



HISTORY HERITAGE

Clarksville's founding at the confluence of the Cumberland and Red Rivers set the stage for what became a thriving commercial crossroads by the mid-1800s. The city's many historic sites tell a fascinating story. Our people and their accomplishments continue to inspire folks around the globe.

LOCAL STORIES

Take a drive into the country, where **Historic Collinsville Pioneer Settlement** features 16 restored log homes and outbuildings with authentic period artifacts from 1840-1900. At the opposite end of the county, **Port Royal State Historic Park** sits along the path of the Trail of Tears. Permanent exhibits at the **Customs House Museum** display the full gamut of local history and culture. **Greenwood and Riverview Cemeteries** offer cemetery tours a few times each year, revealing some of Clarksville's most famous and infamous people and stories.

MILITARY HISTORY

For stories about Clarksville's earliest settling and revolutionary war heroes on through the Civil War, visit **Fort Defiance Civil War Interpretive Center** atop the bluff where the city was founded. Covering the early 1940's to present, the **Don F. Pratt Museum** offers an extensive collection that traces the history of the 101st Airborne Division's Screaming Eagles.

AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY

Learn about the people and places that helped shape the history of both Clarksville and the nation along the African American Legacy Trail.

Legacies of trailblazers like **Pat Head Summitt, Wilma Rudolph and Dr. Robert Burt** are still impacting and inspiring lives.




