



Ocean Rescue Lifeguard Candidate,

Thank you for your interest in becoming a member of Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission's Ocean Rescue Lifeguard Team. This position requires that you possess adequate vision, hearing acuity, physical ability, and stamina to perform the duties of an open water lifeguard as documented by a medical doctor or osteopathic physician. The position requires a high level of commitment with ongoing physical strength and stamina requirements, along with other course and curriculum training during your employment, as essential job functions. Although the demands are high, you will find your experience rewarding and beneficial while developing the skills necessary to guard Charleston County's oceanfront and its residents and visitors.

Outlined below are the criteria and process a candidate must go through to become an Ocean Rescue Lifeguard.

All candidates must meet the following qualifications before their first day of assigned lifeguard duty:

1. Be at least 16 years of age prior to first day of work
2. Complete a 500 meters (550 yards) swim test in 9:00 minutes or less (pool) and 10:00 minutes or less (open water)
3. Complete a 1-mile run in 7:45 minutes or less (track) and 8:00 minutes or less (beach)

After submitting an application, a hiring manager will reach out to each candidate to set up a swim and run test.

A candidate will become eligible for employment after they have completed the above swim under 12 minutes and passed the run. A hiring manager will contact the candidate to schedule an interview. All potential employees are required to pass a drug test before being hired. Hiring selections will be based on run and swim times, experience, professionalism, drug test results, and character of the candidate. Unfortunately, not all applicants may be hired for a lifeguard position.

If an applicant is hired, they will be required to complete and maintain training levels of the United States Lifesaving Association Open Water Lifesaving curriculum as detailed in the calendar.

New lifeguards will be required to attend a total of 48 hours of rescue skills training. New lifeguards must attend either Rookie School 1 on April 11th & 12th or Rookie School 2 on May 2nd & 3rd. New lifeguards must attend Rookie School prior to Surf School. The first day of each Rookie School will be held at CCPRC Headquarters and the second day will be held at Folly Beach County Park.

New lifeguards must attend four of the USLA Trainings offered on select Wednesday and Thursday evenings. Lifeguards may attend both Wednesday and Thursday if they choose.

All CCPRC Ocean Rescue Lifeguards are required to attend Surf School 1 or Surf School 2. Surf School is an intense 2 day, 16-hour training on the beach consisting of physical training and rescue skills. Surf School 1 is on April 18th & 19th and Surf School 2 is on May 16th & 17th. Each Surf School will be held at Folly Beach County Park.

All CCPRC Ocean Lifeguards are required to have Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) certification or higher. CCPRC will offer EMR training on weekdays May 7th – 13th at the James Island Boardroom from 8:30am-5:30pm and June 1st – 5th at the James Island Boardroom from 8:30am-5:30pm. Lifeguards must attend one trainings. Returning lifeguards are required to attend an EMR refresher class. Dates offered are May 22nd or May 30th at the James Island Boardroom from 9am-5pm.

All CCPRC Ocean Rescue Lifeguards must attend a blended learning CPR course. The online learning must be completed prior to classroom participation. New lifeguards must complete CPR prior to attending an EMR course.



PHYSICIAN CERTIFICATE FOR LIFEGUARD CANDIDATES

Lifeguard employment with Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission requires that those candidates - in order that they are able to perform the duties of a lifeguard - possess adequate vision, hearing acuity, physical ability and stamina as documented by a medical doctor, a doctor's designated physician's assistant or Advanced Practiced Registered Nurse (APRN).

WORKING CONDITIONS: Duty as a Charleston County Park and Recreation Commission lifeguard will include, but not be limited to, exposure to

1. Environmental conditions, sometimes extreme, i.e. sun, wind, salt, ocean currents and conditions, inclement and threatening weather;
2. Physical training to include, but not limited to, running, swimming, agilities, and other activities of a highly physical nature;
3. Emergency, rescue or first aid situations of a varied nature which could result in degrees of mental and physical stress;
4. Blood-borne pathogens;

Your physician should complete the certification portion of this document. Return it on or before your scheduled beach training or water park training. **You will be denied participation in any ocean rescue or water park training until this certification has been completed and returned.**

RETURNING LIFEGUARDS

All returning lifeguards in good standing with CCPRC will have until February 1st to commit to returning to reserve their spot on the roster; all returning lifeguards are still subject to meeting qualifications. If commitment is not made by February 1st, they become part of the general pool of applicants. This enables us to know by February 1st exactly how many spots we must hire (i.e., if there are 50 ocean lifeguard spots open county wide, 32 returning guards have committed; we will hire 18 new guards this spring).
