



Rock Climbing at King's Bluff is pleasant and popular throughout the year, but spring is peak season for breathtaking views atop the bluffs along the Cumberland River



From community gardens and historic churches to accomplished athletes, musicians, and businesspeople, the African-American Legacy Trail showcases many contribution to our city's and nation's history.





Downtown Clarksville transforms to a festive spot on Saturday mornings May - October. The top-rated open-air **Downtown Market** features locally grown fresh produce and handcrafted products.



Traditional golf and disc golf courses are in no shortage throughout the city. Whether you're teeing or tossing, you'll find scenic well-maintained courses.



What better way to beat the heat than in (or on) the water? With 650 miles of navigable waterways, you can enjoy all the watersports – fishing, skiing, kayaking, boating, canoeing and tubing.



Cool off with a guided tour at **Dunbar Cave State Park** where it's 58° year around. Plus, it's the only public cave in the world where you can see prehistoric Mississippian Native American cave art dating to the 14th century.




WALKING TRAILS

History & Heritage

MILITARY HISTORY

For stories about Clarksville's earliest settling and revolutionary war heroes on through the Civil War, visit Fort

Defiance Civil War Interpretive Center atop the bluff where the city was first founded. Covering the early 1940's to present, the Don F. Pratt Museum offers an extensive collection that traces the history of the 101st

Airborne Division's Screaming Eagles.

AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY

Learn about the people and places that helped shape the history of both Clarksville and the nation along the **African American Legacy Trail**.

LOCAL STORIES

Take a drive into the country, where
Historic Collinsville Pioneer
Settlement features 16 restored
log homes and outbuildings with
authentic period artifacts from
1840-1900. At the opposite end of the
county, Port Royal State Historic Park
sits along the path of the Trail of Tears.
Permanent exhibits at the Customs
House Museum display the full gamut
of local history and culture.


