Day 1





- Arrive mid-morning to Hagley Museum & Library, the site of the
 original gunpowder works and ancestral home of the du Pont family.
 Enjoy a guided tour of the restored mills and estate. Visit the Nation
 of Inventors exhibition, exploring the early stages of the patent
 process.
- Stop for lunch at the **Mendenhall Inn** (also a great overnight option!), or opt for a box lunch at your next stop.
- Continue the du Pont story at **Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library**: the living vision and former 175-room mansion of collector and horticulturist Henry Francis du Pont. Take the garden tram for a guided tour of the estate and naturalistic gardens, set on 1,000 acres.
- Check in to one of many group-friendly lodging options in the Brandywine Valley; Chester County Tourism is happy to provide a recommendation. Groups receive a complimentary welcome bag at check-in.
- This evening, enjoy a theatrical performance at People's Light Theater or Uptown Knauer Performing Arts Center.

Day 2





- Start the day at **Nemours Estate**, a 77-room French-inspired mansion and formal garden, built in 1910 by Alfred I. duPont. Take a guided or self-guided tour of the treasure-filled estate and manicured gardens, just as they were when A.I. lived there.
- For an elevated group lunch, opt for Brandywine Prime, an upscale steakhouse in a restored 1704 stone cottage. The café at Longwood Gardens is a great casual alternative before exploring.
- Now, for the main event: surround yourself in 1,077 acres of botanical bliss at world-renowned Longwood Gardens. Enjoy guided or self-guided tours of carefully curated indoor and outdoor gardens, featuring breathtaking seasonal displays. Longwood will debut a new West Conservatory and restaurant in November 2024 as a part of Longwood Reimagined: A New Garden Experience. May-October, plan an evening visit to experience an Illuminated Fountain Performance.
- For shopping, strolling, and dinner, explore vibrant downtown
 Kennett Square, known as the Mushroom Capital of the World. Look
 to Chester County Tourism for group dining recommendations.

Day 3



Check out of your hotel and embark on one final garden experience to end your tour.

- Once the private estate of Pamela and Lammot du Pont Copeland. Mt.
 Cuba Center's 68 acres of gardens and over 1,000 acres of natural lands inspire native plant conservation.
- The Brandywine Museum of Art offers guided and self-guided tours of the real studios of Andrew and N.C. Wyeth, surrounded by the bucolic landscapes that inspired them. The museum and natural garden overlooks the rambling Brandywine River.
