Proclamation of State of Emergency and Supplemental Order Pertaining to the Wearing of Face Coverings in Public to Decrease Community Spread of COVID-19

Section 1. Proclamation of State of Emergency

A State of Emergency is proclaimed for the entire City of Columbus to protect the lives and welldangerous effects of COVID-19 being of the citizens of the City as well as those who work, attend school, and visit the City, from the

Section 2. Face Covering Requirements

- 1. <u>Definitions</u>: For the purposes of this executive order:
- "Face covering" means a covering of the nose and mouth that is secured to the head with providers in the care of patients. shirts, sweatshirts, or towels. These Face Coverings are not intended for use by healthcare linen. Ideally, a Face Covering has two (2) or more layers. A Face Covering may be factory-Covering can be made of a variety of synthetic and natural fabrics, including cotton, silk, or ties, straps, or loops over the ears or is simply wrapped around the lower face. A Face made, sewn by hand, or can be improvised from household items such as scarfs, bandanas, $\overrightarrow{}$
