All grant funding must go directly toward marketing expenses, with at least 60% used outside Laramie County to promote tourism to the Greater Chevenne Area. Visit Chevenne favors applicants who can match their requested funds on a 1:1 basis, and proposals should clearly demonstrate how they will increase hotel and lodging use.

Selected grantees receive half of the funding upfront and the remaining half once a post-event report is submitted (due within 30 days of the event). All advertising must include recognition of Visit Cheyenne.
