Montezuma

Montezuma Wildlife Refuge is a wildlife preserve that encompasses part of the Montezuma swamp at the north end of Cayuga Lake. The preserve is 10,000 acres of swamps, pools and channels and is a stopping point for migratory birds. Located between Rochester and Syracuse, it includes parts of Seneca, Cayuga and Wayne Counties. The Montezuma Marshes were designated a National Natural Landmark in May 1973. It was cited as “one of the best examples of undisturbed woodlands in New York or New England.”

A specific spot on the Atlantic Flyway, the Refuge provides crucial habitat for migratory waterfowl and other birds. Marsh and water birds found at the refuge include the great blue heron, green-backed heron, great egret, black-crowned night heron, Virginia rail, sora, bitterns, common moorhen and pied-billed grebes. The refuge also has an area where bald eagles have been nesting in recent years. Ducks and geese, including Canada geese, snow geese, black ducks and mallards are common at the refuge.

First the Algonquin Indians and later the Cayugas of the Iroquois Nation were the earliest known inhabitants to make their home and utilize the marsh. The name “Montezuma” was first used in 1806 when Dr. Peter Clark named his hilltop home “Montezuma” after the palace of the Aztec Emperor Montezuma in Mexico City. Eventually, the marsh, the village and the refuge would all acquire the name. (Wikipedia.com) In addition to providing animal habitat, the refuge also provides opportunities for people to observe wildlife. The refuge trails are open during daylight hours, seven days per week. The Mac Visitors Center is open Tues-Sat 10a-4p, and the Refuge Visitor Center and the Wildlife Drive are currently closed. Please visit responsibly.

Montezuma Winery - The Martin family (Ginny, George, Bill & Ed) started a honey production business that turned into a mini empire. They began with Montezuma Winery creating fruit wines. They then expanded to honey and grape wines. From there, they added Hidden Marsh Distillery, creating spirits including Bee Vodka that is triple distilled from honey. Next, they started Idol Ridge Winery, a B&B behind Idol Ridge, Alder Creek Distillery and Fossenvue Winery, named after the women’s suffrage camp Fossen- vue. Open Sun-Thurs 9a-5:30p and Fri-Sat 9a-6p. Pre packaged samples can be brought to an outdoor heated building where you taste on your own. Curb side pick up is also available. Spirits and wine all available.
