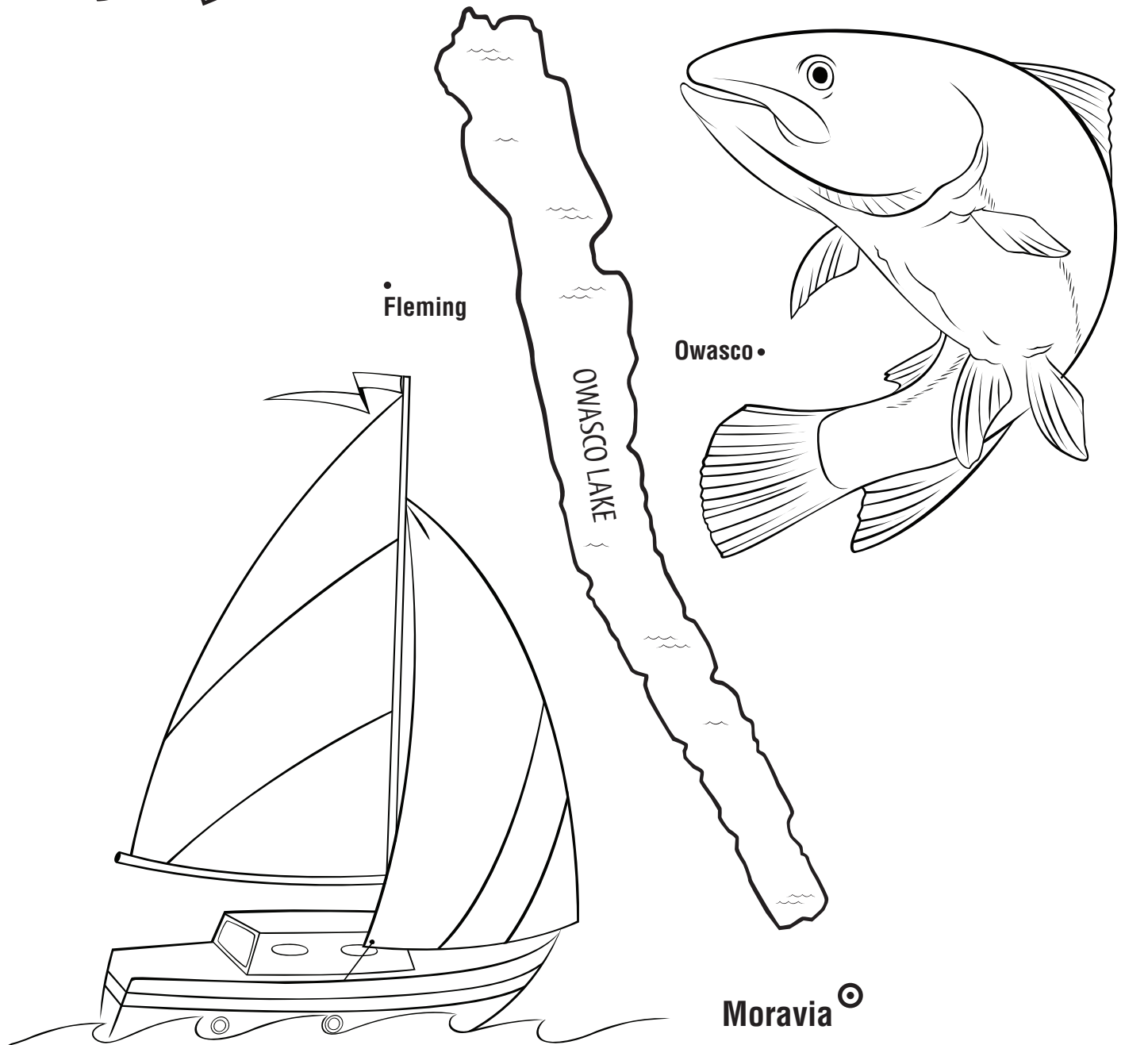


William Seward, the man who helped

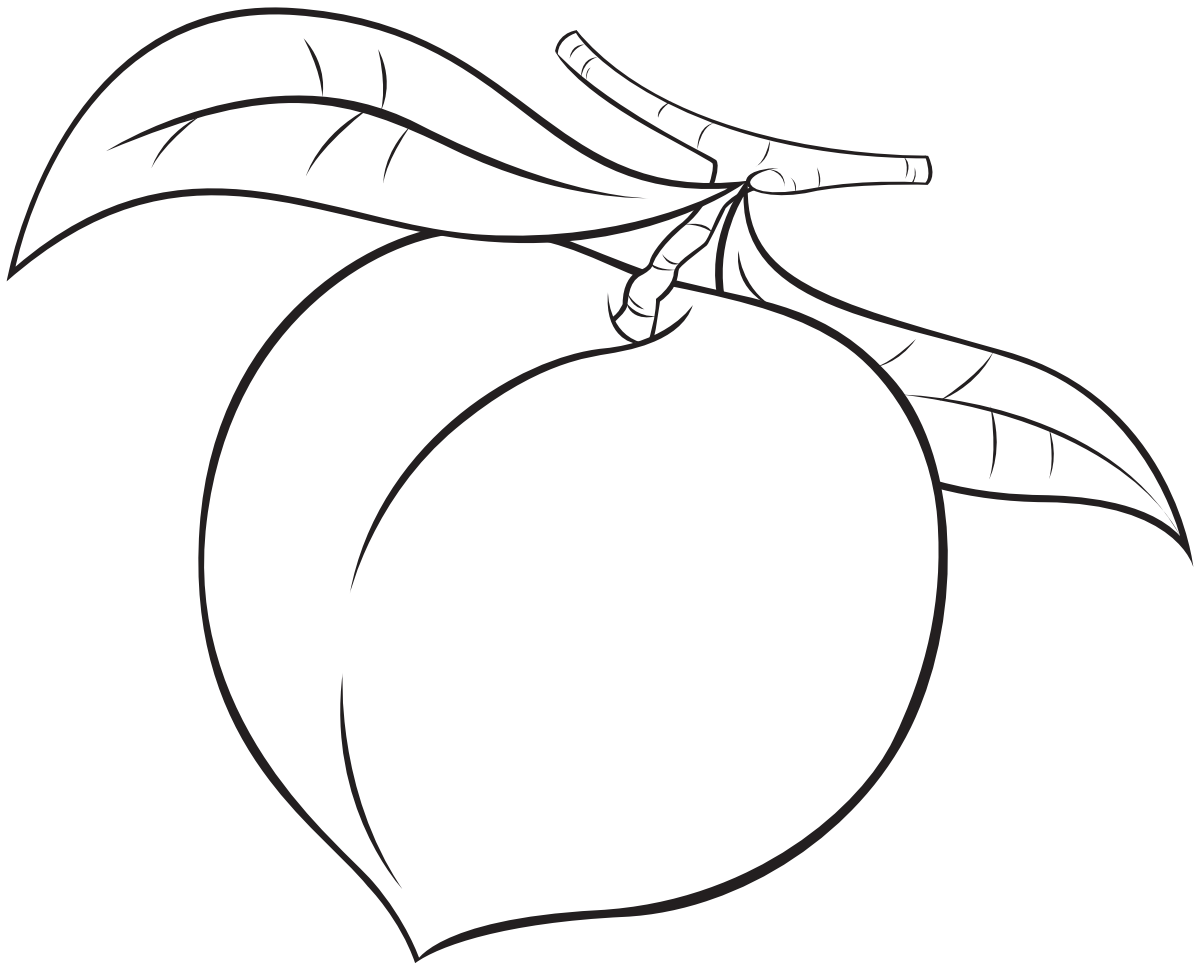

because it had over 1000 peach trees.



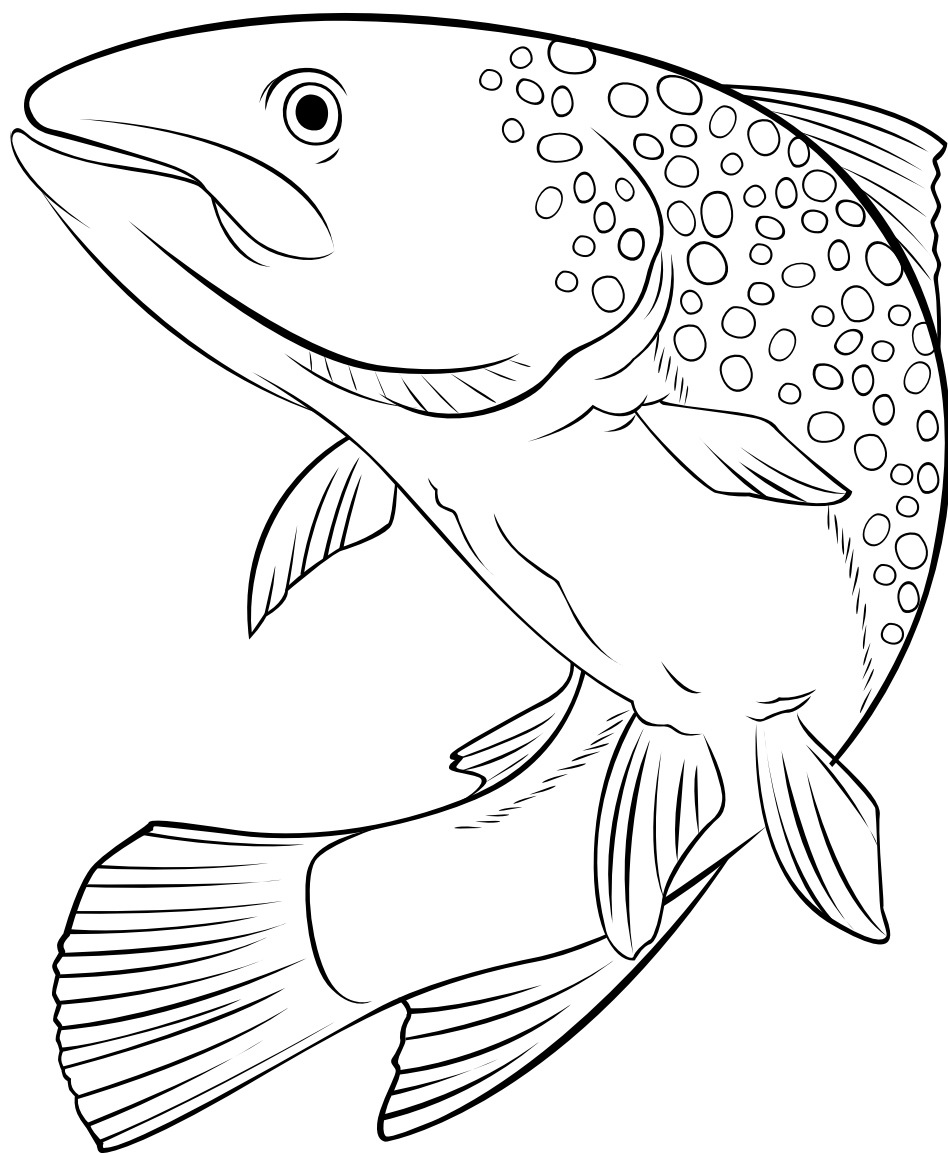
Freedom Train

Harriet Tubman lived in Auburn.



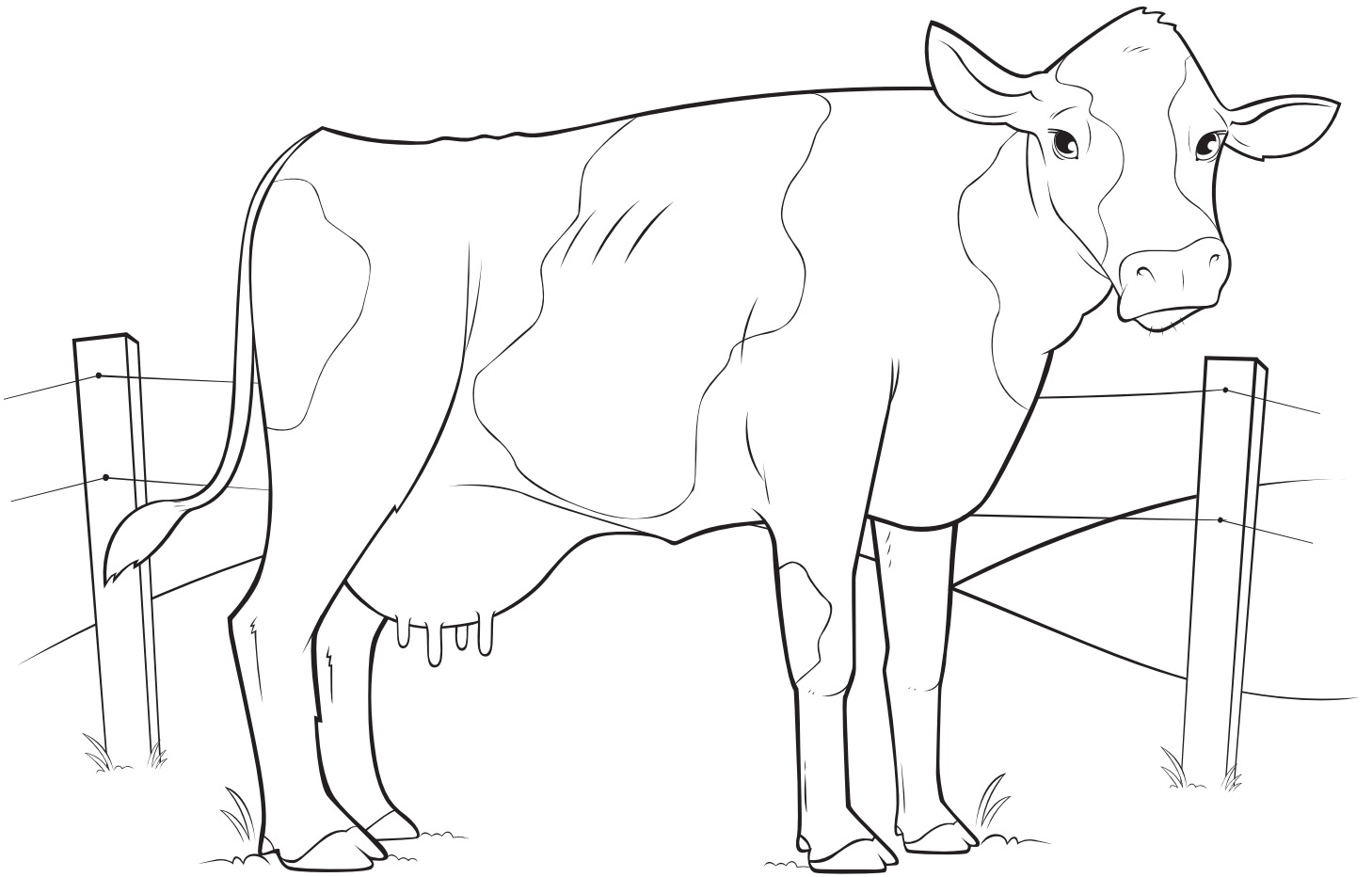

capital of the world.



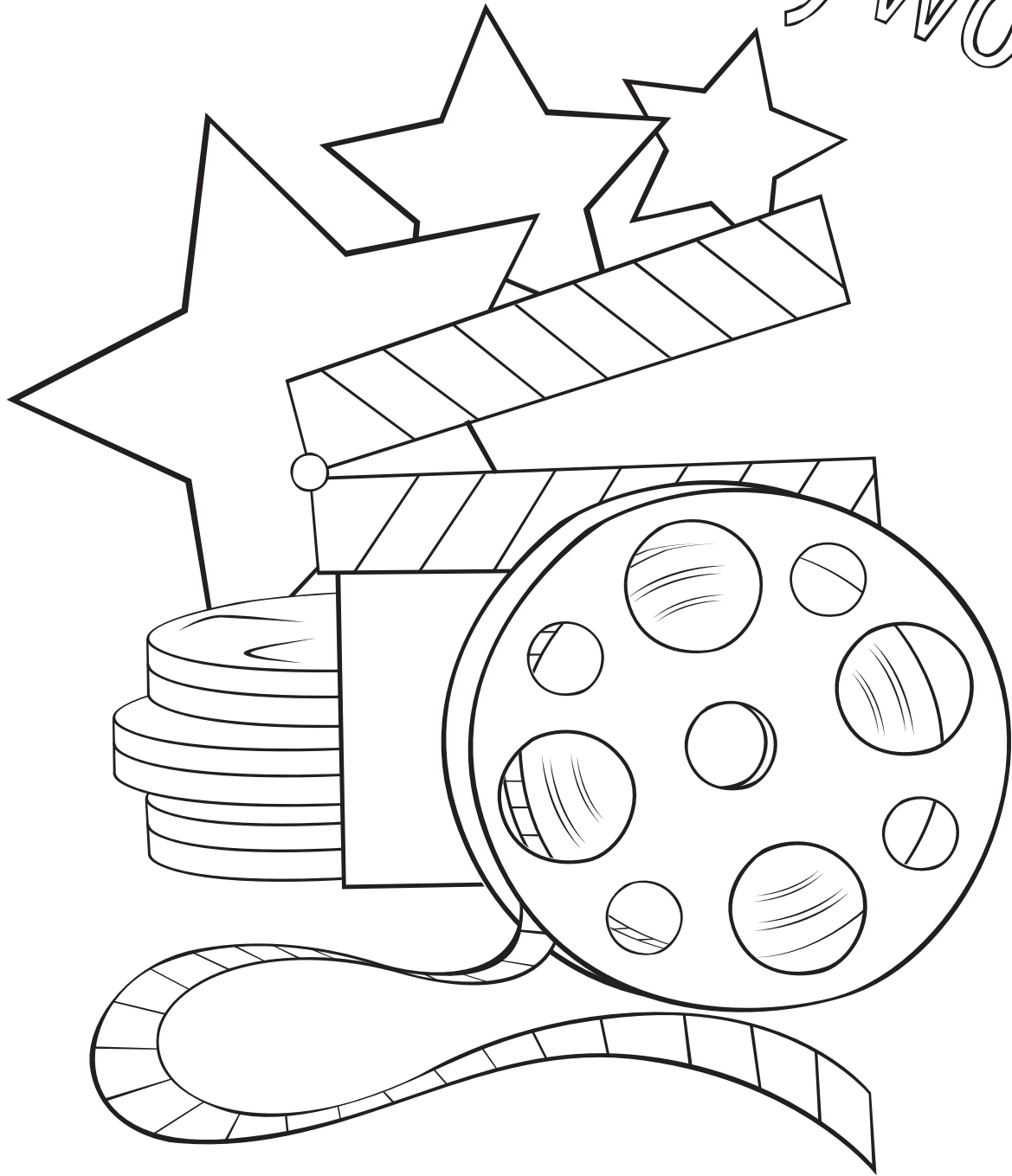
We've "got milk!"

gallons of milk per year.



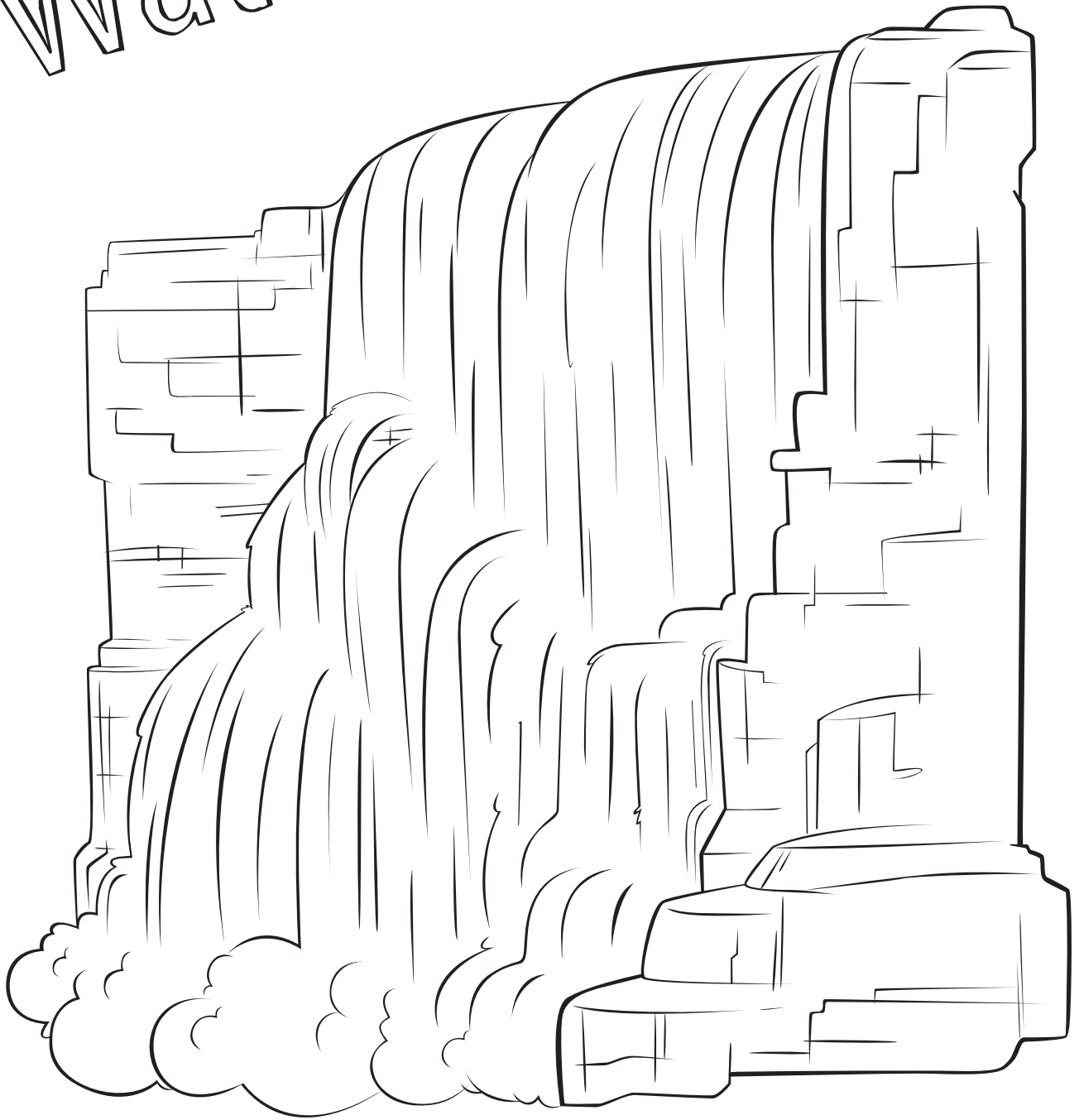

Talking films were invented in Auburn.



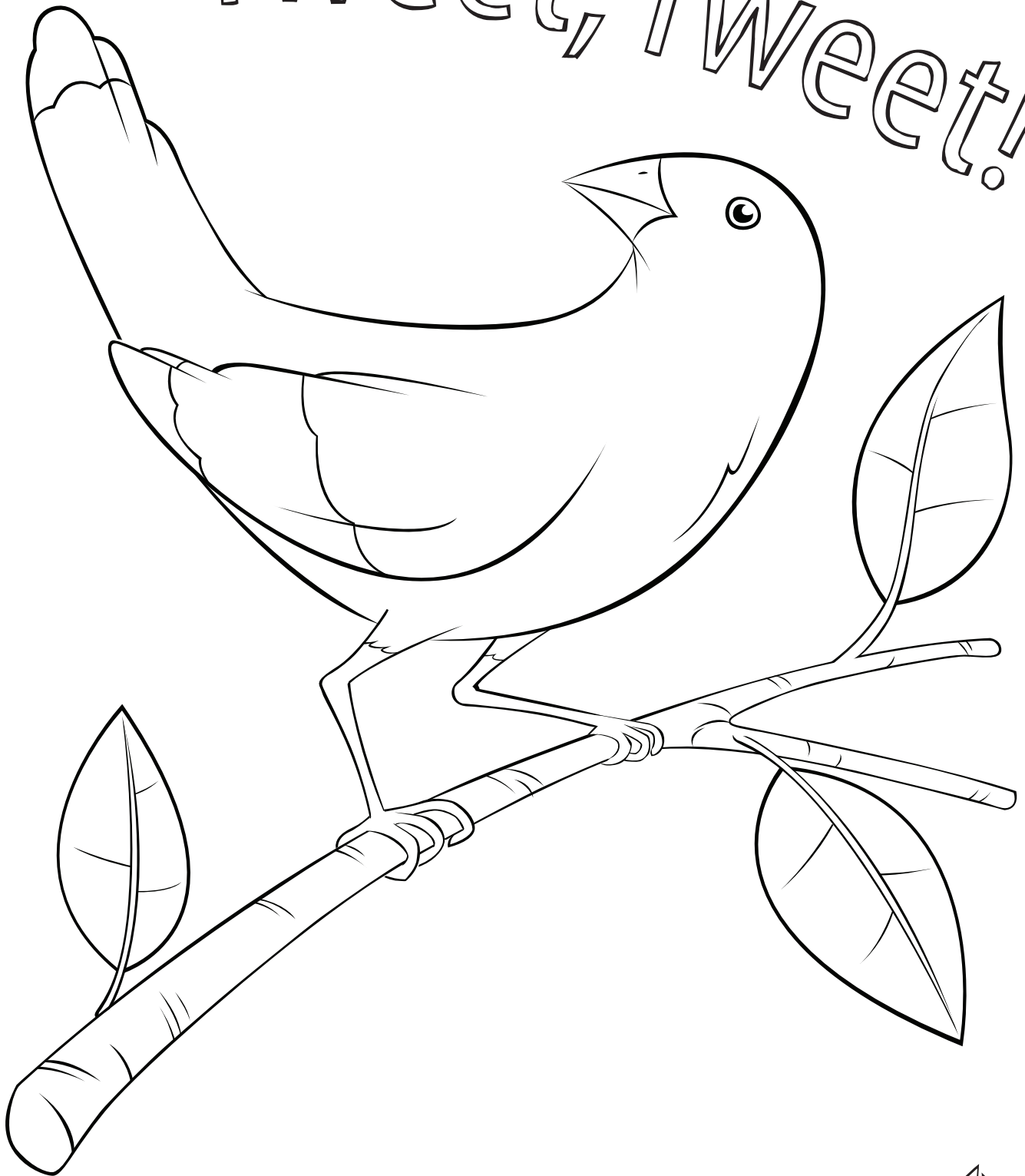

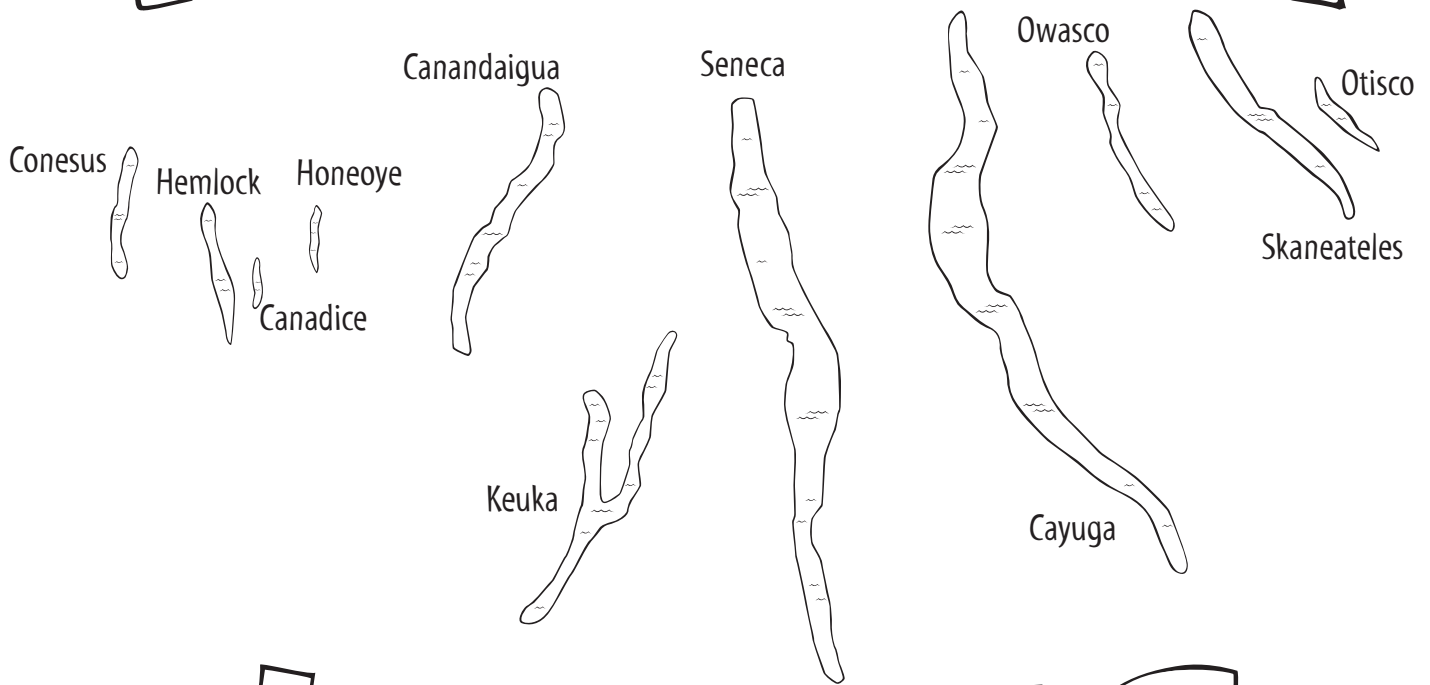
