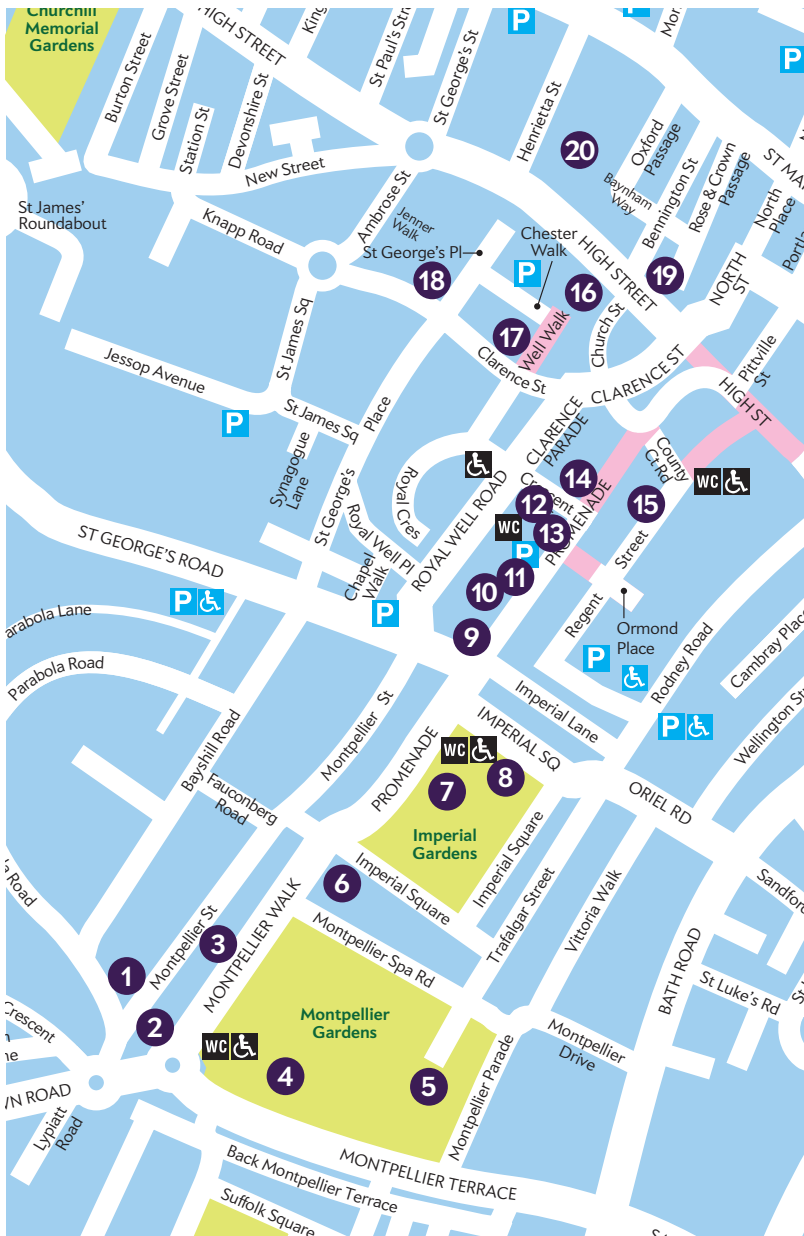


CHELTENHAM'S SELF-GUIDED FAMILY TRAIL

Location	Question	Answer
1 Montpellier Wine Bar	How many letters are there in the word written on the floor in front of Montpellier Wine Bar's doorway?	
2 Ivy Montpellier Brasserie	How many lions are on the roof above the entrance to The Ivy?	
3 Caryatids	How many caryatids (white Greek statues) are there in total along the shopfronts of Montpellier Walk?	
4 Montpellier Gardens	Find the small lion sculpture near the Children's Play Area. In what year was the play area originally presented by the Lions Club of Cheltenham?	
5 Montpellier Gardens	A statue of which king is at the end of the central path in the park?	
6 Queens Hotel – Imperial Gardens	In front of the hotel is a memorial for which 19th century war?	
7 Imperial Gardens	The statue of composer Gustav Holst is set on a column of a particular shape. How many sides does this shape have?	
8 Cheltenham Town Hall – Imperial Gardens	What is the date shown on the top of the drainpipes?	
9 The Promenade – Neptune's Fountain	How many horses are there as part of the fountain?	
10 The Promenade – Municipal Offices	How many birds are there in the crest above the central columns?	
11 The Promenade – Edward Wilson statue	Which continent is Edward Wilson famous for exploring?	
12 The Promenade – Pedestrianised section	How many traditional red telephone boxes are there?	
13 The Promenade – Pedestrianised section	The large sculpture in the middle of the Promenade is of which 2 animals?	
14 The Promenade – Martin & Co	This is probably Cheltenham's oldest shop. What year was Martin & Co founded?	
15 Everyman Theatre – Regent Street	How many segments are there in the circular windows?	
16 The Minster Church – Well Walk	Cheltenham Minster, St Mary's is Cheltenham's oldest church. What letters are carved above the entrance?	
17 The Wilson Art Gallery & Museum – Clarence Street	How many squares are used in the sign for the Wilson?	
18 Strozzi Palace – Clarence Street	Based on the Strozzi Palace in Florence, this building was a first in Cheltenham. What was it built for?	
19 Cheltenham High Street	What is the number in the stone above the entrance to Greggs?	
20 The Brewery Quarter	Find the street art – what is the number on the spray can that the chameleon is climbing on?
