May 6: The Trolley's 31st season begins on Monday, May 6 with tours offered 7 days / week until late September. The narrated historic tours take place on weekdays (10 am, 11:30 am, 1 pm, 2:30 pm, 4 pm) with several stops at attractions along the way. On weekends, the Trolley offers 2-hour tours (Sat. at 10 am, 12 noon, 2 pm. Sun. 12 noon, 2 pm). Tickets are available in the Depot lobby.

2018 Was a Great Tourism Year in Laramie County!

According to new statistics from the Wyoming Office of Tourism, Laramie County welcomed an estimated 1,102,000 overnight visitors in 2018, up 2% over 2017. These travelers spend \$372.6 million, up 8%. This spending supported 3,020 Laramie County jobs (+2% over 2017) and contributed \$21.3 million in state and local taxes (+7%).
