SPRINGTIME = ADVENTURE TIME

Historic Collinsville

Step back in time at the Historic Collinsville Pioneer Settlement. Take a self-guided tour of 16 authentically furnished structures along the rolling 40 acres. Open weekends May - October.

Trails

Discover the city's most scenic sites from a trail. While you can enjoy trails all year long, there's nothing quite like spring when you're greeted with new buds, blooms, wildlife and warming sunshine! Find "Instaworthy" pics at Dunbar Cave State Park, Rotary Park, the Greenway, RiverWalk and Upland Trail.

Rock Climbing

Climbing is also relatively pleasant throughout the year, but spring is peak for breathtaking views at Middle Tennessee's designated outdoor rock climbing venue, King's Bluff.

Community Built Playground

Liberty Park is home to a massive community-built playground. This civic-led project includes a separate area for toddlers, structures for climbing and exploring and so much more. Plus, you're near picnic tables with scenic river views.

Wade Bourne Nature Center at Rotary Park

Visitors can enjoy free, public access to permanent and temporary displays as well as hands-on activities to learn more about the natural history of Clarksville. Located within Rotary Park, the Wade Bourne Nature Center is a place of learning and discovery for all ages.

African American Legacy Trail

Learn the expansive and unique history of Clarksville's African American community. From community gardens and historic churches to athletic, musical and business trailblazers, Clarksville is proud of this rich history.

Cycling

Explore on two wheels from one of the city's BCycle rental stations. Hop on at Downtown Commons, Liberty Park, McGregor Park, the Greenway or APSU. Rent, then return at any location.

Live Music

May kicks off a summer of live outdoor concerts – most of which are free! Kick up your heels or simply relax and listen at concerts from local and regional bands at Downtown Commons, Beachaven Winery, Old Glory Distilling Company and more.









FREE FAMILY FUN SUMMER ACTIVITIES

Downtown Commons

This full-block urban park is a kid's delight! With an imagination playground, water features, free summer concerts, plenty of room for free play, and shaded spots for a picnic – what's not to love?!

Parks

Explore two state and 30 local parks filled with activities like splash pads, hiking, water sports, creeks, playgrounds, picnic areas, wildlife, history and more.

Walking History Tour

Follow along three history trails and learn about Clarksville's heritage, notable residents, historic architecture, and more.

Fort Defiance Civil War Park

Hear the stories, learn the history, see the weapons, wander the grounds and experience the views at the Fort Defiance Civil War Park & Interpretive Center.

Downtown Market

Downtown Clarksville transforms to a festive spot on Saturday mornings May - October. The top-rated open-air market features locally grown fresh produce and weekly handcrafted products.

Disc Golf

Disc golf is a sport the whole family can enjoy! Find two very different courses at Rotary Park (18 holes) and Barbara Johnson Park (9 holes).

Watersports

What better way to beat the heat than in (or on) the water? With 650 miles of navigable waterways, you can enjoy fishing, skiing, kayaking, boating, canoeing and tubing.

Cave Tours

Cool off with a cave tour where it's 58° year around. Plus, it's the only public cave in the world where you can see 14th century Mississippian Native American cave art.

Independence Day Celebration

Enjoy one of the most impressive fireworks displays in the state, if not the southeast. Celebrate with food, live music, and familyfriendly activities followed by the fireworks display over the Cumberland River at Liberty Park on July 3 each year.

Public Art

Murals, fountains and sculptures dot the downtown and surrounding areas. A tour of Clarksville's public art is both educational and entertaining.





larksville's founding at the confluence of the Cumberland and Red Rivers set the stage for what became a thriving commercial crossroads, particularly for the tobacco trade, by the mid-1800's.

Glimpse into the life of early Americans who roamed the land during the mid-19th Century with a self-guided audio tour at **HISTORIC COLLINSVILLE PIONEER SETTLEMENT**. The intrepretive property features 16 restored log homes and outbuildings with authentic period artifacts on 40 rural rolling acres.

Permanent exhibits at the **CUSTOMS HOUSE MUSEUM & CULTURAL CENTER**, like Becoming Clarksville, showcase how local agriculture, industry, education, culture, government, medicine, military, and transportation have all contributed to the city we know today.

Built in 1858 for wealthy tobacconist Christopher Smith, the beautiful **SMITH TRAHERN MANSION** reflects the transition between Green Revival and Italianate styles. Adjoining the property, the Riverview Cemetery dates to the 1700's.

The **AFRICAN AMERICAN LEGACY TRAIL** will take you across Montgomery County to learn the expansive and unique history of Clarksville's African American community. From community gardens and historic churches to athletic, musical and business trailblazers – like Wilma Rudolph – Clarksville is proud of this rich history.

n an area steeped with heritage, it's only natural that a vibrant arts scene would emerge to capture the minds and imaginations of residents and visitors. Public art, theatre, museums, galleries and music reinforce Clarksville's cultural experience.

The **CUSTOMS HOUSE MUSEUM & CULTURAL CENTER** features both rotating and permanent exhibits in a 56,000-square-foot facility. The museum is both the state's second-largest general history museum, and a fascinating architectural marvel which is now underlit at night. Science, history and art, with plenty of hands-on interaction, means fun for kids of all ages.

The iconic **ROXY REGIONAL THEATRE** is a cornerstone of entertainment in downtown Clarksville. Enjoy live professional theatre and musicals, from family favorites to Shakespeare to black-box alternatives.

ARTWALK, held downtown on the Thursday evening of each month, galleries, and a panorama of sculptures, murals and fountains give downtown an inspiring and artistic vibe.

Explore the **TN MUSIC PATHWAYS** with five markers in Clarksville that recognize the people, places and genres that make Tennessee the Soundtrack of America.




