Laramie County Library is honored to be one of 50 stops of a traveling exhibition that is sure to make library patrons think. "Americans and the Holocaust" digs into the factors that the United States faced in the 1930s and '40s and tells the stories of individuals and groups who took action against Nazism from an ocean away. The exhibit will be up through August 29 and can be visited during regular library hours.
