Hell on Wheels Tickets Now On-Sale

Tickets for the 4th season of the Hell on Wheels Rodeo and Chuck Wagon Dinner Series are now on sale. The open rodeo series enters 2023 as one of the fastest growing western sporting events in Wyoming. With six dates on the calendar this year, it is shaping up to see even more growth as increased sponsorship has led to increased added money for the athletes and for the first time ever. a championship saddle will be awarded at the conclusion of the September 8th rodeo to the high money winner from the entire 2023 series.

The rodeo features nine events including rough stock and timed events, a calf scramble and all of the pageantry that the rodeo is known for. This year the Hell on Wheels Rodeo also has royalty as Abigail Marcott was named the first Queen in the rodeo's history this past winter.

The chuck wagon dinner begins at 5:30 pm each night and the rodeo follows with a 7pm grand entry. Tickets range from \$15 to \$75 and are available at www.hellonwheelsrodeo.com. Laramie County residents receive \$10 per ticket off if they buy before June 1st or \$5 a ticket discount after that. All they need to do is enter their Zip Code in the promo code box at check out.
