

DESTINATION ITINERARY

Cohocton Fall Foliage Drive

Take a drive on gently curved roads tucked away in the rolling hills through small villages and along the scenic highway as you make your way from Corning, NY to Hornell, NY.

Start out in Corning, NY

From **The Corning Museum of Glass**, take left onto Route 415 North. Once outside the Village of Painted Post, this is a gently curving road, with rolling hills that parallels Interstate I-86. This route will take you through the villages of Campbell, Savona, and Bath.

In Bath, get on the highway (it doesn't sound scenic), but this hills and vistas that open up in front of you along I-86 West and then I-390 North are spectacular!

Take Exit 2 in Cohocton to North Cohocton and visit the **Olde Country Store and More** at 2 University Avenue North Cohocton, NY for unique gifts, home décor, and old-fashioned candy.

In Cohocton, head south on Cohocton-Loon Lake Rd Route 121, where you will skirt the eastern edge of **Loon Lake**, a favorite local fishing and camping spot. Turn left onto Route 21 South for 15 miles, through idyllic countryside, the hamlet of Haskinsville, and past the Hornell City Reservoirs.

As you enter North Hornell, you have options – turn left onto Route 36 North to visit **Jenkins Farm Market** at 8637 Route 36 North in Arkport, NY for local produce, Amish baked goods, and a full service deli counter and the nearby **Wild Brute Winery** at 8629 Oak Hill Road in Arkport, NY. Known for their small batch, unfiltered fine wines, Wild Brute is a can't miss stop if you are in town. Continue north on Route 36 to visit **Stony Brook State Park** for scenic fall foliage hikes, or, temperature permitting, swimming in their modified gorge pool.

If you choose to turn right you will find yourself entering downtown Hornell. There, in addition to several restaurants and shopping along **Main Street** and the **Broadway Mall**, you can visit the **Erie Depot Museum** at 111 Loder St in Hornell, NY to learn all about the railroad heritage of the area which it was founded on.

After your day of driving among the breathtaking scenery and stopping at a few great locally owned businesses along the way, sit back and relax at **Railhead Brewing Company** at 40 Park Drive in Hornell, NY. This micro brewpub specializing in brick oven pizza to pair with their brews and is the perfect end to a daylong fall foliage drive.
