

How To Embed YouTube in Your Website

1. Simply find the video you wish to embed and click the “share” button beneath the video.



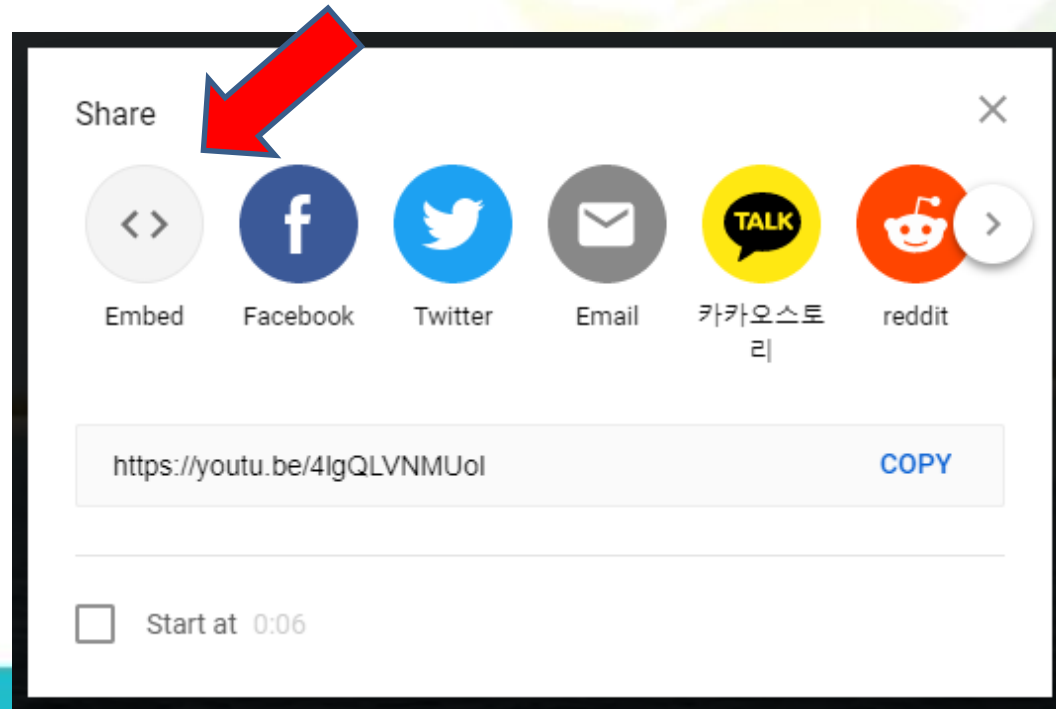



2. This will present several options immediately below, one of which is "Embed". Click it.



3. A typical embed code will look like the image below. Copy and paste the code that is generated into your website as source code or pass that code to the person who handles your website.

4. NOTE: As most recent assets on our YouTube Channel are in High Definition (HD), you'll want to make sure that if you do adjust the size of the video, you keep the relationship between width and height at 16:9.

Example resolutions would be (1280 x 720) or (800 x 450) OR (450 x 225) etc.

Keep in mind that the viewer can always opt to go full screen or click the YouTube icon to view the video on YouTube where they will have more control, so no worries if it's not perfect or big enough based on your current page layout.
