A visit to Clarksville weaves a tapestry of experiences that leaves an indelible mark on the heart. Rediscover the serenity of nature on our trails and rivers. Appreciate time with one another around a table of expertly crafted foods and beverages. Reignite inspiration from murals, sculptures and galleries. Reconnect with a place steeped in a fascinating heritage.


Use this guide, our website and the Visit Clarksville TN App to plan a trip that will bring you back to wonder.

Even More in 2024:

- **The Restaurant and Silo Park** at Old Glory Distilling, with menu items featuring on-site made spirits and a massive outdoor seating and entertainment area, will open this spring.
- **Doubletree Hotel** will open downtown this summer with construction of new retail and restaurant complex following soon.
- Construction will begin on a new 112-room **Holiday Inn Express** beside the full-service Holiday Inn near I-24, Exit 4. The property will open in early 2025.
- A **587-space parking garage** is under construction adjacent to the Roxy Regional Theatre downtown and is expected to open by this summer
- **Customs House Museum & Cultural Center** celebrates its 40th Anniversary year.
- A **boutique hotel** with 85 rooms across from F&M Bank Arena will break ground with plans to open near the end of the year or early 2025
- A renovation will begin in 2024 to transform the Roxy Regional Theatre into a 486-seat **performing arts center**.
- **Weakley House Museum**, an addition to Historic Collinsville, will interpret the story of the site's founders and open in April
- **Old Abe's Brew House**, a new tavern with a locally known brewer, plans to open in early 2024.
- **Whataburger** opened two restaurants in Clarksville in late 2023 and another two will follow in 2024.
- **Panda Express** will open downtown on Riverside Dr. this winter.
- **Bahama Buck's** shaved ice is opening a second location in Sango in March.
- **Menchie's Frozen Yogurt** is opening a Clarksville location in Sango this spring.
- **The Red River Pedestrian Bridge** will connect the City's greenways, resulting in 11 miles of interconnected trails. This project is expected to be completed by December.

NEW MEETS OLD:

CLARKSVILLE'S EMERGING DOWNTOWN

DOWNTOWN CLARKSVILLE may not look like a city that has survived multiple devastating events. But, as the proverb says, looks can be deceiving. Fires and floods, even winds from an F4 tornado, threatened to destroy much of what we see standing today. While some structures were demolished following these catastrophic events, others survived. The city's stunning historic architecture, built primarily from the flourishing tobacco trade of the mid-19th Century, boasts ornate details unique to a bygone era.

THE INTERSTATE

In the mid-1970s, I-24 opened, crossing diagonally through Montgomery County. Within 10 years, most all of the once-thriving downtown retail had relocated six miles away near the new exchange. Within 15 years, many local businesses simply couldn't compete with the national chains and franchises that interstate traffic attracts. For years, Clarksville's charming downtown was nearly dormant except for courthouse and local government activity.

AND THEN, 1999

A ravaging early-morning tornado in January 1999 brought policy makers, city planners and investors together like never before. A shared community vision emerged and began to change the trajectory of the city's development. Amenities like underground utilities, greenspaces and landscaping, standards for exterior facades, murals, fountains and public art set a new expectation for doing business downtown. These standards and strategies also became a catalyst for the Clarksville we experience today – and the city that we're becoming.

GROWING AND GROWING UP

In more recent years, some pivotal events changed the city core's walkability and connectivity – making it an even better place to visit, live, do business and invest. Montgomery County developed a full-block urban park. Austin Peay State University purchased vacant parcels between the university and downtown. A public-private partnership announced plans for an arena, and private investment began to pour in.

Today, visitors and residents experience a walkable downtown from the university through downtown to the river. Restaurants, galleries, shops, entertainment, museums, public art and recreation all exist within the now pedestrian-friendly downtown. The same breathtaking historic architecture still stands proudly and is now joined by modern, sleek designs and mixed-use developments. As our city grows, we encourage you to enjoy all the new amenities while taking time to appreciate the culture from where we came.

LUNCH

Legends Smokehouse & Grill serves all the smoked meats plus hand-made sauces in creative entrees. Save room for the daily cobbler special served a la carte, as a shake or a fried taco! For lighter fare, try **Miss Lucille's Café's** freshly made seasonal entrees, which give a nod to local places and people. Enjoy lunch on a balcony with a scenic river view at **Strawberry Alley Ale Works**. Hit "The Pub", **Blackhorse Pub & Brewery**, for burgers, salads, pasta, pizzas and brews. **Wicked Good Sandwiches** features subs, wraps, and fun appetizers like fried avocado bites. **Fanelli's Deli** includes an Italian market and take-out along with filling New-York style subs.

DINNER

Smokin Chikin pairs in-house rotisserie chicken with internationally flavored marinades. Dine along spectacular marina and river views at **Liberty Park Grill** with hearty American portions. Dive into Chicago-style deep-dish pizza at **Camacho's Famous**. Italian dining with house-made pastas and sharable items make **Yada on Franklin** a terrific date-night or small group spot. Bring your appetite to **PBody's** for full-on American dining with satisfying portions. Add a dash of Korean or South American flavors to experience with a meal from **The Mailroom**, housed in Clarksville's historic Post Office and Federal Building. The **Catfish House** serves hand-breaded filets with hand-cut fries and hand-made desserts...along with all the fried-fish fixins. Kick back and enjoy live music with burgers and brews at **Dock 17**.

B's Cheesecakes, serves individually sized cheesecakes with flavors rotating daily.

Madeleine's French Bakery and **Thistle Sweets** specialize in macarons and other tasty treats. **Crumbl Cookies** and **Nothing Bundt Cakes** opened this past year, providing more luscious goodies. Pick up baked goods, sweet breads, and picnic items to-go at **Gingham Cafe**.

OUTDOOR FUN

Adventure runs free in this scenic river city – whether it's on the water, golf courses, bluffs, bikes, or miles of trails. Our relatively mild climate makes many outdoor activities popular and pleasant in all four distinctly beautiful seasons. Opt outside: we're the perfect place to unplug and reconnect with nature, yourself and one another.



WALKING TRAILS

Trek the **Clarksville Greenway's** paved 9-mile trail or the five miles of hiking trails at **Rotary Park** for scenic beauty in every season. Try a guided cave tour at **Dunbar Cave State Park** or explore the four miles of trails on your own. The **Cumberland Riverwalk** and **Upland Trail** are paved with spectacular river scenes and total about six miles.



BIKE TRAILS

Tucked away in a serene, wooded area is the **North Ford Mountain Bike Park**. This park includes trails with jumps and drops that are suitable for all skill levels, along with a designated kids zone. **Rotary Park** includes about five miles of dual-purpose trails shared by both hikers and bikers. Rent **B-Cycles** at major parks throughout the city.



WATERSPORTS

With 650 miles of navigable waterways, fishing, skiing, kayaking and boating opportunities are plentiful. The **Day Dock** at McGregor Park and the **Clarksville Marina** make boat outings easy. The waters of the **Cumberland River** are consistently named among the top catfishing waters in the world. **Clarksville's Blueway** offers five public access points for kayaking and canoeing along the Cumberland and Red Rivers and their tributaries.



ROCK CLIMBING

Scale the bluffs at Middle Tennessee's designated rock-climbing locale, **King's Bluff Park**, with over 160 routes covering 1,673 linear feet of cliff. With a limestone crag of nearly 10 acres, this climb provides spectacular river overlooks.

Cross Creek Clays is a premier shotgun destination located in rural Montgomery County. Two 16-station courses, an 8-station beginner's course and a gorgeous club house make this a shooter's paradise. Opening in 2023, **Pine Ridge Farm** offers clay courses and a hunting preserve for quail, turkey and deer. Both locations offer short-term rentals onsite. The **Montgomery County Shooting Complex** features clays, trap, skeet, archers and more on their 126-acre site.

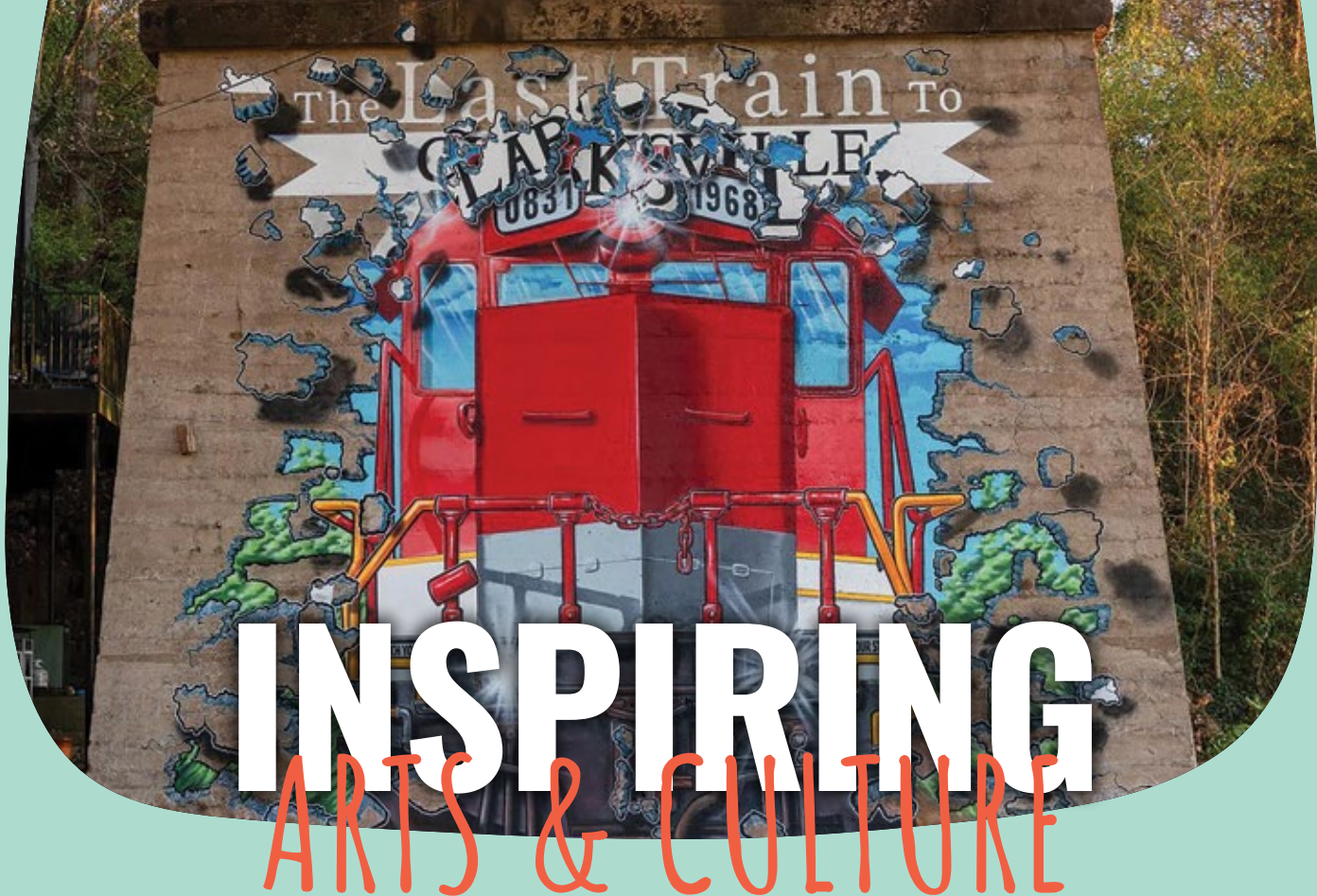

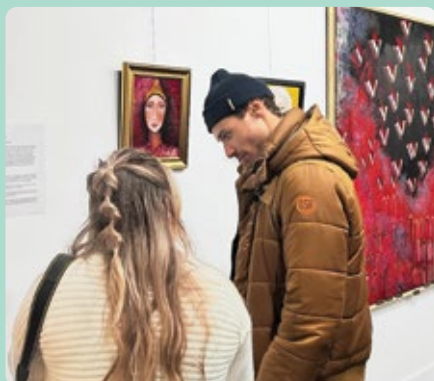

The city's many historic sites tell a fascinating story. Our people and their accomplishments, along with these historic sites, continue to inspire folks around the globe.

1 Embark on a self-guided walking tour of downtown and enjoy historic architecture from the mid-1800s. Keep an eye out for **Clarksville Then & Now Trail** panels that tell the stories of our historic buildings or download the **Architectural Gems Trail** on the Visit Clarksville TN App.

2 **Fort Defiance Civil War Park** is one of the few intact earthen works forts left in the United States.

3 Discover the expansive and unique history of Clarksville's African-American community with the **African-American Legacy Trail**.

4 Wander through "Becoming Clarksville" at the **Customs House Museum & Cultural Center** to see the people, places and events that most impacted local history.

5 **Riverview and Greenwood Cemeteries** are historic sites that hold the remains of many early pioneers, settlers, civic leaders, and statesmen, as well as men and women of all the American wars.

6 **Dunbar Cave State Park** offers a multifaceted cultural experience that highlights the park's rich music, African American and Native American history.

7 **Historic Collinsville Pioneer Settlement & Weakley House Museum** allow visitors to step into the pioneer life with authentic glimpses into the 1800s.

8 **Port Royal State Historic Park** showcases the vibrant history of a 19th-century trading town and is also an important point of reflection on the tragic events of the Trail of Tears.

9 Learn about the history of the Cumberland River and its significance to Clarksville's development through McGregor Park's **As the River Flows Museum**.

10 Legacies of trailblazers like **Pat Head Summitt** and **Wilma Rudolph** continue to impact and inspire lives around the world. See their statues and learn their stories at Liberty Park.

11 Gain a deeper understanding of the people, places, and genres that make Tennessee the 'Soundtrack of America' through the **Tennessee Music Pathways**.

12 Covering the early 1940's to present, the **Don F. Pratt Museum** offers an extensive collection that traces the history of the 101st Airborne Division's Screaming Eagles.

13 Learn about natural history with hands-on activities and live animals native to the area at the **Wade Bourne Nature Center**.

Facing the Downtown Commons is **F&M Bank Arena**, a new sports and concert venue that also boasts a community ice rink. To see what concerts are on the calendar for the 5,500-seat arena, check myfmbankarena.com.

Many evenings you can find live music at **Austin Peay State University**, from individual student performances to huge concerts in the gorgeous Mabry Concert Hall. Find details at apsu.edu/music.

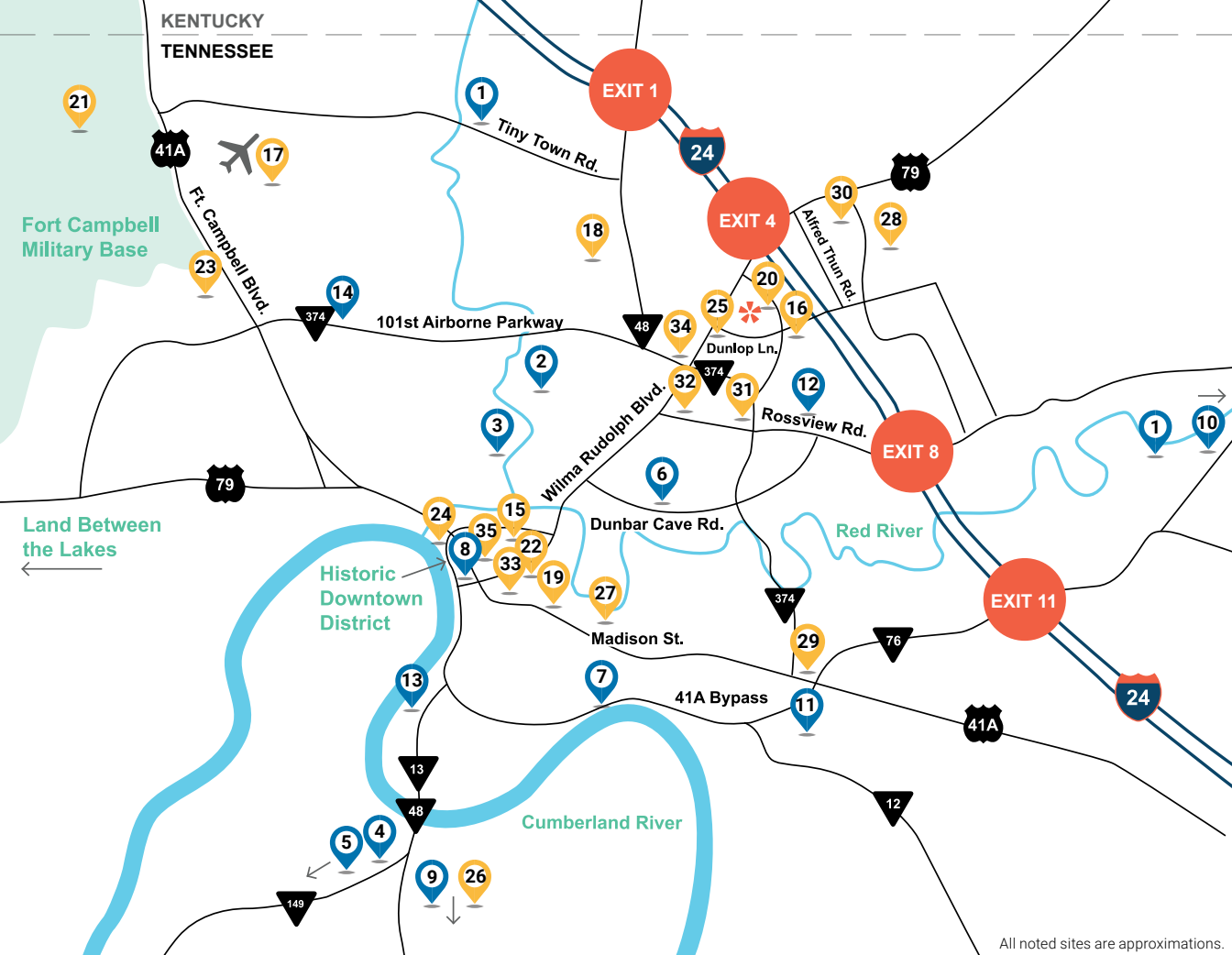
