Tour'N 64 Must Visit Destinations

LST 325 - WWII Landing Ship, Tank

The "Last of her Class," the LST 325 is an authentic WWII warship that landed on Omaha Beach on D-Day and went on to serve in the Pacific arena and the Korean War. She is the last navigable LST in operation today. Guided tours available.

Reitz Home Museum

Renovated and restored to the authentic Victorian Era style and decor, the home museum is one of the finest examples of French Second Empire architecture in the country. Enjoy the warm evening glow of the Reitz mansion at Christmas with stained glass, Christmas lights and music.

Evansville Museum of Art, History & Science

This remarkable museum holds art and exhibits unheard of for a city our size. Enriching lives through preservation, exploration, enlightenment and amazement. Explore space and rediscover our amazing planet in the stunning Koch Immersive Theater & Planetarium where you can see traditional planetarium shows as well as be immersed in full-dome cinema.

The Evansville Wartime Museum

During WWII, our nation's military went into battle with airplanes, ships, tanks and munitions manufactured in Evansville. The museum is dedicated to showing and celebrating the stories of those who were there along with memorabilia they collect.

Bosse Field

Currently home to the Evansville Otters, Bosse Field opened in 1915 and was the first municipally -owned sports facility in the United States. Only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) are older than Evansville's Bosse Field. The box office hit "A League of Their Own" was filmed at Bosse Field in 1992.

Culbertson Mansion State Historic Site

Take a guided tour of William Culbertson's luxurious mansion to learn about his family, life, and philanthropy. Events include an annual haunted house, periodic murder mystery dinners, and Clue parties for groups.

From the sweet smell of cinnamon and chocolate to the taste of delectable handmade candies, Schimpff's has been a regional treasure for more than 128 years. Groups can get a class in candy making at this family-owned attraction, explore sweet history in the candy museum and enjoy the old-fashioned soda fountain serving malts, milkshakes, and more!

MESA: A Collaborative Kitchen

Mesa is a state-of-the-art collaborative kitchen, featuring demonstrations by southern Indiana and Louisville established and aspiring chefs. The chefs prepare and demonstrate 3-5 courses while explaining the process, answering questions and talking with guests who have front-row seats for the class online. At class, a beverage is paired with the chef's menu. With the emerging and dynamic restaurant scene, Mesa will be the culinary hub for Kentuckiana's highly-talented chefs to share their love for food with the public and each other. In addition to the collaborative space, Mesa also houses a bookstore, to-go cooking dinners, and a kitchen essential boutique.

The Falls of the Ohio State Park and Interpretive Center

Groups can see the largest exposed Devonian fossil bed in the world when river levels are low. Overlooking the Ohio River, the state-of-the-art Interpretive Center takes groups on an interactive timeline of the people, places and animals from 390 million years ago to today. There's no other place like it in the world! The site was recently added to the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail.

Joe Huber's Family Farm & Restaurant

Historic Tours

Established in 1808, the town of Corydon served as Indiana's first state capitol from 1816 to 1825. This history is palpable when you walk downtown Corydon's storied streets, with most of the buildings dating to the 1800s. Tour The First State Capitol building, governor's headquarters, and The Harrison County Discovery Center.

Soft Adventure

Below the rolling hills, majestic forests, and winding Blue River lies Indiana Caverns and Squire Boone Caverns & Village. Guided tours take you deep into our greatest natural treasure where you can walk alongside underground streams, investigate captivating cave formations, discover fossils, and observe fascinating plant and animal life hundreds of feet below the earth's surface.
