



The ATL Airport District, comprised of three cities located between Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport and bustling downtown Atlanta, is more than just a pitstop for travelers. With business and meeting space, sporting events, rich culture and history, and extensive cuisine options, the District offers big-city amenities balanced with just the right amount of originality and charm. At the convergence of multiple interstate highways and one of the most traveled airports in the world, visitors can easily access this collection of unique, eclectic towns which include College Park, Hapeville, and Union City.



LOCATION

- The ATL Airport District is 10 miles south of Atlanta via I-75 and I-85

College Park

Home to Georgia's secondlargest convention center and more than 5,000 hotel rooms, College Park is a great place for both business and leisure travelers to make a day trip or spend a weekend immersing themselves in Southern charm.

Hapeville

A small town with big-city amenities, Hapeville is known for its vibrant arts culture, eclectic dining experiences and opportunities for economic development. About seven miles from downtown Atlanta and close to two major interstates, Hapeville features a historic downtown district, sprawling park, shops, restaurants and art displays local to the community, including the city's signature butterflies.

Union City

Union City is a peaceful retreat to a small Southern town that offers a slower pace than nearby bustling downtown Atlanta. This modest, fast-growing city balances cultural, spiritual, educational and economic opportunities for both residents and visitors traveling through the small community. Guests can slow down and enjoy a restful way of life just minutes away from the energy of a big city.





College Park

ATTRACTIONS

- The Atlanta Dream, part of the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA), and the College Park Skyhawks, the official G League basketball team for the Atlanta Hawks, play at the all-new Gateway Center Arena, a multi-purpose sports and entertainment venue with 3,500 seats for sports fans
- Historic College Park Golf Course, a beautiful 9-hole golf course located just minutes from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport and featuring a driving range with upper and lower tee boxes as well as two practice greens for chipping and putting. The course also offers a driving range, a 2,000 square foot teaching center, tee to green cart paths and a state-of-the-art irrigation system
- CycleGANG Fitness Studio, a 45-minute high-energy cycling class where visitors can experience an immersive mind-body experience bringing together one-of-a-kind playlists, rhythm-based choreography and high-intensity cardio
- The Wellness Spot, a luxury spa and fitness studio, featuring an array of fitness classes and exclusive spa services including signature massage and skin therapy
- College Park Murals, a variety of stunning murals created by local artists that were inspired by the residents of the area and this diverse community
- Chick-fil-A Headquarters and Backstage Tour, a walking, guided cultural tour that focuses on S.Truett Cathy, founder of Chick-fil-A. Throughout the tour, visitors can experience the most valued company assets including its hospitable people and unique story

- The South Fulton Tennis Center, featuring 20 hard-surface tennis courts, four clay-surface tennis courts, newly renovated locker rooms, upgraded interior lighting, a new juice bar, upgraded court lighting and more
- Historic College Park Golf Course, a beautiful nine-hole golf course just minutes from Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, offering a driving range, teaching center and practice greens

- College Park's unique downtown eateries are nestled in and among historic streets and buildings, offering an incredible string of thriving Black-owned restaurants that serve up delicious bites, with options such as:

 - The Real Milk & Honey, a delicious brunch spot perfect for reuniting with family and friends around sustainable, Southern meals in a cozy setting
 - Virgil's Gullah Kitchen & Bar serves authentic dishes prepared with pride from recipes passed down by generations of Virgil's own family

Hapeville

ATTRACTIONS

- Delta Flight Museum, an interactive museum with exhibits and artifacts documenting the cutting-edge technology and innovation in the field of aviation since the 1920s
- The Hapeville Depot Museum, maintained by the Hapeville Historical Society, dates back to the 1890s and houses artifacts from the transportation industry free for the public to discover
- Porsche Experience Center Atlanta, where visitors can learn about the performance characteristics of Porsche cars and test their driving capabilities on world-renowned racetracks
- Academy Theatre, a company founded in 1956 with the goal of exploring classic plays and bringing thought-invoking performances to the surrounding community
- Hapeville murals, an initiative of the Hapeville Main Street Board and Hapeville Arts Alliance to revitalize downtown Hapeville with brilliant murals representing the community

RECREATION

- John R. Lewis Memorial Park & Dog Park, a community amenity for people and their pets to relax outside with easy access to the Hapeville Library and Hapeville Elementary School
- Tom E. Morris Sports Complex & Skate Park, offering baseball and softball fields for teams to rent, as well as a newly completed skate park for the community to enjoy
- Jess Lucas Park, Hapeville's most happening greenspace including a gravel walking trail, picnic tables and a playground, with plenty of room to host community events and concerts









FOOD & BEVERAGE

- Hapeville offers an impressive range of culinary styles all packed within a walkable one-mile radius, with options such as:
 - Pit Boss BBQ & Spirits, a pit-style BBQ restaurant serving authentic homestyle meals to both travelers leaving the airport and locals
 - Breweries and wine bars, including the elegant Volare Wine & Bistro, the women-owned and operated Beer Girl Growlers & Bottleshop and Arches Brewing, a brewery serving up craft brews connected to an art gallery displaying pieces from local artists
 - Buttersweet Bakery, a boutique, minority-owned bakery offering a vast menu of sweet treats, as well as baking and decorating classes for those who want to unleash their inner baker
 - Chapman Drug Company, a full-service pharmacy established in 1921 that serves famous handcrafted soda from the legendary Chapman's Soda Fountain

ATTRACTIONS

- Coca-Cola mural, a restored piece that commemorates 110 years of Coca-Cola and symbolizes unity between the community and iconic Coca-Cola brand
- Atlanta Metro Studios, a premier sound stage for content production including 135,000 sq ft of soundstages, 50,000 sq ft of offices and 60,000 sq ft of mill space

RECREATION

- Ronald Bridges Park & Nature Trail, a hidden gem perfect for enjoying the outdoors that features a zip line, nature trail and basketball court
- Highway 29 Ballfields, a complex with more than just softball and baseball fields, offering a life-sized chess set, cornhole boards, ping pong tables and volleyball courts
- Skate Park at Ballfields Recreational Complex, a 4,000 square foot skate park that opened in 2022 featuring a bowl with various depths, a quarterpipe wall, a tiered cantilevered grind ledge, various grind rails and boxes and a unique wedge ramp
- Mayor's Park, offering a walking track, complimentary wireless access and picnic tables for those who want an outdoor lunch

SPIN THE DISTRICT - SPRING & FALL

This annual event offers three unique races in each city of the ATL Airport District every spring & fall. With bike demonstrations, music, food trucks, beer and wine, kids' activities and more, each of these annual community events turn a regular cycling race into a block party.

COFFEE & CHROME - APRIL THROUGH SEPTEMBER

Each second Saturday of each month from April through September, visitors and residents of Hapeville can enjoy the Coffee & Chrome car and motorcycle show. This monthly show for car-enthusiasts features classic and modern cars from 8:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. at Jess Lucas Park.

ARTS & MUSIC FESTIVAL - OCTOBER

This music festival each spring provides the community an opportunity to fall in love with College Park's downtown district, with live concerts, picnics and local artists displaying and selling their crafts. All proceeds go to benefit Main Street Arts and Economic Development Event Efforts.

HAPEVILLE DOWNTOWN LIVE CONCERT SERIES - JULY THROUGH OCTOBER

Each Saturday in October, this community event puts a spotlight on local artisans and performers with live artist demos, concerts, handmade crafts and more. With a different theme each weekend, visitors can take in live music as they sip beer while enjoying a variety of activities and events all month long.

EDUCATIONAL TRAVEL

History buffs are sure to learn something new in the ATL Airport District. The ATL Black History Tour dives into Black history from pre-Civil War to present day, while illuminating Black life and achievement in Atlanta. The Hapeville Depot Museum offers artifacts and exhibitions on planes, trains and automobiles dating back to the 1890s, and the Delta Flight Museum takes visitors on an immersive journey through the history of flight from the 1920s to present day.

GUYS' GETAWAYS
