This deck includes the latest tourism recovery indicators and accommodations data.

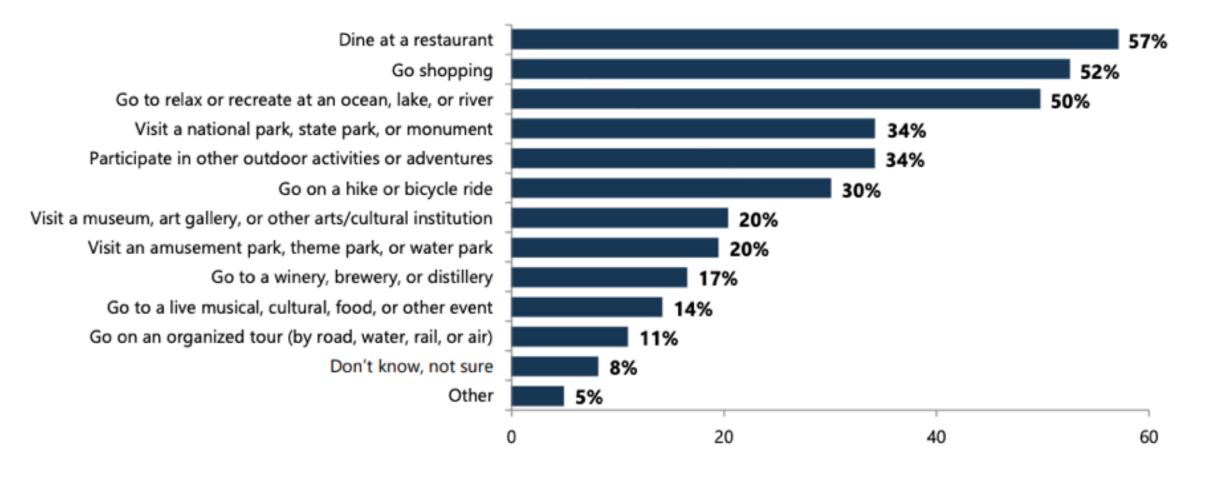

DATA SUMMARY

- Dining, shopping and outdoor recreation dominate the top planned activities for travelers this summer
- 77% Neutral or positive about welcoming visitors back to their communities
- 73% Neutral or positive about traveling outside their community
- 65% Neutral or positive about being asked to travel to a convention this fall
- Return to travel in TN over Memorial Day Week was back to Feb 2020 levels for road trips, but still well below seasonal levels
- Civil Unrest caused one-week intent to visit to remain depressed, but one month and beyond continues to climb towards 2019 levels
- Hotel Demand continues to rise week over week
- COVID-19 Growth Rate and Doubling Time in Hamilton County are both moving in a good direction as of June 11th

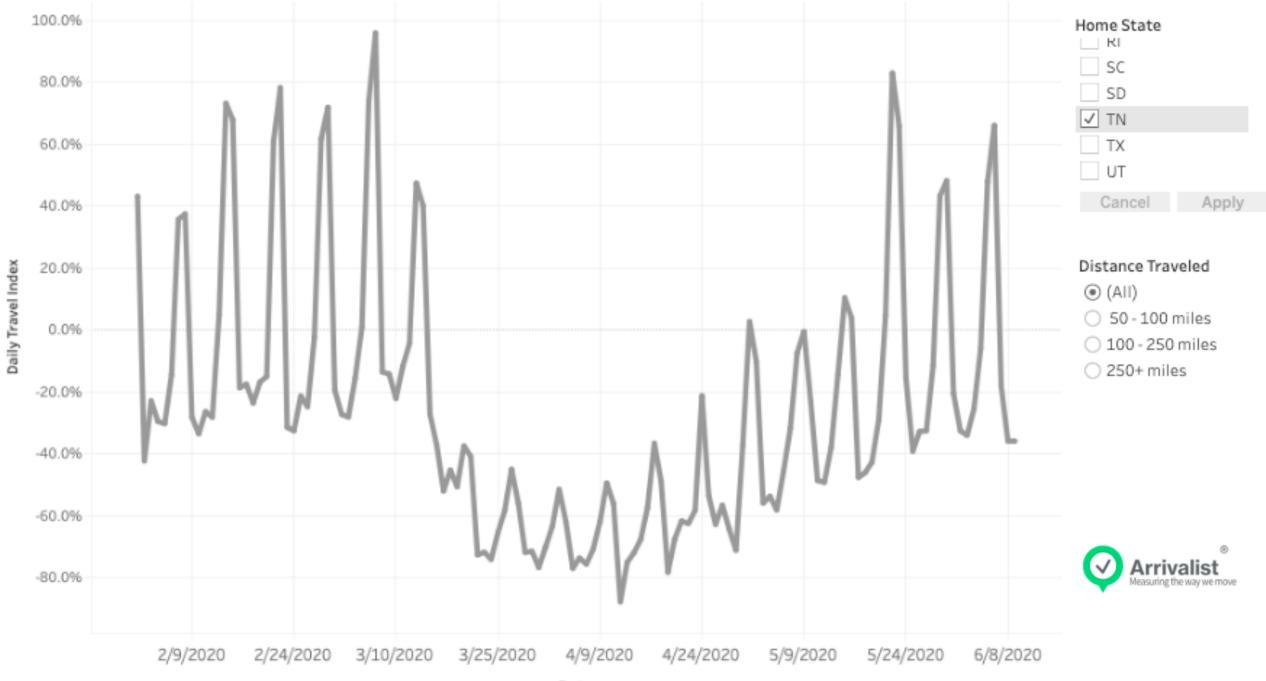

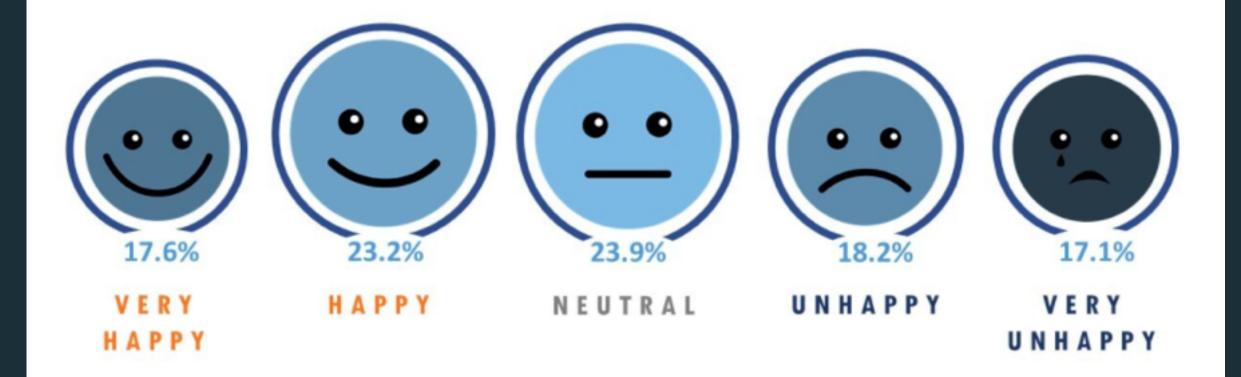

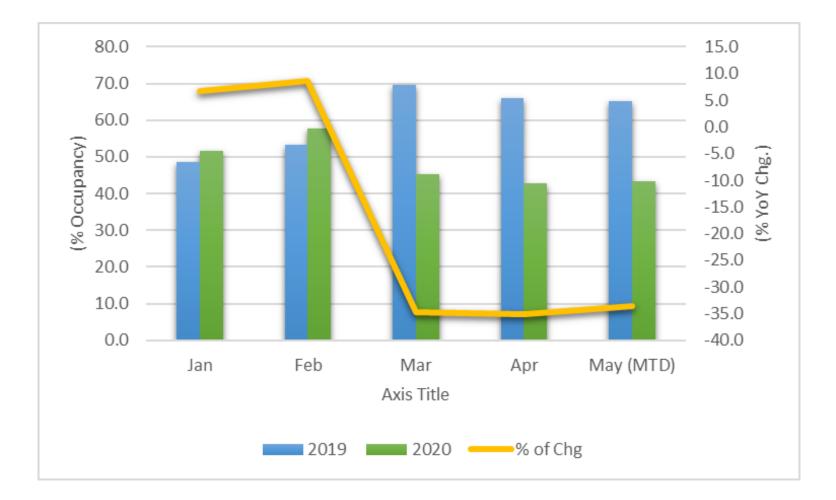

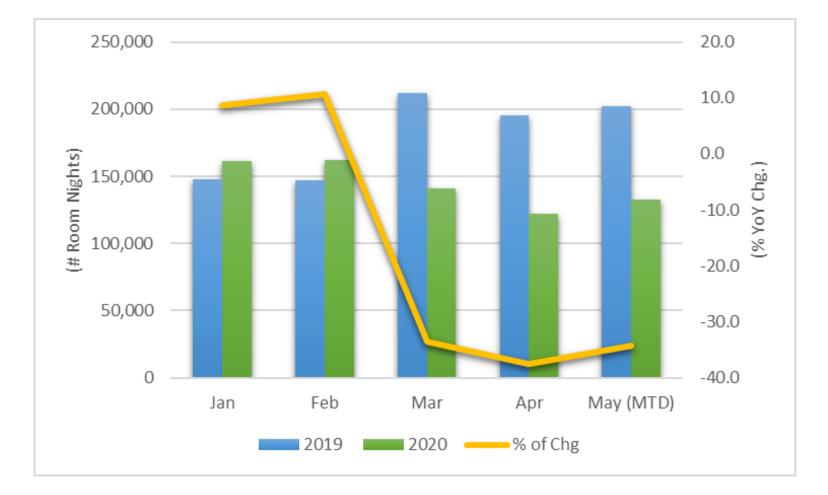

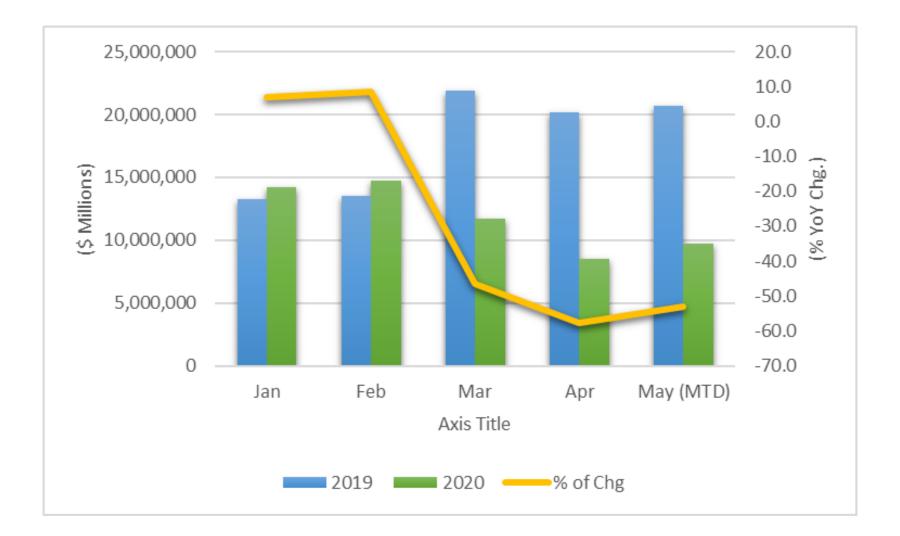
Hamilton County Hotel Occupancy Per Month

Hamilton County Hotel Revenue Per Month

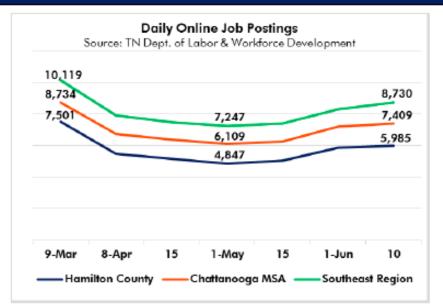

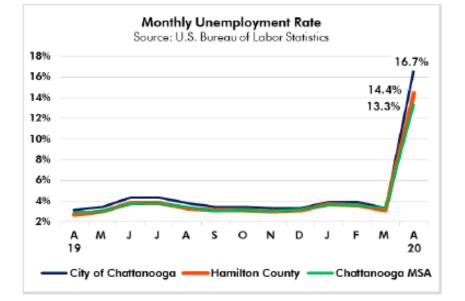


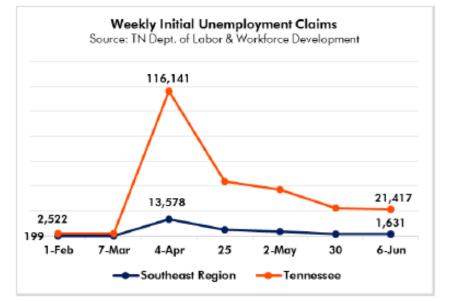
CHATTANOOGA TENNESSEE COVID-19 Economic Indicators June 11, 2020



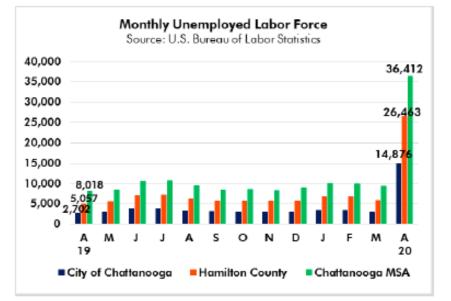
