LEGEND | OF THE

GATHERS

You may have heard how one night in 1879, inventor Thomas Edison transformed an entire street into a spectacle of light. You may have even heard that Edison received a second patent for his incandescent lamps in 1880 after he changed the filament, allowing his lamps to burn much, much longer.

But have you heard the story of what happened next? How Edison sent someone to a small town in upstate New York for help making his vision of spreading light into every home a reality? How it was a mysterious young boy and not a master glassblower who created the glass bubble that would change the course of history for the town of Corning and for the world?

The Legend of the Gathers: Protectors of the Light is a fictional story inspired by real events, specifically the role Corning Flint Glass Works played in creating the special glass envelopes for Thomas Edison's incandescent lamps. It's

also a supernatural tale about The Gathers, phantom folk who, according to legend, return each October in search of something. Or perhaps simply to make sure the light has found its way into the world.

America's Crystal City



When a small glass company from Brooklyn moved to Corning in 1868, the original plan to get glass into every household was to make special colored glass blinds.


You've probably never heard of them. That's because they never really caught on.

Fortunately, that company has long had the ability to create spectacular glass which is why, at one time, there were as many as 20 glass cutting shops transforming this former lumber town into "America's Crystal City."

While stunning cut glass by John Hoare and T.G. Hawkes gained worldwide renown, it was Corning Flint Glass Works' role in making the special heat-resistant glass containers for Thomas Edison's incandescent lamps—and later innovations including Pyrex® and CorningWare®, space shuttle windows, and other technological breakthroughs like fiber optics and Gorilla® Glass—that have allowed the factory and the town to thrive.

With glass studios, art galleries, antique shops, unique boutiques, restaurants gaining a reputation for their culinary offerings, and exciting annual events, the Crystal City's charm resonates with visitors from around the world.





Cradle of Aviation

This might come as a surprise, but in tiny, unassuming Hammondsport—which feels almost tucked out of the way at the southern tip of Keuka Lake—you’ll find a marker declaring Pleasant Valley the “Cradle of Aviation.”

When Glenn Curtiss set the land-speed record on a motorcycle in 1907 becoming the “Fastest Man on Earth,” he had no intention of taking his love for speed to the skies. But Curtiss had the power

aeronautical pioneers needed—his engines—which is why several airplane and balloon companies set up shop in Hammondsport. At the time, it seemed as if everyone was seeking out Curtiss, including Alexander Graham Bell who, along with the small-town hero who never even made it past the eighth grade, started the Aerial Experiment Association, a group of scientists, tinkerers, and innovators focused on getting man into the air. The rest, as they say, is history!



Craft Your Adventure Beverage Trail



There is something special brewing in upstate New York! Boasting over 30 craft beverage producers—including breweries named “Best in New York State,” the most awarded farm cidery in the United States in 2017, a small-batch distiller that won double-gold at the 50 Best World Gin Competition, and others—the Craft Your Adventure Trail isn’t just bursting. It’s also steadily establishing New York’s

Wine Region as a craft beverage destination.

While paying homage to tradition, the tastemakers on the **Craft Your Adventure Trail** are constantly finding new twists on classic styles. Wine Connoisseurs

This trip was all about surprising our palates and exploring unusual wines found here. A few of them were tough to say even before we tasted. Like **Dr. Frank's** Rkatsetelli, a unique dry white that might just be my new go-to wine. Fun to say and sooo tasty. And the deep purple-red Saperavi. Yum!



Some of the young winemakers are nailing the region's flagship Rieslings, but they're also being bold. Making wines even more labor intensive. That means an even bigger payoff. Boy, do **Weis Vineyards'** port and ice wine pay off! And right next door is **Domaine LeSeurre**. Don't be misled by the sweetness of the owners. The wines here are dry and fabulous. It's not their vintages so much, but their techniques that are unusual, as they transform

the complex characteristics of the Finger Lakes soil (terroir) into bottled gems.

Château Renaissance

Tucked in the valley a few minutes from Keuka Lake, we discovered **Château Renaissance**. We may have stopped for the fruit wines, but how many places make a rose petal wine, lavender wine, or violet wine? They're not made each year, which makes them even more of a find. What a pleasant surprise!

Speaking of away from the lake, **Wild Brute** is half-an-hour from the wine trail, but don't let that fool you. Rustic? Totally! But the unfiltered, wild-fermented vintages are unlike most wines you'll find in the region. We sat outside and shared a bottle (or two).



Learned about all the steamboats that used to transport locals (and grapes) from Hammondsport to Penn Yan, and travelers to lakeside resorts. Even coal and troops during the Civil War. The handcrafted wooden trout boats on display are works of art.

Finger Lakes Boating Museum

Ever hear of Glenn Curtiss? Fastest man on earth? Motorcycle pioneer? Aviation innovator? The guy who developed seaplanes and invented the flying boat on a lake in tiny Hammondsport? Now you see why we had to visit the **Curtiss Museum**.

Vintage planes, motorcycles, cars. So much eye candy. And what a story!



Spent the night at the **Park Inn**, oldest building on the Village Square. Newly renovated rooms. Talk about charm. Turned out to be a great spot for dinner, too.

Next day started with a short drive to Corning. **Heritage Village of the Southern Finger Lakes** is this wonderful collection of historic buildings, like the Benjamin Patterson Inn, a one-room log cabin, and a one-room schoolhouse.

Still had plenty of time to explore **The Rockwell Museum**—housed in the old City Hall, this museum blends art and American history—and **Corning's Gaffer District**, which is full of wonderful historic buildings and varied architectural styles.

Sometimes it's the unexpected discovery that stands out most. Like how we've travelled to the Finger Lakes for years exploring waterfalls yet only just found **Stony Brook State Park**. The three main

falls were stunning. And

what a refreshing dip in the stream-fed swimming hole. Not far away, we stopped for some fly fishing on the **Cohocton River**. Talk about relaxing.



Spent the night at **Amber Waves Farm B&B**. Gotta love wide open spaces. Sitting outside on the massive porch with a glass of FLX vino was the perfect end to the day.

Day two started with a morning hike through the forest. The **Mitchellsville Gorge Trail** ambles its way downhill (we had two vehicles and

left one at the bottom) about two-and-a-half miles with a deep gorge to the left, and ends in a beautiful vineyard which seems only fitting. After the excursion, we were a little parched (excuse not needed) so we stopped by **The Brewery of Broken Dreams**, which is just a couple miles from the trailhead. Recon pays!

That afternoon, we rented a pontoon boat and headed out on the open water. Almost felt like we had **Keuka Lake** to ourselves. Did a little swimming off the boat (which even had a slide for some slip-sliding fun). Docked at **The Switzerland Inn** for lunch. *Yum!*

After we dropped off the boat at Depot Park we visited **Cider Creek's** tasting bar on the Village Square.



We're so hooked on this place, we made sure to fit in a little paddleboard adventure the next morning before hitting the road. Scenic, accessible, and affordable. *What's not to love?*



Agritourism



Each year, we stay somewhere that offers an authentic taste of farm life. In the past it's been **Button's Creekside** and **Amber Waves**. This year, **Taylor Farm Bed and Breakfast**. A 300-acre farm. Talk about a great setting. Walking trails, wildlife, even a couple ponds for fishing. And that breakfast—eggs, bacon, sausage, blueberry pancakes, homemade grape juice—mmm! So good!

Took a short drive to **Healing Spirits**. They make and sell a variety of wellness products, like essential oils and tinctures. Even have workshops identifying edible and medicinal plants. Making teas. Just missed one called "Everything Mushrooms" where you learn how to make mushroom teas, soups, tinctures, and candies.

Down the road was **Savor Vineyards**. Big, beautiful barn-like tasting room and unexpected wine styles. Ever heard of a dry Catawba? It's not just different, but

good! The Merechal Foch had delicious black cherry notes. Can you say, Pear Wine?! Right next door is **Wild Brute**. Won a NYS Agricultural "Next Generation Farmer Award" for its artisanal wines. Doesn't get much more country than this.

We discovered **Stewart's Family Farm Creamery** by accident. Delicious goat cheese. Sourdough bread. The creamy maple ice cream never had a chance. Gone before we got back to the car.

Of course, not all farm-friendly experiences are away from town. Take **Four Fights** for example. The measure of good moonshine and the name of a cool little farm distillery in Corning. Vodka put them on the map with good reason. But the Bowers

Bourbon is the real deal. A flavorful FLX take on a Kentucky classic.




