

# TRAIL 1 PROMENADE & MONTPELLIER

Start on The Promenade, head south along the Long Gardens, through Imperial Gardens, Montpellier Gardens, then back through Montpellier and Bayshill Road.

## 2 PIGEON ART TRAIL, 2019

There are 3 decorated pigeons on the Promenade. See if you can spot them. Look on top of the phone boxes and signs.

## 3 MINOTAUR AND HARE, 1995 SOPHIE RYDER



## 4 BOER WAR MEMORIAL, 1907 AMBROSE NEALE

The soldier is modelled on one of the private soldiers named on the plinth.

## 5 EDWARD WILSON, 1914 KATHLEEN SCOTT

Wilson was part of Captain Scott's Antarctic expedition. This tribute to him was sculpted by Scott's widow.

## 6 THE NEPTUNE FOUNTAIN, 1893 R L BOULTON & JOSEPH HALL

In the summer months when the fountain is turned on, this is the only glimpse we get of the River Chelt as it travels through the town centre.



## 7 HOLST STATUE, 2008 ANTHONY STONES

Gustav Holst, composer of The Planets, stands arms aloft and ready to conduct an orchestra. Each of the seven planets are depicted on a bronze panel on the plinth.

## 8 CRIMEAN WAR MEMORIAL, 1858

## 9 THE IMPERIAL FOUNTAIN/ NAPOLEON FOUNTAIN

The fountain has had a colourful history, having been looted from Italy by Napoleon's army, then captured from the French by privateers, finally ending up in Cheltenham in 1826.

The bench is decorated with 600 tiles hand-painted by the artist and members of the public.




# TRAIL 2 CLARENCE STREET & PITTVILLE

Start at The Wilson, follow Clarence Street round to Boots Corner, then make your way north to Pittville Pump Room. Continue through Pittville Park, back through The Brewery Quarter to the starting point. Optional extension through St Paul's and along the Honeybourne Line.

## 1 THE WILSON GRILLE, 1991 ALAN EVANS

Designed by artist blacksmith, Alan Evans, the grille takes its inspiration from the museum's world renowned Arts and Crafts collection.

## 16 BARLEY, 2006 SOPHIE MARSHAM




## 17 CENTRE STONE

Look up above the entrance to Cheltenham Public Library.




# TRAIL 3 HIGH STREET & SANDFORD PARK


## 1 WISHING FISH CLOCK, 1987 KIT WILLIAMS

An extra loop to the west of the town centre, which also takes in some of the street art from the Cheltenham Paint Festival.





Area covered by the illustrated map showing the locations of the trails.
